NIARCHOS' BUSY AT TATTERSALLS

The Niarchos family's Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard provided the three top lots at the opening breeding stock session of the Tattersalls December Sales yesterday. Heading proceedings was the maiden three-year-old Peneia (Nureyev), a daughter of Piquetnol, the 1994 Prix Marcel Boussac runner-up, who is a full sister to G1 Coronation and Moyglare Stud S. winner Chimes Of Freedom and a half sibling to the dam of Spinning World, Johnny McKeever, Anthony Stroud and Patricia Boutin were among her fanciers, but none could match Rory Matthews, manager of Barbara Facchino's Barouche Stud in Co. Kildare, who signalled the winning bid of 370,000gns. "We have a 20-strong broodmare band and we're trying to up the quality," said Matthews. "We have been buying in America and have a couple more on the list here. Our policy is to sell the colts and keep the fillies, who are trained by John Oxx and Noel Meade." A date with Giant's Causeway at Coolmore awaits Peneia. The following lot, the well-bred Wind Silence (A.P. Indy), a winner at Deauville last year for Pascal Bary, was bought by Anthony Stroud for 300,000gns. "She is for a new client with American connections who is just getting into breeding. I am not sure what the plans are," said Stroud. Another American buyer was Bill Farish of Lane's End who paid 165,000gns for dual Listed winner Dolydille (Ire) (Dolphin Street {Fr}), who will be kept at Watership Down Stud in Britain. "I have bought here before, but this is the first one from Tattersalls that I am keeping in Britain," said Farish. "She will be going to Watership Down Stud and we will then decide who will cover her. I was pleased to get her as a Listed winner from a good family." Bidding resumes this morning at 9:30 a.m.

TIMBER COUNTRY TO DUBAI

Timber Country (Woodman--Fall Aspen, by Pretense) has been leased by Japan's Shadai Stallion Station to Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum and will stand the 2001 breeding season in Dubai. The eightyear-old stallion, who was purchased as a three-yearold to stand in Japan, is kin to eight stakes winners including Colorado Dancer, the dam of Dubai World Cup winner Dubai Millennium. The two-year-old champion of 1994, with victories in the GI Champagne and GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, he returned in his sophomore season to run third in the Kentucky Derby before registering a 1/2-length victory in the Preakness in what would be his final start. From his first two crops to race, the chestnut is the sire of 30 Japanese winners from 91 starters, including three stakes-placed performers, with progeny earnings of \$5,252,306.

There's a proverb that a man is known by the company he keeps, and the same should apply to racehorses. I suspect, though, that Bienamado, recent winner of the GI Hollywood Turf Cup, was never given full credit for his efforts against some of the best horses in Europe. At the end of last year his official rating stood at 118, 17 pounds below the top-ranked Montjeu, even though Bienamado had failed by only a head to hold off Montjeu at level weights in the G2 Prix Niel. The son of Bien Bien had also finished a fine second in the G2 Great Voltigeur S., beaten little more than a length by Fantastic Light, who has performed very well this year at the top level in Dubai, England, the U.S. and Japan.

Fortunately, Bienamado has not had to settle for second since his return to his native USA, and his Hollywood victory was his third decisive win from four starts. He appears to be developing into a worthy successor to his sire Bien Bien, an outstanding turf performer now based at Chris Budget's Kirtlington Stud in England, following five years at Mill Ridge Farm in Kentucky.

Those five years provided ample evidence of American breeders' reluctance to use a turf horse who stayed well enough to record GI victories over 1½ miles and 1¾ miles. By my reckoning, Bien Bien covered a total of 155 mares in those five seasons. Surely an average of 31 mares isn't just reward for a horse of his achievements? He retired with earnings of over \$2.3 million, thanks to a record which featured four Grade I victories, another four at Grade II level, and six seconds in Grade Is, including the Hollywood Derby and Breeders' Cup Turf. He established his versatility by taking the GII Swaps S. on the main track and was quick enough to win a Grade II over 1 1/8 miles, as well as setting a track record over 1½ miles.

I suppose we shouldn't be too surprised that Bien Bien struggled for popularity, because his sire Manila ended up being exported to Turkey. Manila also carried the stigma of being a turf performer at around 1½ miles, but turf performers don't come much better than this son of Lyphard. The company he kept in the 1986 Breeders' Cup Turf included Theatrical, Estrapade, Dancing Brave and Dahar, and his victory over them improved his record for the year to eight wins and two seconds from ten starts. The following year saw Manila win four out of five starts. Although Manila wasn't considered a success as a stallion in the U.S., he had a more than respectable record in Europe.

The history of Bienamado's dam Nakterjal shows just how much breeders are prepared to forgive if a filly's bloodlines are right. Although she never finished closer than seventh in any of her eight starts, and twice finished tailed off, Nakterjal was sold for no less than 210,000gns at the end of her three-year-old season in 1983. Why was she so much in demand? The answer is that Nakterjal's dam Kilavea was a daughter of Special, who already ranked as the dam of Nureyev and the second dam of Sadler's Wells (at that stage an unbeaten juvenile). Special also produced those good mares Number and Bound.

This family, of course, is even more fashionable nowadays and is a recognised source of stallions. But will that be enough to persuade breeders to give Bienamado the opportunities he deserves when he eventually retires?

WHAT'S IN A NAME?

Names in pedigrees, that is. We're just past the half-way mark of the major European mixed sales, meaning Goffs, Tattersalls, and Deauville offer the best foals, mares, and fillies in and out of training available at public auction in Europe. These four weeks of European sales follow two weeks in Kentucky, and, really, there is one overwhelming impression I have to report: they are making a lot of money for their pedigrees.

The average for foals at Goffs was up 25 percent over last year. The Tattersalls' foal average last week was up 29 percent. Looks like foal averages are up 'in the twenties', yes? Wrong. Probably more.

Here's a really important point that is maybe more relevant now than it ever has been. Whereas the pedigrees in the yearling sales are roughly comparable from year to year--there were more than 6,500 yearlings sold in eleven major North American yearling sales this year, for instance--the pedigrees available in the mixed sales from year to year can be very different. With the yearling sales--at least up until now--we are comparing like to like; with the mixed sales, that's not necessarily the case. If the pedigrees available are (by some imaginary measurement) 15 percent worse, and the prices are up 25 percent, the market for like-for-like would therefore be up 40 percent. Price comparisons at mixed sales therefore cannot be as good a measurement of 'the market' as yearling sales. Having said that, it only means there may be some sort of adjustment necessary to the 25-percent + price rise in the European foal market the last two weeks.

OK, now walk with me, because I'm about to pose two questions, the answers to which may dictate radical revisions in our perception of the Thoroughbred auction market. Question one: what if the pedigrees don't matter so much anymore? Here's the premise: there's a lot of money around now, the result of eight years of economic growth, at least partially attributable to the dotcom revolution. People are here to spend the money--they have it (at least on paper), it's available, they're spending it on available pedigrees, whether they

fit our accepted definition of 'good' pedigrees or not. A lot of this new money doesn't know Rough Shod from Pocahontas, who either of them were, or why it matters. They know Desert Prince is the hot young commercial sire, and they want one. End of story.

Question two: what is a good pedigree these days? Sure, everybody knows, and maybe you can still buy them at the yearling sales, but there sure haven't been many of them available in the mixed sales, in Kentucky or in Europe. Am I right? The really, really good pedigrees, they're just not on the market right now.

Complication: the dispersal of top American families during the 'Eighties as first the Maktoums and then Japanese buyers took many top pedigrees out of 'first-world' commercial circulation. This, combined with the decline of owner-breeders in America, which also resulted in the dispersal of top families and broodmare bands. And the rise of 'traders' rather than breeders. So what percentage of breeders were then holding on to mares and families for the minimum 10-12 years necessary to develop them? And the string of top American racehorses with little or no 'pedigree', or 'family', as we have come to define it.

Sure, if a mare comes from a recognizable top class family, she'll bring All The Money. But, certainly this year, value has to be tied to Big Black Type, basically, Group race form. There is money available, it's there to be spent, so the market for what's available really is up 25 percent, and if the pedigrees are down 15 percent, well, that's just of historical interest.

I am posing questions here to which I do not yet claim to know the answer, or even have an idea of what the answer will look like. It's not that I doubt for a second the value of 'real' families--the few that remain, they really are worth their weight in gold. But the pedigrees most people are trading, and trading for a fair bit of money--it is different, I feel sure of that. Maybe it is Chaos theory: Anarchy Rules, or is about to Rule. Outside of a handful of mainly European breeders (almost all of whom breed as much if not more to stallions standing in America), where are new great families being created? Who are the new Blue Hens? Are there any? If so, how do we recognize them? If not, what will evolve?
