HONG KONG SET TO SPARKLE

A talented and well-traveled field of 14 was drawn yesterday for Sunday's running of the HK\$14 million G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin, the final leg of the Emirates World Series. William Hill Betting has made Godolphin's Fantastic Light (Rahy) and defending Cup champion Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)) 3-1 cofavorites. Fantastic Light, winner of this year's GI Man o' War at Belmont Park and third in the Nov. 26 G1 Japan Cup, drew post 11 for Sunday's race, but that isn't worrying jockey Frankie Dettori. "In all the years I've been coming here for the event nobody has said, 'We were beaten by the draw.' The track is very fair with no guirks and it is fair to all horses. Fantastic Light has been running so consistently, and his turn will eventually come." Francois Doumen continued to be pleased with Jim and Tonic's preparation for the race. "He's in very good shape and he's obviously a marvelous traveler," Doumen said yesterday after his charge drew post seven. The six-year-old returned from a seven-month layoff to win the Nov. 4 G3 Prix Perth. Fantastic Light and German invader Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}) will take the Emirates World Series and earn a US\$1-million bonus with a Hong Kong win. Samum, listed at 8-1 by Hills, drew post four, but trainer Andreas Schutz commented, "I don't worry about barrier draws." In the G1 Hong Kong Vase, Hills 7-2 favorite Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) drew post nine. Johnny Murtagh, who will ride the G1 Coronation Cup winner Sunday, commented, "I'm not out too far or in too close. There's plenty of time to find a position from the start. I just hope it's not a stop-start tempo." Australasian champion Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}), who drew post nine in the G1 Hong Kong Mile, is favored at 5-2 to make amends for a disappointing effort in last year's Cup. "She looks good and she's very fit," commented trainer Trevor McKee. "She has something to prove here in Hong Kong after last year's failure and I'm sure she can do it." Nuclear Debate (Geiger Counter), favored at 5-2 in the G3 Sprint, drew post nine while American challenger Big Jag (Kleven), 7-1, will break from the seven hole. A confident trainer Tim Pinfield said, "Big Jag is in such top condition, he could run on broken glass this Sunday if he had to." HONG KONG SALE TONIGHT A total of 26 twovear-olds have been catalogued for tonight's Piaget Hong Kong International Sale. The sale features readvto-run juveniles by stallions from the northern and southern hemispheres, including Danehill, Last Tycoon (Ire), Kris (GB), Marscay (Aus) and American-based stallions Cherokee Run and Thunder Gulch. Each of the lots was purchased at yearling sales from around the world, one of the most expensive of which was lot 22, a colt by three-time leading Australian sire Danehill. The bay is out of Sedra (Ire) (Nebbiolo {GB}), herself a multiple group stakes placed performer and most importantly the dam of Samraan (Green Dancer), a stakes winner in Italy and third in the 1996 G1 Pertemps St Leger S. at Doncaster. A May foal, the colt brought Ir170,000gns at the 1999 Goffs Orby Sale. Purchased at the same sale for Ir160,000gns was lot number nine, an attractive colt by Thunder Gulch. He is out of Bergere Legere (Ire) (Last Tycoon {Ire}), a Listed stakes placed threeparts sister to Italian two-year-old champion Bestebreuje (Ire), and is related to two winners from as many foals to race. Bidding begins at 6:30 p.m. at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre.

NYRA 2001 STAKES SCHEDULE RELEASED The New York Racing Association will offer 145 stakes races worth \$30.5 million during next year's Belmont Spring/Summer and Fall Championship meets, Aqueduct's Fall meeting and at Saratoga. Of those stakes, 109 are graded and 38 are Grade Is. "This will be an exciting year of racing in New York, and that makes it exciting for the entire Thoroughbred industry," said Terry Meyocks, NYRA's President and COO. "During the course of the last several years, NYRA has worked diligently to improve its overall racing. Because of the support of owners, horsemen and fans, we have been able to accomplish our mission and to now offer an ideal schedule of races that will culminate in the crowning of champions at Belmont Park in the Breeders' Cup." NYRA's Belmont Spring/Summer meet will run from May 9 through July 22 and will offer 38 stakes worth \$7.657 million. The highlight of the meeting will be the 133rd running of the \$1 million GI Belmont S. on June 9. Also on that card will be the \$400,000 GI Manhattan H. Other Belmont features next year will be the 108th running of the \$750,000 GI Metropolitan H. on May 28, the \$250,000 GI Mother Goose on June 30, the \$350,000 GI Coaching Club American Oaks on July 21 and the recently upgraded \$200,000 GI Prioress on July 4. Next summer's Saratoga meeting will include 35 stakes worth \$8.95 million. The Jim Dandy, granted Grade I status in 2001, will be worth \$600,000 and will be run Aug. 4. The \$1 million GI Travers S. will be run on Aug. 25. Other Grade I events on tap for Saratoga next year include the Sept. 1 \$250,000 Forego H., the Aug. 18 \$750,000 Alabama, the July 28 \$250,000 Test S., Sept. 1 \$200,000 Hopeful and the July 28 \$750,000 Whitney H. The Breeders' Cup Preview Day is the highlight of the 46-stakes Belmont Fall Championship Meet. Set for Oct. 6, the preview includes the \$1 million GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, the \$750,000 GI Beldame, the \$500,000 GI Champagne and the \$500,000 GI Frizette. The Aqueduct Fall schedule, with 26 stakes worth \$1.95 million is highlighted by the Nov. 24 renewal of the \$350,000 Gl Cigar Mile.

CHURCHILL PROGRAM WORTH \$7.8M IN 2001

Churchill Downs's 2001 stakes schedule presents 39 stakes--34 of which are graded--with total purses of \$7,875,000. The traditional highlight of the season is the 127th renewal of the \$1 million Kentucky Derby on May 5 and its filly equivalent, the \$500,000 Kentucky Oaks on May 4. The Kentucky track has grouped three of its popular stakes, the \$750,000 GII Stephen Foster H., the \$300,000 GIII Fleur de Lis and the \$150,000 GIII Regret, into one card. The trio of graded events will be run June 16. "The Stephen Foster H., the Fleur de Lis and the Regret have in recent years attracted many of the brightest stars in their respective divisions and the linking of the three races on a single day provides Churchill Downs with another major racing event for our Spring Meet," explained Don Richardson, senior vice president of racing at Churchill. "Our 2001 stakes schedule contains a record number of graded stakes races, which indicates the continued growth of a stakes program that ranks among the finest in American racing." Churchill's spring meet runs from Apr. 28 through July 8 and includes 28 races--24 graded--worth \$5.875 million. The Oct. 28 through Nov. 24 Fall Meet is headed by the 127th running of the \$400,000 GII Clark H. on Nov. 23. The Fall meet features 11 stakes races--10 of which are graded--with total purses of \$2 million.

STRAIGHT MAN TO DUNHILL Straight Man (Saint Ballado--Brilliant Melody, by Cornish Prince) has been retired to stud at Dunhill Stud in Reddick, Florida. The four-year-old Florida-bred returns to his home state after a successful record of 5-2-1 from 15 starts. His wins include a victory in the May 6 GII Winnercomm H. at Churchill and a second in last year's GI Malibu S. He amassed \$333,304 in two years of racing and ended his career with a fourth in Hollywood's GIII Vernon O. Underwood S. Dec. 10. "Straight Man is the kind of horse that's really drawing breeders' attention," said Dunhill Stud Stallion Coordinator Adam Staple. "He's out of a solid, stakes-producing family with a great deal of depth. We are very excited about his arrival and anticipate filling his book very shortly." The \$15,000 OBSOCT weanling and \$290,000 FTKJUL yearling will stand for a fee of \$5,000.

Double Trick, a \$25,000 KEESEP yearling, tried her hand at stakes company three back, finishing fifth in the Sept. 4 Steve Van Buren H. at Philadelphia over a sloppy track. Sidelined for two months, the Valley Forge Stable filly returned at Aqueduct, running fourth in an allowance event Nov. 1, but improving to second place in a similar race Nov. 29. Always on the board at this distance, she raced a length off the lead before fighting to the front after a half mile and steadily drawing clear of the six-horse field for the score.

HOLY TREASURE (f, 3, Holy Bull--Goldminess, by Mr. Prospector) began her racing career last December and had been on the board in five of her seven previous starts. Most recently the \$250,000 FTSAUG yearling and \$400,000 FTFFEB two-year-old led from the gate and tired to run third, 3/4 lengths behind the winner Nov. 19. This time, sent off the 3-5 favorite, she overcame bumping at the start to take command two furlongs out. Opening her margin to a safe three lengths, she looked clear entering the straight, but had to hang on to her lead to win by a mere 3/4 lengths over the late-challenging Secret Breeze (Secret Hello). Lifetime Record: 8-1-2-3, \$58,450.

Next time out, the veteran just missed in the Nov. 12 Steinlen H. at this track, falling a half length short of the victory. Yesterday he proved himself best of this company. Sent to the post at even money, the Irish-bred chestnut was quick to track Irish Prize, who led the field around two bends. Turning for home, Self Feeder mustered up a bid and rallied into the fore in the final strides to take his first success since November of last year.

Q & A ... with the NTRA

Q: How is the NTRA Board of Directors elected? Is it done democratically?

A: The NTRA is governed by a Board of Directors composed of the NTRA Commissioner & CEO (Tim Smith), five racetrack representatives and five horsemen's representatives who serve staggered, three-year terms. In 2001, the board will expand by four seats--

two for Breeders' Cup Limited, one currently slated for the Thoroughbred Racing Associations (TRA) and one specifically to an NTRA "small track." The Board is constituted to reflect a 50-50 split between racetracks and horsemen/breeding associations. This balance was carefully considered and adopted during the NTRA's formation to recognize the balance that exists in most applicable statutes, simulcasting and horsemen's contracts.

How are Directors elected? Let's take Bryan Krantz, president and general manager of Fair Grounds as an example. Krantz was elected to his seat on the Board this past March by the Southern Region of the TRA when Doug Donn, formerly president and CEO of Gulfstream Park, vacated that same seat. Other racetrack representatives elected to the Board are Bill Bork, Thomas H. Meeker, Terence Meyocks and Lonny Powell, who recently resigned as the West Coast racetrack representative. All were elected by NTRA member tracks in their respective regions.

Horsemen's representatives are elected in similar fashion. They are: Robert Clay (Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders Association), Alan Foreman (Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association), Robert Lewis (Thoroughbred Owners of California), Ogden Mills Phipps (The Jockey Club) and Bill Walmsley (Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association). Each was chosen by his constituents. In the cases of Foreman, Lewis and Walmsley, their seats were won only after several hundred votes were cast by their member organizations.

No system is perfect. But the existing NTRA Board structure is broadly representative and includes most of the major constituencies in the industry: racetracks elected by all dues payers in each of five regions, smaller racetrack and TRA representatives, the major horsemen's associations (THA, TOC, HBPA) and own- ers and breeders--represented by TOBA, the Breeders' Cup and The Jockey Club.

Recently, Magna Entertainment Chairman Frank Stronach proposed a revised NTRA Board structure that would put racetracks in a 33 percent minority position relative to horsemen, and would disenfranchise organizations like the HBPA, THA and TOC. Mr. Stronach's suggestions are worthy of discussion.

However, such a revised structure would be problematic at best and difficult to implement from a practicality standpoint. To reject and discard this current structure, without carefully evaluating whether an alternative would be an improvement, could prove to be a major mistake. As history has shown all too clearly, consensus is hard to reach on any governing structure for horseracing, and a different one could well end up less democratic, less inclusive and less effective than that already in place.

NEWBURY SPONSORS IN DUBAI
