Jim Furlong is set to receive rather more than the 6,500gns he paid for Sumoto (GB) (Mtoto {GB}), Lot 1600, who is the dam of G1 Eclipse S. winner Compton Admiral (GB) (Suave Dancer). Two of Sadler's Wells' 196 2000 mates are for sale, namely Lot 1501, Asnieres (Spend a Buck), a winning half sister to the GI Breeders' Cup Classic winner Arcangues (Sagace {Fr}), and Lot 2054, Slip Sliding (Thunder Gulch), a maiden half sister to dual Grade I winner Dehere (Deputy Minister). Poppadam (GB) (Salse) is an uncovered winning three-year-old whose seven winning half siblings include the G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas heroine Classic Park (GB) (Robellino). Lot 2006, consigned by Gerald Leigh, is Brocatelle (GB) (Green Desert), a half sister to Barathea (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). There are several attractive French drafts, including one from the Wertheimer brothers that includes Lot 2085, the now 16-year-old Mona Stella (Nureyev), carrying a full sibling to the G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud winner Special Quest (Fr) (Rainbow Quest). ANTLEY VICTIM OF APPARENT HOMICIDE

Two-time Kentucky Derby-winning jockey Chris Antley was found dead Saturday night in his Pasadena, California, home. He was 34 years old. "There seems to have been some struggle at the house. They seem to think it was a homicide," former agent Ron Anderson told the Associated Press. One of the top riders on the New York and New Jersey circuits in the middle 1980s, Antley was plaqued throughout his career with personal problems, beginning in 1988, when he entered a program to combat a drug problem. He returned to the racetrack shortly upon completion of his treatment and began a streak of 64 consecutive days in 1999 with at least one winning mount. After reentering a drug abuse program in 1989, he rode 206 winners the following season and added his first Kentucky Derby when guiding Strike the Gold to victory in 1991. During the 1997 season. Antley left the saddle again citing weight problems, but following a rigorous training regimen, returned to competitive riding in 1999. The native of Fort Lauderdale, Florida, picked up the Kentucky Derby mount on a former claiming horse called Charismatic for trainer D. Wayne Lukas and won the first two legs of the Triple Crown with the chestnut, who suffered career-ending injuries in the Belmont S. Antley is widely credited with sparing Charismatic further damage, when he guickly dismounted following the finish and cradled the colt's leg, effectively immobilizing the horse. "The thing that stands out about him was him saving that horse," commented Anderson. "The vets said that if he hadn't held that horse's leg up when he did, it probably would have been irreparable." Added Bob Lewis, owner with his wife Beverly of Charismatic, "We're devastated, just overwhelmed with sorrow. We have such great respect and admiration for Chris. He's shown such strength in the past and has been a great tribute to Thoroughbred racing." Lukas recalled Antley as a "very likeable person," and added, "He sold himself well and you couldn't help but like him. This young man was a very, very talented rider." Antley and his wife Natalie were married earlier this year and were expecting a child. The jockey had been away from the races since March of this year and finished his riding career with 3,480 victories and purses of over \$92 million.

Four of Sky Jack's previous five victories came against state-bred foes. He most recently captured the Oct. 28 California Cup Classic H. by 4 1/2 lengths. Favored against seven others in his graded stakes debut, Sky Jack stepped out to set the early pace. The Cal-bred gelding opened up a clear advantage on the backstretch and pulled further clear on the turn for home. He turned back the challenge of Lethal Instrument at the eighth pole and pulled clear to the wire while drifting out. "He ran a wild race, this horse," said jockey Laffit Pincay after the winning ride. "He is really a good horse, I think. I knew the Cal Cup wasn't a fluke. I mean, this horse is all over the place. He's running in, he's going out, but he can run. Yes, this could be a horse to get excited about. I hate to say that, but I'm just keeping my fingers crossed. He's sound. He's a little cuckoo, but he's sound and he will improve, I think." Trainer Doug O'Neill, winning the second Hollywood Park stakes of his career, added, "Lethal Instrument, when he ranged up to him about the eighth pole, I said, 'Oh man, well at least we're going to run second, that's okay.' But Laffit had another gear left." Pincay was riding his third Native Diver winner and the victory was his third of the day.



December 7, 1957... A two-year-old colt named Silky Sullivan won the one-mile Golden Gate Futurity after making up 27 lengths, establishing a running style that became legendary. Horsemen still invoke the name of Silky Sullivan when referring to a horse that runs from far off the pace.

December 8, 1989...Power to Geaux paid a record \$2,922 for a \$2 wager made at Aksarben on the simulcast of the 11th race from the Fair Grounds. The previous record for a payoff on a \$2 bet was set June 17, 1912 when Wishing Ring paid \$1,885.50.

December 8, 1983...The longest shot in the field, 42-1 Fortunate Prospect, took the seventh running of the Morven Stakes at The Meadowlands.

December 10, 1977...In his second year of riding, Steve Cauthen became the first jockey to win \$6 million in a single season when he rode the three-year-old filly Little Happiness to victory in the sixth race at Aqueduct.

December 11, 1983...John Henry became the first racehorse to surpass \$4 million in career earnings when he won the Hollywood Turf Cup.

December 13, 1986...Jockey Kent Desormeaux picked up his first stakes win, riding Godbey to victory in the Maryland City H. at Laurel.

December 15, 1973...Sandy Hawley became the first jockey in history to win 500 races in a single year when he rode Charlie Jr. to victory in the third race at Laurel Racecourse.

WORLD SERIES GOES TO FRENCH CHAMP

Jockey Olivier Peslier captured the champion's title in the World Super Jockeys Series, taking two of the four races at Hanshin Racecourse in Japan this past weekend. Peslier, representing Europe, rode Contact (Jpn) to a narrow victory over Jerry Bailey's mount Croupier Star (Jpn) in the Golden Spur Trophy Dec. 2. The Frenchman went on to win the Golden Saddle Trophy aboard Narita Daido (Jpn) yesterday, earning a total of 53 points to seize the championship for a second time since winning it in 1998. "I'm really happy," Peslier said. "It gives me double pleasure as a representative from France and also as a jockey backed by the Japanese fans." Japan's Yutaka Take scored 40 points to take second best and Robert Fradd from Hong Kong rounded out the top three with 38 points. Fourteen jockeys competed in the series representing Europe, North America, Oceania, Asia and Japan.

"It's been a great success," said The National Stud's Chief Executive Mile Littlewort, "and it has come at the end of a good week for the Stud. We sold two foals for GSA Bloodstock at the Tattersalls Foal Sale for 82,000gns and 75,000gns, and the first foal sold by The National Stud Owner-Breeders Club, a colt by Zieten (USA), went for 23,000 gns."

FRENCH SEASON IN REVIEW

There's no doubt that the 2000 French racing season, the last one of the Millennium, will be one to remember. Seeing a horse like Sinndar (Ire) (Grand Lodge {USA}) win the G2 Prix Niel and G1 Prix de I'Arc de Triomphe three weeks apart was a great moment for the sport fans. The Aga Khan homebred is one of the best of his age in Europe over middle distances and French-trained three-year-old colts have been a rather moderate vintage in that category. Runaway winner of the Emirates Prix du Jockey Club (French Derby) in June, the English-trained Holding Court (GB) (Hernando {Fr}) has disappointed since, but none of the French who ran against him that day have been capable of shining at the highest level either.

It is a rather different story with French-trained middle distance three-year-old fillies who have proved to be among the finest in Europe. Only Petrushka (Ire) (Unfuwain {USA}) can be compared to fillies like French Oaks winner Egyptband (USA) (Dixieland Band {USA}), Prix Vermeille victress Volvoreta (GB) (Suave Dancer {USA}) or Rêve d'Oscar (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}). It is satisfying to hear that Egyptband and Petrushka have stayed in training for the upcoming season, while Rêve d'Oscar had another important appointment in the Nov. 26 G1 Japan Cup, where she finished seventh behind T.M. Opera O (Jpn).

Three-year-old milers trained in France, colts or fillies, have also been a bit quiet. In a close finish Bluemamba (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}) proved the best on the day to win the G1 Dubaï Poule d'Essai des Pouliches (French 1000 Guineas) and the Englishtrained Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}) took the colts equivalent on the same day.

Where the French had a lot of reasons to be proud is this season's older horses. Champion Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells {USA}) took the G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup and G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. and though he was slightly below par towards the end of the season, he retires to stud with a beautiful record of 11-2-0 from 16 starts, which speaks for itself. The John Hammond-trained Nuclear Debate (USA) (Geiger Counter {USA}) comes from the same yard as Montjeu and he has also been a great ambassador of French racing. He took the G2 King Stand S. and G1 Nunthorpe at York, but with regret, he could not run in the G1 Abbaye de Longchamp on Arc day, a race closed to geldings. Dansili (GB) (Danehill {USA}), trained by André Fabre, has also been very consistent in three ventures outside France. Second to Kalanisi (Ire) in the G2 Queen Ann S. and second again in the G1 Sussex S. to Giant's Causeway (USA), he was a fast finishing and very unlucky third in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile. Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo {USA}), although winning only the G1 Prix d'Ispahan this season, was another favorite among French fans.

Two-year-olds trained in France returned to the spotlight, having finally made it back to the top after a poor 1999 season, where only the filly Lady Of Chad (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}) was able to take the G1 Marcel Boussac. Amonita (GB) (Anabaa {USA}) took that same Group 1 event in great style this season and her owner Mrs. Paul de Moussac was brave to turn down huge offers for her. Even though the top two-year-old races were dominated by foreign-trained horses early in the season, with Bad As I Wanna Be (Ire) (Common Grounds (GB)) taking the G1 Morny and Tobougg (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) capturing the G1 Salamandre, the Criquette Head-trained Okawango (USA) (Kingmambo {USA}) stamped himself as a colt of great potential. He remained undefeated in three starts after taking the G1 Grand Criterium on Oct. 8. Also showing great promise, Sagacity (Fr) (Highest Honor {Fr}) made it two in a row in the 2000m G1 Criterium de Saint-Cloud on Oct. 29.

Horses weren't the only highlighted aspect of the French season. André Fabre again cruised to the title among French trainers, taking his 13th consecutive championship, a record that is not about to be broken.

Jockey Olivier Peslier, although closing his season in France in early November to go to Japan, has secured a fourth riding title, but still has a lot to do to equal the legendary Yves Saint-Martin who clinched 15 titles. Considering Peslier's young age, nothing is impossible if he retains his taste for success in the years to come.

The most successful apprentice jockey in France this year was young Christophe Patrice Lemaire with about 50 wins to his credit. His story is interesting. The son of a former top French Jump jockey, he started as a gentleman rider before entering Fabre's stable last season. At that time, as he had not been an apprentice, he was not riding with the benefit of any allowance, but France Galop, the French racing association, changed the rules. Claiming regular apprentice's allowances this year, he was much sought after and had his best season ever.

For the second year running the Stable of Wertheimer et Frère has secured the owner's title and Jean-Luc Lagardère is again the top breeder in the country.


