SEATTLE SLEW BACK TO SERVICE

Leading sire Seattle Slew (Bold Reasoning) has been cleared to return to the breeding shed for 2001, Three Chimneys Farm announced yesterday. The 26-year-old stallion started the 2000 season with excellent fertility, but suffered spinal cord compression caused by arthritic changes and underwent surgery to fuse the joint between two vertebrae in his neck in April. "At this point, we feel good about his having a normal book for a stallion of his age," said Three Chimneys general manager Dan Rosenberg. Winner of the 1977 Triple Crown, he underwent fertility analysis Dec. 11 and 12, which determined that he was fit to cover mares. "We expect Slew to breed a book of 46 mares on shareholder and breeding right holder seasons," said Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay. "One or two shareholders have indicated to me they will put their seasons on the market and the price they have mentioned is \$300,000 guaranteed live foal." Seattle Slew is represented this year on the racetrack by Grade I winners Honest Lady and Surfside, and sired the Fasig-Tipton Saratoga topper, a \$4.2 million colt out of Omi (Wild Again).

STARKE CAPTURES JOCKEY CHALLENGE

Champion German jockey Andrasch Starke won the Hong Kong International Jockeys' Championship Wednesday night at Happy Valley, garnering the firstplace prize of HK\$200,000. Starke seized the first leg of the challenge aboard Po On Power, who closed strongly in the last 200 meters. After finishing up the track in the second leg, won by Australian jockey Brett Prebble, Starke secured his title by winning the third and final race of the challenge. Millennium Supreme, with Starke aboard, outfinished Prebble's mount Strikers by a half-length. "This is the biggest thrill for me," Starke commented. "I've ridden about 1000 winners in my career, but these rank very high and I just hope my good fortune continues this Sunday." Starke will ride German star Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) in the G1 Hong Kong Cup, the final race of the Emirates World Series. "I always thought Andrasch Starke would do well in Hong Kong," said Hong Kong Jockey Club's executive director of racing. "He is used to tight tracks in Germany and has good tactical sense."

CUP, VASE NOTES As Dec. 17 quickly approaches, horses and their connections applied some finishing touches on their pre-Hong Kong International race preparations yesterday morning. Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) cantered two laps on the grass with stablemate and G1 Hong Kong Vase hope Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Greek Dance will line up in the 1 1/4-mile G1 Hong Kong Cup and Jacky Tervit, the five-year-old's lad, said, "If Greek Dance can put in the performance he did behind Giant's Causeway in the Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown in September, then he will take all the beating here on Sunday. While the boss was cautious not to send Daliapour to Japan when he scoped a little dirty last month, he seems very well now." Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) will tackle the Vase. Trainer Andreas Wohler watched him in a steady canter on the main work track and was delighted with him. "The horse is happy and is moving well," Wohler said. "He had a slight problem after his run in heavy ground at Hamburg, so he has had a long rest. I would have liked to get another run into him, but the ground wasn't suitable at home. He's a fresh horse now and I think he can finish in the money."

AGE BEFORE BEAUTY?

An old-timer in good spirits, Perryston View (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}) went on the grass under veteran pilot George Duffield. Trainer Jeremy Glover said, "At home he is very laid back, but when he gets somewhere like this he gets on his toes. I think that's good for an older horse like him." Duffield, who took a while to pull him up, added, "He got his silly head on this morning. He got his tongue over the bit and was an eight-year-old behaving like a two-year-old. Then again the older you get the dafter you get, we're both the same." The eight-year-old's owners, Janis and Kenneth Macpherson, are having the time of their lives. "This is just wonderful," they said. "We have never had an opportunity like this. It means a lot to us. We've had many good handicappers, but 'Perry' is the first horse that's won Group races for us. For a small owner to come here is amazing. It's a dream come true."

SUNLINE SET FOR MILE CHALLENGERS

Continuing her preparation for the G1 Hong Kong Mile, the mare Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) cantered on the inside dirt under the watchful eye of trainer Trevor McKee. He said, "She looks well. I'm very pleased with her. She traveled well and she's settled in. She lost a little weight on the flight, but it's virtually all back on now. She's only two kilograms lighter than when she left home. We might ask a little more [today], but really she's very fit and doesn't require much work." Last Resort (GB) (Lahib) went through the rain-softened all-weather surface on the track as she nears her date in the Mile against the only other female in the race, Sunline. British trainer Barry Hills, looking on as his filly worked, said, "She has traveled well and a little blow will do for today. We will do something with her on the grass [today]." Trainer Joanna Morgan, who is readying One Won One (Naevus) for the same contest, also watched her horse work on the all-weather track, "He seems in very good form," she said of the six-year-old.

DANZIG SEASON TOPS ON-LINE AUCTION A

no-guarantee nomination to **Danzig** (Northern Dancer) sold to Nicoma Bloodstock for \$280,000 to top Equine Spectrum's inaugural on-line stallion season sale. In all, 21 of 24 offered seasons sold for a gross of \$1,321,500 and an average of \$62,928. "We proved that the Internet auction venue works when you have a quality product and people from all over the world can participate on even footing," said Equine Spectrum executive director Tom Biederman. The highest actual bid received was \$324,000 for a season to **Seeking the Gold** (Mr. Prospector), but the reserve was not attained.

ORSENO PLANNING FOR NEW YEAR Trainer Joe Orseno will have a full barn stabled at Gulfstream for owner Frank Stronach, including divisional stars Macho Uno (Holy Bull) and Red Bullet (Unbridled). The two colts, currently at Stronach's Adena Springs South Farm in Ocala, will ship to the southern Florida track next week. Orseno outlined plans for Preakness winner Red Bullet and likely juvenile champion Macho Uno, who took the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Churchill Downs Nov. 4. "They've both been at the farm in Ocala," Orseno said. "They'll be shipped here on Dec. 21. Right now, our main objective with Red Bullet is the Donn Handicap [GI, 2-3], and we're looking to run Macho Uno is one race before the Florida Derby [GI, 3-10]. Then after the Florida Derby, it will be the Wood Memorial [GII, 4-14] in New York, followed by the Kentucky Derby [GI, 5-5]." Macho Uno captured the Breeders' Cup in just his fourth career start, and was sent to Ocala following that victory for a brief freshening. "We tried to manage him where he only raced four times this year," Orseno continued. "He's still got a lot more to learn, but he's been doing really well now and I think he's a colt with a great future." The lightly raced Red Bullet derailed Fusaichi Pegasus's Triple Crown bid by winning the Preakness in May, but went to the sidelines following a third-place finish in the GII Dwyer at Belmont July 9. "After the Dwyer, he suffered a viral infection, and while he was recovering from that we found a very small fracture in his left foreleg," Orseno explained. "So we decided to take him out of training and sent him to the farm in Ocala. Our racing manager, Danny Vella, has done an excellent job of getting him legged up at the farm for his return. I spent the last couple of weeks up there [Ocala] and worked Red Bullet three furlongs in :37 2/5 last week. He'll work another time or two before I bring him down here [Gulfstream] and I'm certain we'll have him ready for the Donn."
