TATTERSALLS DECEMBER CONCLUDES

The Tattersalls December Sales concluded with a low-key session yesterday that finished off an outstanding year at the Newmarket auction house. Even with vendor buy backs excluded, the annual turnover of 137,291,030gns eclipsed the previous best of over 126 million guineas, realised three years ago. The December Sales were record-breakers themselves in several respects, most notably with Brocatelle (GB) (Green Desert) becoming the most expensive mare sold in Europe on Wednesday when she realised 1.7 million guineas. Reflecting on this sale, Edmond Mahony, the Tattersalls chairman, said, "The December Sales have very much mirrored the trade that we have seen throughout the year here at Tattersalls. Each of the sales in 2000 have broken new ground, and the December Sales have rounded off the year in spectacular fashion, with the highlight being the European record price of 1.7 million guineas for the broodmare Brocatelle. The foal trade in the first week of the sales suggested that the demand for broodmares and fillies would be strong, but we could not have predicted that the smallest December Sales catalogue for many years would break the 50-million guineas barrier. We have been inundated with overseas buyers from every continent in the world this week, and the depth of demand from British and Irish buyers has been an equally significant factor not only at the December Sales but throughout the year." Tattersalls recorded record individual prices at its Breeze-Up, Houghton, October, Autumn Yearling and Horses In Training sales. Mahony continued, "Quality has always been the key at Tattersalls and never more so than this year. Our vendors have provided us with some vintage catalogues, in particular at the Houghton and October yearling sales, and the results demonstrate the global demand for top-quality bloodstock." Yesterday's top price of 65,000gns was paid during the morning by agent Peter Doyle for Propensity (GB) (Habitat), a 16-year-old mare consigned from the Haras de la Perelle in Normandy. Joss Collins of the BBA was underbidder on the granddam of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Wannabe Grand. "She is going to a good home in Ireland," said Doyle. "It's a really lovely family but I don't know who will cover her."

Services for the two-time Kentucky Derby winner will be held at 1:30 p.m. tomorrow at the First Baptist Church with burial in the Bookhart Family Cemetery. On Tuesday, Antley was memorialized in a one-hour service in California. His family has requested donations be made to either the Disabled Jockey's Fund or the Special Olympics.

OLD TOPPER RETIRED Multiple graded stakes winner Old Topper (Gilded Time--Shy Trick, by Phone Trick) has been retired after suffering a bowed tendon, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The five-year-old won the 1998 GIII Pat O'Brien H. and the 1997 GIII Best Pal S. for trainer Noble Threewitt and owner Barbara Hunter. Threewitt told the *Form* that Hunter planned to sell Old Topper for stallion duty. The chestnut won a six-furlong Del Mar allowance by 5 1/2 lengths in his final career start. He retires with seven wins in 25 starts and 11 placings for earnings of \$655,860.

Q & A ... with the NTRA

Last week the NTRA began a series of Frequently Asked Questions. The first question (and answer) addressed where the bulk of the NTRA budget is spent. This is the second question in the series:

Q: What about political spending? Is it as important as some people claim?

Absolutely. Thankfully, support for the NTRA's voluntary 1/4-percent funding program by buyers, sellers and the sales companies has been overwhelming so far this year and we are grateful to all the participants. The entire contribution from buyers and a substantial percentage of the income from sales companies and sellers from this program has been earmarked for political purposes, which has enabled us to greatly bolster racing's lobbying efforts in Washington, D.C.

Our legislative presence has, when measured in dollar terms, tripled over the last year. We are spending \$600,000 this year and have budgeted \$800,000 for next year. This includes the creation of an NTRA political action committee (PAC). These are not huge sums of money compared to what other entertainment and gaming interests spend, but given the threats our industry has faced in just the last few months to account wagering and interstate simulcasting, it is clear that this area needs to be a continuing priority.

Throughout this year, we worked diligently with our supporters in Congress and the American Horse Coun- cil, our lobbyists, sports organizations like the NCAA and the NFL and law enforcement officials toward passage of HR 3125, the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act, (the "Kyl/Goodlatte bill") against formidable opposition.

Our opponents were well organized and well funded. They waged a sophisticated public relations battle to portray the bill as an expansion of gambling, unfairly characterizing the horseracing exemptions in the process. Even more unfortunate is the public position of the Department of Justice (DOJ) in opposition to the bill. In its testimony before Congress, the DOJ's position is that our current account wagering and interstate simulcasting practices are in violation of the Wire Act, a criminal statute.

In fact, the exemptions for pari-mutuel wagering contained in the Internet Gambling Prohibition Act do not represent an expansion of gaming opportunities. They merely protect states' rights to sanction pari-mutuel wagering and the right of the racing industry to conduct current levels of interstate wagering and account wagering activity, which were previously encouraged by Congress in the Interstate Horseracing Act of 1978, years after passage of the Wire Act.

Short of the Kyl/Goodlatte bill, legislation that would clarify racing's existing position under the IHA has been introduced and may pass prior to the end of the year.

This is just one example of why, now more than ever, being stronger in the political and regulatory arenas will be a key to our industry's ability to prosper over the long term.
