#### A GIVEN FOR POINT GIVEN?

The Thoroughbred Corporation's high-spirited Point Given (Thunder Gulch) tackles today's GI Hollywood Futurity with three distinct advantages. He's never been off the board in his five lifetime starts; he hasn't finished worse than second at this distance; and he has worked three consecutive bullets, at three different distances, since finishing second to Macho Uno by a nose in the Nov. 4 GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile. Considering all of that, the colt is the morning line's 4-5 favorite. The \$1.2 million yearling Millennium Wind (Cryptoclearance) is one for one, seizing his career opener by four lengths here Nov. 18. The David and Jill Heerensperger colt attempts 1 1/16 miles for the first time, but his sire's staving ability adds credibility to the decision to step him up in class and distance. Bank Street (Slew o' Gold) also is being upgraded for the first time in nine starts. Claimed for \$50,000 from a race he won Nov. 3, the Oak Tree Farm-bred colt continued his success with a narrow score in an \$80,000 optional claiming event Nov. 29, but is still the longest shot on the morning line at 20-1. Golden Ticket (Deposit Ticket), a \$105,000 OBSMAR yearling, will try to overcome inexperience at this level of competition to take the guarantee away from Point Given. The Mike Mitchell trainee bounced back from a distant sixth in his bow Oct. 14 to capture a 4 1/2-length victory in a Hollywood maiden event Nov. 12, defeating Palmeiro (Pleasant Tap) at the task. The Kentucky-bred Palmeiro couldn't find the late kick he needed in that race, but was able to break his maiden in a similar contest Dec. 8. He's listed at 15-1 on the morning line and will have a tough time with this field.

### **SOVEREIGN AWARD WINNERS P. 3**

#### SPARKS FLY AT HONK KONG INT'L SALE

The fireworks started right from the start of last night's Piaget Hong Kong International Sale, when Lot 1, a two-year-old gelding by multiple leading sire Danehill achieved a record-setting bid of HK\$3.8 million. Out of the seven-year-old mare Romantic River (Irish River {Fr}), the New Zealand-bred was purchased by the Hong Kong Jockey Club for NZ\$310,000 at last year's New Zealand Bloodstock Premier Yearling Sale. When all was said and done, last night's purchase price more than tripled what was paid for him as a yearling. "When he galloped [Tuesday], it looked like he had a lot of heart," commented Hong Kong-based trainer Peter Lo, who acted as adviser for winning bidder Li Wing Hon. "We expected to pay about (HK)\$3.5 million for him. We picked him out at the breeze-up and I like horses from New Zealand," he continued. The sale achieved new heights in average, median and gross. The average of HK\$2,134,783 represented a 64.7-percent leap from last year's event, while the median was ahead by 54.7 percent against last year's figures. A total of 23 horses sold for a gross of HK\$49,100,000, a 57.8-percent rise from last year.

Primed and ready to go, Jim And Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)) looked in great shape at the Sha Tin track yesterday as he finalized his preparation for the HK\$14 million final leg of the Emirates World Series. With the busy jockey Gerald Mosse guiding, the defending Cup champion quickened up nicely in the final quarter mile of his exercise in front of a large contingent of track watchers. "He's very well," said his trainer Francois Doumen. "The fact that he hasn't raced much of late is balanced by the fact he is a fresh horse. He won very well in bad ground last time and had a couple of good workouts at home afterwards. I'm confident that he still retains all his ability and his turn of foot." The six-yearold gelding drew stall seven, but Mosse isn't worried. "He sits and the draw is no big deal with him," he said. Fellow French challenger Hidalguia (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}), fourth to Petrushka (Ire) in the G1 Prix de l'Opera at Longchamp Oct. 1, had a light spin on the all-weather track. "Hidalguia did three good workouts at Chantilly before she came, the last of which was last Thursday," said her trainer Jean de Roualle. "She is an improving filly who likes fast ground and I am hopeful she can get into the frame. She has the potential to do so, the only problem is her 13 draw." Other Cup horses run through their final drills were German champion three-year-old Samum (Ger) (Monsun {Ger}), who worked in company with stable companion and Cup opponent Elle Danzig (Ger) (Roi Danzig). "You couldn't split them on that piece of work, Samum is always lazy although he goes up a gear on race day," said Andreas Schutz pleased with his horses works. "Elle Danzig is a good work horse and a smart performer. She is very confident having won her last race by six lengths, but has a bad draw in 14."

With only two days left before the Vase, jockey Johnny Murtagh was on hand to guide Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in his exercise. "Daliapour is in great shape and I am looking forward to riding him," Murtagh said. Fellow British contender Ela Athena (GB) (Ezzoud {Ire}) continues to please Newmarket-based trainer Michael Jarvis in her big race build-up. "I have not done much with her here as she is perfectly fit," Jarvis said. "She is taking in all the surroundings and her weight has been level since she arrived here from the Japan Cup. She was not drawn well in gate one in Japan and now she has got stall two, which isn't much better, but she will enjoy the fast ground." The three-strong German challenge of Caitano (GB) (Niniski), Silvano (Ger) (Lomitas {GB}) and Catella (Ger) (Generous {Ire}) all pleased connections. Caitano, in his final gallop, stretched out well down the turf course home straight under regular work pilot Lazlo Seres. Andreas Wohler, trainer of four-year-old Silvano, expressed his delight with his charge saying, "He had a nice easy gallop on the turf and just quickened up in the straight. He's very well and I couldn't be happier with him." Peter Schiergen, Catella's trainer, supervised the filly's work on the all-weather surface. "She's had a long season, but I am confident that she has retained her form," Schiergen said. "She had a little rest after the Breeders' Cup and she's in the same sort of form now. I feel she should run well."

Jockey Jose Santos will spend the next day preparing for the unfamiliar competition he'll face aboard Charge d'Affaires (GB) (Kendor {Fr}) in the Mile. Santos plans on watching videos of his challengers, with a keen eye on the European contenders, but he remains confident in his five-year-old mount's ability. "I've ridden Charge d'Affaires six times in races," he said yesterday, "and he's never been as good as he is right now. He's a stalking horse and that's the sort of trip we expect to have on Sunday. He's my best chance." Santos also has the ride on trainer Christophe Clement's Forbidden Apple (Pleasant Colony) in the Cup.

Trainer Jeremy Glover did not enjoy the best of mornings yesterday. His Sprint hope Perryston View (GB) (Primo Dominie {GB}) may be without the services of veteran jockey George Duffield who suffered a bout of food poisoning and is doubtful for the ride. Glover made an immediate provision by booking jockey John Reid as a stand-by replacement. The trainer then watched in amazement as the eight-year-old sprinter bolted with Reid while hacking home during trackwork. "I wanted my horse to trot back towards the quarantine barn, but he took off with John when he started to hack and came back past me very fast," Glover said. "I thought he was going to go through the fence behind the 1000-metre start, but luckily he stopped." Connections of European champion sprinter-elect Nuclear Debate (Geiger Counter) took precautions and worked the gelding with cotton wool in his ears to block out the noise, which can wind him up. He looked relaxed as he breezed on the dirt with big-race jockey Gerald Mosse in the plate. Trainer John Hammond commented, "I feel he is very fit although he hasn't run for a long time. The good thing is that there should be plenty of pace on in the race and he wants a strongly-run five furlongs." Mosse added, "He's the horse. He showed how good he is in England in the summer and we know he will run better here this year." The Kevin Ryan-trained Eastern Purple (Ire) (Petorius {Ire}), with jockey Basil Marcus in the saddle, worked over 800 metres with Mile contender and Nigel Tinkler trainee Sugarfoot (GB) (Thatching {Ire}). "I am delighted with [Eastern Purple] and he is as good as I can get him," said Ryan. "He is in the right frame of mind. He's happy and will love the ground."

QUIET RESOLVE NAMED CANADIAN HORSE OF THE YEAR Quiet Resolve (Affirmed), who hit on the board in each of his seven starts this year, was honored with the Sovereign Award for Canadian Horse of the Year and Champion Male Turf Horse by the Canadian Jockey Club yesterday at the Four Seasons Hotel in Toronto. The five-year-old earned his trainer Mark Frostad and owner/breeder Sam-Son Farms Sovereign Awards in their respective categories in the process. The bay captured his first graded stakes this year when winning the GII Dixie S. at Pimlico in May. His success continued two starts later with a victory in the July 23 GII Hong Kong Jockey Club Cup and capped the campaign with a second in the Breeders' Cup Turf. He has amassed \$1,678,111 in his three-year career.

PINCAY TAKES 'BIG SPORT' AWARD Jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr. has been elected winner of the Big Sport of Turfdom for the second time, it was announced yesterday by the president of the Turf Publicists of America, Bob Curran, Jr. The award is given annually to a member of the racing industry whose cooperation with the media enhances coverage of the sport, as Pincay demonstrated on his way to becoming the winningest rider in Thoroughbred racing history last December and again when he passed the 9,000-victory mark Oct. 28. He will receive the award Jan. 30 at the Big Sport of Turfdom Luncheon at Arnaud's Restaurant in New Orleans. The first time the soon-to-be 54-yearold won this honor was in 1985. "Laffit Pincay, Jr. never seeks the spotlight, but when it finds him, he is always more than willing to promote the sport of Thoroughbred racing," said Curran of the Panama City, Panama native. "It's our good fortune that someone who has broken as many records as he has is so generous with his time. Members of the media, especially those who don't usually cover our sport, always come away with a sincere admiration and fondness for Laffit after spending time with him." Pincay has had many highlights in his 37-year riding career, with a Kentucky Derby, three Belmont S., seven Breeders' Cup races and six Eclipse Awards to his name. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1975 at the age of 29.

#### Kimmel Found Faultless:

Ruling on a lawsuit filed by Gulfstream Park against John Kimmel, a judge in Fort Lauderdale earlier this week found that Kimmel could not be held responsible for the death of Devil's Cup, who was injured during a race on the Gulfstream turf in March of 1997 and had to be euthanized because of his injuries the following October. Gold Spur Stables, owners of Devil's Cup, sued Gulfstream, claiming the turf course had been unsafe on the day their horse was hurt. Gulfstream in turn sued Kimmel, the horse's trainer, saying that as he signed the stall application blank, he was responsible for the horse's safety. The judge ruled against Gulfstream, saying there wasn't enough evidence to find Kimmel at fault. Gulfstream has 10 days to appeal the ruling and 30 days to go back to court.

#### Moelis Receives RCI Animal Welfare Award:

Herb Moelis has been honored with the 2000 Association of Racing Commissioners International Animal Welfare Award. Moelis, who owns CandyLand Farm in Middletown, Delaware, and his wife Ellen have been responsible for raising more than \$4 million for Thoroughbred charities in the past three years. The Moelises formed Thoroughbred Charities of America in 1997, a foundation which holds a yearly auction of stallion seasons and other horse racing items and donates the proceeds to rescue, research and retirement groups. Moelis serves on the board of directors of NTRA Charities, University of Pennsylvania Vet School, University of Pennsylvania Library, Delaware Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association, Tourette Syndrome Association and the Micro Image Corporation.
