IMPERIAL BEAUTY RULES AT TATTERSALLS

A 10-year-old broodmare and a potential top-class sprinter lit up the Tattersalls December Sales yesterday morning with each bringing just short of one million guineas. **Imperial Beauty** (Imperial Ballet), a four-year-old who has finished second in two Group 1 events for Peter Makin, was offered following the death of her owner Dr. Carlos Stelling. John Hammond will take her over after she was bought for 950,000gns by BBA (Ireland) agent Patrick Cooper on behalf of John Magnier and Michael Tabor. Underbidder was Andrew Mead, seated with Japanese clients, while others interested included James Delahooke and Godolphin's agent John Ferguson. "She's a Group 1 winner in everything but name," said Cooper. "We knew she wouldn't be cheap and her new owners will definitely be breeding from her and she comes from a good old Calumet family." Hammond added, "She is a very high-class sprinter and I'm delighted to be getting her. There's a possibility she might run in the Dubai Sprint next March but we'll see how she is." Half an hour into proceedings **Sumoto (GB)** (Mtoto {GB}), dam of G1 Eclipse S. winner **Compton Admiral (GB)** (Suave Dancer) and in foal to Inchinor (GB), was sold for 920,000gns to Charlie Gordon-Watson who outbid Cormac McCormack. Gordon-Watson was acting for Lord and Lady Lloyd-Webber's Watership Down Stud. The sale was a great success for vendor, BHB director Jim Furlong, who bought the mare three years ago for 6,500gns. Simon Marsh, Watership Down's manager, said, "She is relatively young, the dam of a champion and fits the bill. Compared to the prices at Keeneland, I don't think she was too expensive. We will sort out a mating plan over the next few days." Furlong added, "It's a bittersweet moment. Because I really believe Sumoto can produce a classic winner but I couldn't afford to send her to stallions costing £100,000. She comes from a wonderful Oppenheimer family and will now go to the stallions she deserves." Also heading to Watership Down is **Lady Elgar** (Sadler's Wells), offered by agent John Troy with a Danehill cover. She was bought for Northern Ireland owner Tom Wilson, who boards his mares at Watership Down. *Tattersalls Stats p. 2*

WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

A hard-charging third in Genuine Risk's GI Kentucky Derby, Jaklin Klugman also took that year's GIII California Derby, GII Jerome H. and GII Hawthorne Derby. After two starts as a four-year-old in the spring of 1981, Jaklin Klugman retired to stud in California. There he sired 15 crops for a total of 230 winners. To date, eight of those earned stakes wins, and one, the GIII Junior Miss S. winner Best Dress, achieved graded stakes status. Until this weekend, however, there was never a suggestion that Jaklin Klugman had sired anything approaching his own ability.

That all changed on Sunday with the victory of Sky Jack in the GIII Native Diver H. A winner of five of his eight starts this year, Sky Jack had been beating up on Cal-bred foes, taking the California Cup Classic by 4 1/2 lengths on his most recent outing. In the Native Diver he was even more impressive, leading throughout to score by seven lengths, despite still showing signs of inexperience. Now a winner of six of 10 starts, Sky Jack looks to have further improvement in him, and could become a horse to reckon with in major West Coast events in the coming season.

Jaklin Klugman was owned by TV star Jack Klugman, and another well-known Californian, George Pope, Jr. developed Sky Jack's female line. His fifth dam, Fallen Leaf, is a sister to Penumbra who captured the Santa Susana S., and subsequently became granddam of Pope's English 1000 Guineas and Oaks winner, Mysterious and of J. O. Tobin. Their dam, Hill Shade, also raced in England and was just about the best three-year-old filly in that country in 1968. Hill Shade was by the Pope stallion, Hillary, and was Hill Whisper, the fourth dam of Sky Jack. Since both Hill Shade and Hill Whisper were by Hillary and were out of full sisters, they shared an identical gene pool. This didn't result in any great ability on the part of Hill Whisper, who succeeded only in breaking her maiden. At stud, however,

Hill Whisper did breed four winners from four starters, including Madera Sun, hero of the GII Will Rogers H. and Mischievously, dam of the GI Fantasy S. winner Rascal Lass and third dam of Sky Jack.

In terms of his six-cross pedigree, Sky Jack is rather unusual. Apart from three distant crosses of Polynesian, the pedigree is dominated almost completely by Nasrullah, his three-quarters brother Royal Charger, and by Mahmoud, a three-quarters brother to Mumtaz Begum, the dam of Nasrullah and granddam of Royal Charger.

Jaklin Klugman has Nasrullah in the third generation, Mahmoud in the fourth and Royal Charger in the fourth and fifth. Sky Jack's dam, Sky Captive, has Mahmoud in the fifth, sixth and seventh generations and two strains of Nasrullah, both in the fifth generation. That gives nine crosses of either Mahmoud or Mumtaz Begum, and since Mahmoud is a grandson, and Mumtaz Begum a daughter, of "The Flying Filly" Mumtaz Mahal, perhaps it is not surprising that Sky Jack's connections noted that he has a lot of speed for a horse that can run a route.

The Mumtaz Mahal strain is probably what completely ties this pedigree together. Sky Jack's fourth dam, Hill Whisper, is inbred 3x4 to Éclair, a major tap-root mare, who is also ancestress of Blushing Groom. Mumtaz Mahal is by The Tetrarch out of a mare by Sundridge, and Éclair is by a son of The Tetrarch and her dam, Black Ray, is out of a mare by Sundridge.

RACING SYMPOSIUM OPENS TODAY Many of the leaders of the racing world gather in Tucson, Arizona today for the opening of the 27th University of Arizona Symposium on Racing. The conference, which runs through Friday, will offer presentations on everything from e-commerce to women in racing and maintaining the sport's integrity. The opening presentation of the symposium is called, "Taking Account," during which panelists will discuss the current status of account wagering in the United States and Canada. Representatives of the Washington law firm of Dewey Ballantine LLP will talk about the results of a study commissioned by the International Federation of Horse-racing Authorities which delved into the challenges new technology, including the Internet, present to the racing industry. Also on tap at the symposium for today is a discussion of the economics of racing and racing in the mass media. On Thursday, Steven Crist, editor, publisher and CEO of the *Daily Racing Form* will lead a discussion of e-commerce and what it means for racing. Thursday will also feature panels on veterinary research, relationship marketing and racing's integrity. Friday's offerings include discussions on legislative issues, racing in Latin America and a presentation by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association.

LUHUK TO GAINESWAY Luhuk (Forty Niner--Royal Stance, by Dr. Fager), a leading freshman sire in Argentina in 2000, will stand at Graham Beck's Gainesway Farm in Lexington, Kentucky for the 2001 breeding season. During his racing career, the nine-year-old was a two-time stakes winner in England and was twice group placed. Michael Herson, director of sales at Gainesway, commented, "As a proven sire, with a strong American pedigree, he will have great market appeal." Luhuk has sired Guernika, winner of the G1 Argentine 1000 Guineas and the G1 Gran Premio Consagracion de Potrancas, as well as group winners Theol and El Guapito. He will stand as the property of a syndicate for a fee of \$10,000 live foal, payable Nov. 1.

PARTNER'S HERO FILLY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON A weanling filly by Partner's Hero fetched \$125,000 to top yesterday's final session of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed Sale in Timonium, Maryland. Out of Monday's sale-topping mare **Poised to Pounce** (Smarten), the youngster was consigned by Chanceland Farm, agent and was purchased by Richard Golden. She is a half sister to multiple stakes winner **Quick 'n Smart** (Polish Numbers). Three days long, compared to last year's two-day auction, the sale grossed \$4,315,700 for 566 horses and averaged \$7,625.

REGAL CLASSIC HEADS NEW TRIO AT

MCMAHON Regal Classic (Vice Regent--No Class, by Nodouble) leads a trio of new arrivals for the 2001 breeding season at McMahon of Saratoga Thoroughbreds in Saratoga Springs, New York. The 15-year-old stallion, who had been standing at Prestonwood/WinStar Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, will be joined in New York by **Always Fair** (Danzig--Carduel, by Buckpasser), also from WinStar, and new stallion **Malibu Wesley** (Storm Cat--La Spia, by Capote). Canadian champion Regal Classic, sire of champion Colorful Vices and graded stakes winners Stephanotis, One Way Love and River Boat, will stand the 2001 season for \$10,000, live foal. From eight crops to race, he has sired 31 stakes winners. Always Fair, a multiple group winner in France, has sired group winners Cayoke, Vadlawys and Lunafairy. He will stand for \$3,500, live foal. Shares are available in both Regal Classic and Always Fair, each of whose majority ownership is held by Bill Caster and Kenny Trout's WinStar Farm. Rounding out the trifecta, Malibu Wesley will become the latest son by sire-of-sire's Storm Cat to enter stud in 2001, standing for an introductory fee of \$1,000, live foal. Sold at the Barretts two-year-olds in training sale for \$900,000, the son of Grade II winner La Spia was acquired privately by perennial leading North American owner and breeder John Franks. On the track, the five-year-old was an allowance winner at Woodbine with lifetime earnings of \$91,080. This will be the first New York stallion for Franks, who bred 1999 New York-bred Horse of the Year Circle of Life, and was named the 1999 New York Breeder of the Year.

BEECH HOUSE CELEBRATES REVIVAL

Yesterday the public had a chance to witness the return of Beech House Stud to former glories once more, when Shadwell Estates' stallions **Mujahid (USA)** (Danzig {USA}) and **Erhaab (USA)** (Chief's Crown {USA}) were on display. The Stud, situated in Newmarket, was originally part of Colonel Harry McCalmont's Cheveley Estate, but is renowned as the home of the great Nearco, stood by Martin Benson. It was also the stud on which the likes of Crepello, Ardross, St Paddy, and Pharly served as part of its esteemed past, but since 1989, it has been used as a holding station. Yesterday as Mujahid, winner of the 1998 G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket, and Erhaab, winner of the 1994 Epsom Derby, were paraded in front of an appreciative crowd, Richard Lancaster, the Shadwell Stud Director, spoke of their hopes for the pair: "Mujahid has the great look of his sire about him, and has the conformation we have all come to expect in sons of Danzig. We have had many enquiries about him since he arrived here about a week ago." Erhaab, who arrived at the same time, and who is the second Shadwell homebred to have won the Epsom Derby, after Nashwan, drew lofty comments from his former jockey Wille Carson, who described him as an "absolute superstar." He went on: "He gave me the greatest thrill in my career as a jockey the day he won the Derby, and that lovely acceleration in the final furlong was a fantastic feeling."

GERMAN SEASON REVIEW

by Christa Riebel

Apart from diverse domestic problems in the industry, the millennium racing season in Germany had quite a few special aspects to offer. One of them was the sensational young stallion Monsun. Gestut Schlenderhan's leading first-season sire of 1999 clearly dominated the first half of the season with his progeny, especially where the Classic trials were concerned.

His leading representative was, of course, Stall Blankenese's chestnut colt Samum, who scored a most impressive victory in the G1 BMW Deutsches Derby and went on to beat international competition in the G1 Mercedes Benz Grosser Preis von Baden, which was run as part of the Emirates World Series for the first time. Monsun's contemporary, Gestut Rottgen's grey Kalaglow horse Sternkonig made a very successful start at stud as well. His leading representative from his first crop was Kallisto, the runaway winner of the G1 Derby Italiano, which means that both these young stallions managed to sire a Derby and G1 winner from their initial crop and thus follow in the footsteps of Gestut Fahrhof's Lomitas last year. Monsun, as the arguably best representative of the proven Konigsstuhl-Surumu cross, and Sternkonig, as a close relative to such proven sires as Star Appeal and Strong Gale, head the division of hopeful young sires in this country.

Gestut Ittlingen's Japan Cup hero Lando can boast the impressive French Listed winner Fine and Mellow and the G1 performer Paolini in his first crop, while the Gestut Karlshof based Winged Love really got off the mark with two Group winners in the last races of the year. The winner of the Irish Derby, Winged Love is by the Sadler's Wells horse In The Wings from an internationally proven dam line which is also firmly rooted in this country. The two-year-old Winged Love colt Cheirokratie put himself well in the picture for next year's Derby by easily taking the G3 Preis des Winterfavoriten, while the filly Kapitol from Winged Love's first crop scored in the G3 Preis des Landes NRW before being retired to stud. *Cont. p3*

Germany looks rather promisingly equipped for sires at the moment. Apart from the likes of champions Acatenango, Dashing Blade, Big Shuffle and Law Society, there are the aforementioned Lomitas, the Surumu horse Platini who enjoyed a very fine season indeed, and Gestut Zoppenbroich's Second Set, whose daughter Bedford Set is the leading juvenile filly this year. Gestut Romerhof's Platini is the sire of Gary Tanaka's three-year-old filly Moonlady. This close relative to Monsun and the designated champion filly of her generation took four Group races this season, her victories culminating in the G2 Deutsches St. Leger and the G2 Long Island H. in the U.S. Nov. 11. Acatenango sired another Classic winner in the G2 Preis der Diana-German Oaks heroine Puntilla, while Law Society's best performer was the smart three-year-old filly Quezon City, a Listed winner and prominently placed in G1 and Classic company. Dashing Blade and Big Shuffle are two further top-class stallion imports. Big Shuffle once again ended the season as the leading sire of juveniles, while Dashing Blade is prominently placed on both the sires statistics. His outstanding performer this year was the G1 Premio Vittorio di Capua winner Faberger who caused an upset victory in the G3 Prix Messidor earlier in the season. Gestut Schattauer Hof's Classic-winning champion Kornado as a further contemporary of Monsun and Sternkonig had his first runners this year and is the leading first-season sire in 2000.

One of the best horses to have ever graced the German turf was the Lion Cavern filly Crimplene (Ire), who made all to win the G2 Henkel-Rennen-German 1000 Guineas in style. At that stage, almost nobody in Germany realised that they had seen a world-class filly in action. Crimplene went on to glory in the Irish 1000 Guineas, Coronation Cup and Nassau S. The G2 Mehl-Mulhens-Rennen went to Godolphin's Pacino, who failed to sparkle later in the season, though. Some of the best performances this year include the decisive victory of Greek Dance in the G1 Bayerisches Zuchtrennen, Mutafaweq taking the G1 Deutschland-Preis, Golden Snake capturing the G1 Europa-Preis and Slip Stream winning the G2 Berlin Brandenburg Trophy. All of these foreign runners belong to top performers in their home country which shows that big owners and trainers from abroad are now happy to race their leading horses in this country.

Germany managed to score some fine victories abroad as well. Apart from the above mentioned Faberger and Kallisto, the other highlights were Gestut Wittekindshof's Elle Danzig winning back-to-back runnings of the G1 Premio Roma and Gestut Schlenderhan's Catella winning the G1 Erdgas Trophy at home and finishing a gallant third in the G1 Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf. Racing has become an extremely international affair. One of the best examples for this theory in 2000 was the G2 Zukunfts-Rennen victor Tagshira. The son of the leading first-season sire Tagula, acquired at the Breeze-Up Sale in Newmarket, is German owned, and is trained by the rising young Swiss trainer Urs Suter, who is now based at Baden Baden.

Mr and Mrs Bruno Faust's Gestut Karlshof has earned the title of leading breeder in Germany this year, with the champion three-year-old colt Samum being their outstanding performer. Gestut Schlenderhan, Gestut Fahrhof and Gestut Wittekindshof are close up. Gestut Schlenderhan as Germany's oldest privately owned stud is clearly back at the very top and heads the division of leading owner by a good margin of approximately DM200,000. Next in line are Gary Tanaka, Samum's owner Stall Blankenese, Gestut Rottgen and Baron Helmut von Finck. While Andrasch Starke has managed to defend his champion jockey title, the case of the leading trainer is not settled yet. Currently Andreas Schutz lies slightly ahead of Mario Hofer, with Peter Schiergen still close up as well. Even though the domestic situation within the administration as well as that of German breeders and owners is rather difficult and insecure at the moment, the increasing international recognition should be marked as a great achievement and be recognized as a factor of hope. This international acceptance was underlined by the fact that the French Agence Winners paid the top price of DM400,000 for a yearling filly at the record-breaking BBAG Baden Baden Yearling Sale in September as well as Newsells Park Stud and leading French agent Jean-Pierre Deroubaix securing the top lots at the Autumn Mixed Sale in October. The situation in the German thoroughbred industry may be described as currently rather unsettled, but the marked improvement in bloodstock quality marks a step in the right direction.
