BLINDED BY THE LIGHT

Fantastic Light (Rahy) capped a 2000 campaign that Ferdinand Magellan would certainly appreciate with an authoritative 1 3/4-length victory in the HK\$14 million G1 Hong Kong Cup before a crowd of 79,522, who wagered over HK\$1.2 billion at Sha Tin Racecourse yesterday. With the victory, the fouryear-old picked up a \$1-million bonus as the champion of the Emirates World Racing Championship (see related story p4). Winner of the G3 Dubai Sheema Classic on the Dubai World Cup undercard in March, the Saeed bin Suroor charge was second to Montjeu (Ire) in the G1 King George VII & Queen Elizabeth II Diamond S. before shipping to the U.S. to register a popular success in the GI Man o' War S. at Belmont Park Sept. 9. Fourth in the Oct. 7 GI Turf Classic when hampered by a soft pace, the bay was fifth to Kalanisi (Ire) in the Breeders' Cup Turf two back before running third, beaten a neck, just 22 days later in the 12-furlong G1 Japan Cup. Always a forward factor in yesterday's feature, he responded when jockey Frankie Dettori hit the accelerator leaving the 400-meter pole, inched clear and withstood a late rally from Greek Dance (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) to score as the slight favorite. Defending race champion Jim and Tonic (Fr) (Double Bed (Fr)) saved ground early and loomed a threat when shifted out in the lane, but could do no better than third in his attempt to win an International Race for a third consecutive year. America's best performance came from Forbidden Apple (Pleasant Colony), who finished an even fourth. "[Jockey] Frankie [Dettori] rode him very well --he was always close to the front," the winning conditioner said. "The shorter trip wasn't a problem for him and the ground suited him as well. They ran the last four furlongs very fast [in :46.3 seconds]." Plans call for Fantastic Light to get a break from the races before a likely return to competition on the Dubai World Cup program in March.

SUNLINE MAKES AMENDS

Revenge was on the mind of Trevor McKee, trainer of New Zealand's seven-time Group 1 winner Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) when his charge stepped onto the track for yesterday's G1 Hong Kong Mile at Sha Tin. The five-year-old mare was unsuccessful in her first foray to Hong Kong in 1999, when she finished off the board in the Cup. The bay came into this year's renewal of the International Races with five wins in six starts since celebrating her fifth birthday, including a decimating, seven-length victory in the Oct. 28 G1 Cox Plate over an extended 10 furlongs for the second year running. McKee decided to sharpen the mare up in the seven-furlong G2 Auckland Thoroughbred Breeders' S. in her native land Nov. 25, where she defeated a 14-horse field with relative ease. Jockey Greg Childs put Sunline into the bridle right away, as she cantered away to an easy lead while setting soft fractions. Turning for home it appeared that no one would threaten her lead, until 1999 Hong Kong Horse of the Year Fairy King Prawn (Aus) (Danehill) rushed up alongside at midstretch. The two slugged it out through the final 100 meters with Sunline just prevailing in the end. Native Desert (Desert Classic) and Charge d'Affaires (GB) (Kendor {Fr}) finished 10th and 11th respectively for the U.S. "I'd say she would have to be rated the best horse in the world this year," McKee suggested. "It is very, very satisfying, as we had a point to prove after last year." Despite offers from U.S. and Arab interests to purchase the multimillionairess, McKee indicated that Sunline will return to New Zealand and could be prepared for a run in Dubai in March.

Until last week, Daliapour was a member of the imposing racing operation of His Highness the Aga Khan, but as trainer Michael Stoute said, "The Aga Khan has a lot of horses and he can't keep them all." Standing just 15.2 hands, the four-year-old was sold for a reported \$800,000 to Singapore-based property magnate Robert Ng, who was in search of an immediate return on his investment in the Vase. The winner of Epsom's G1 Coronation Cup June 9, the bay had been held winless in his last three trips postward, including a third-place finish in the GI Canadian International at Woodbine Oct. 15, leaving some wondering whether the fast ground that afternoon contributed to his performance. In a very methodically run race, jockey John Murtagh aboard the eventual winner had a clean journey sitting just in behind the pacesetters and one path off the rail. Asked for his best with about 400 meters to race. Daliapour kicked clear and held world-traveller Ela Athena safe, earning back the lion's share of his purchase price. Caitano finished well to give owner Gary Tanaka a two-three finish. "We're delighted with the little horse. We were quietly confident before," Stoute said. "He really settled in well here, was giving us good vibes and we felt he was the best horse in the race." Daliapour, who gave Murtagh his 12th Group 1 victory this season, could also be pointed to the Dubai World Cup program under the auspices of Hong Kongbased trainer Ivan Allan. America's Ione hope, Val's Prince, was a non-threatening eighth.

Falvelon, only twice out of the frame in an already distinguished career, got the afternoon off to a rousing start for Australia, surging to the front with a furlong to run before holding off a determined and game Morluc to claim the spoils. The bay was the winner of the G2 Schillaci S. at Caulfield and the G2 Schweppes S. at Moonee Valley just 14 days apart, but was coming off a 10th-place finish as the betting choice in the G1 Salinger S. at Flemington Nov. 4. Well backed despite the presence of a crack group of international sprinters, the four-year-old was rated patiently out of the chute as local hopeful King of Danes assumed command. Set down with less than a furlong to go, Falvelon inched past King of Danes and withstood a furious wide rally from the Randy Morse-trained Morluc to register Australia's first win in the International Races since 1997. "I was not sure if we had won it, but watched [jockey] Damien [Oliver] lean down and give him a kiss and a cuddle so I thought we had it," said winning trainer Dan Bougoure. His American counterpart was slightly more disconsolate. "The trip over here was a very tough one. Morluc had never run on a straight course and the clockwise direction before," Morse said. "He has only missed top money by a foot and I am very proud of him." Third in this event last year, Big Jag was no factor yesterday. "He broke slowly and I was at work on him after 200 meters. He did not pick them up," said jockey Kent Desormeaux.

GODOLPHIN WINS SECOND WORLD SERIES

With his victory in the G1 Hong Kong Cup, Fantastic Light (Rahy) picked up 12 points, enough to earn the bay a \$1-million bonus for winning the second Emirates World Series Championship. The win was the second in as many years for Godolphin, which won the 1999 Series with Daylami (Ire). Four-year-old Fantastic Light scored points in four of the series' 11 events. In addition to the 12 points earned in Hong Kong, he registered a second-place finish in the King George and Queen Elizabeth II Diamond S. (6 points), was fifth in the Breeders' Cup Turf (2) and third in the Japan Cup (4). Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) finished second with 18 points. Daliapour (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Sunline (NZ) (Desert Sun {GB}) each had a chance to share top honors, but opted for the Vase and the Mile, respectively. "He fully deserves to be the world champion. He's been consistent all year," said jockey Frankie Dettori. Added Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford, "We've had such a roller-coaster year. It's been up one minute and down the next and it's great to get things right today." Frankie Dettori was the leading jockey in the series and Saeed bin Suroor was the top trainer. The 2001 Emirates World Series kicks off with the \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba March 24.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY...

December 17, 1936...Crooner **Bing Crosby** announced plans to construct a new racetrack, to be called the Del Mar Turf Club.

December 17, 1993...Fire destroyed the 122-year-old grandstand of **Fair Grounds**, the nation's third-oldest racetrack.

December 18, 1983...Hollywood Park held the first \$1 million race for two-year-old Thoroughbreds, the Hollywood Futurity, which was won by Fali Time, ridden by Sandy Hawley.

December 20, 1980... In his last race, at Hazel Park, 15-year-old **Bucket O' Suds** set the record for most starts by a Thoroughbred, 273. He raced every year of his career, which began when he was a three-year-old in 1968.

December 20, 1987...D. Wayne Lukas-trainee Tejano became the first juvenile millionaire when he won the Hollywood Futurity with Laffit Pincay Jr. aboard.

December 22, 1991...Jockey Kent Desormeaux, at age 21, won his 2,000th race aboard Saron Lake, trained by Gary Jones, at Hollywood Park. He was the youngest jockey to reach that mark and did so faster than any other rider.

December 25, 1934...Santa Anita Park opened in Arcadia, CA. The five-year-old mare Las Palmas won the inaugural race before a crowd of 30,777.

December 27, 1982...Michael Dickinson, then a steeple-chase trainer in England, saddled a record 12 winners in one day.

December 27, 1987...D. Wayne Lukas set a single-season record for stakes wins by a trainer, 92, when he saddled High Brite to win the Palos Verdes H. at Santa Anita Park.

December 31, 1966...Buckpasser won the 13th consecutive race of his three-year-old campaign, taking the Malibu S. at Santa Anita Park. He was voted Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old and handicap horse.

SMITH SCORES SEVEN STARS

Carol Smith from Chelmsford, Essex, England, celebrated her victory in the inaugural Godolphin Seven Stars competition yesterday. She wins the first prize of a white Rolls Royce Silver Seraph and a week-long luxury holiday for two in Dubai. The sensational competition, arguably the most high-profile of its kind, involved picking seven Godolphin racehorses who scored points for race performances throughout the season. The competition started with the G1 Dubai World Cup, the initial race in the Emirates World Series, and ended with the last race of that championship, yesterday's G1 Hong Kong Cup. Smith, whose selections were topped by Dubai Millennium (GB), an individual scorer of 80 points, said, "I tended to go for the sort of horses like Best Of The Bests (Ire) who were improving. Dubai Millennium was an obvious choice and I was lucky to choose Mutafaweg (USA). It was Noverre (USA) that really clinched it. But at the end of the day my choices have just been lucky." The illustrious second and third prizes included a silver Mercedes S Class 500; a holiday for two flying first class by Emirates, staving in the world's first seven-star hotel, the Burj Al Arab, and having VIP treatment for the US\$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba on Saturday, Mar. 24, 2001; as well as a 150-oz bar of 22-carat solid gold bullion.

WRITERS UP

A FANTASTIC SERIES?

Fantastic Light (USA) (Rahy {USA}) is the most unlikely of kings crowned in a year that includes such luminaries as Dubai Millennium (GB), Montjeu (Ire), Kalanisi (Ire), Sinndar (Ire) and Giant's Causeway (USA). There he was on Sunday at Sha Tin amidst the hysteria, a winner of the World Series, which included all of those mentioned above on its leader board, bar Sinndar. The immediate common thought was how did this come to pass? The inaugural series promoted a racehorse, in Daylami (Ire), whose superiority was unquestionable. He had performed against, and beaten soundly, the best that could be mustered in opposition in all his races in the championship.

In late July, Fantastic Light was nonchalantly swept aside by the effortless power of Montjeu in the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, a race in which Daylami was sensational in 1999. Even as recently as November, he found two too strong, including the winner T. M. Opera O (Jpn), in the G1 Japan Cup in Tokvo. Yet he was there in both events where it mattered, collecting points, and if it is consistency that wins the day in the Emirates World Series, then he is surely a worthy champion.

Godolphin's Racing Manager Simon Crisford certainly believed so. "The horse has held his form, he's held his condition," Crisford said. "He has had some very hard races including the Breeders' Cup and Japan Cup. We were a little bit concerned that it was one dance too many. This horse has run in five different continents this year and he really deserves to win the Emirates World Series."

The question remains whether that sentiment is shared by all. The Emirates World Series is designed as a showcase for racing's stars, and in its first try it hit the mark with a brilliant, dominating champion. The feeling is that, in a year as strong as 2000, racing secretly looked for a more obvious successor. The 'Iron Horse' Giant's Causeway now has to sit second to Fantastic Light in the Series' final standings, despite his status as 'horse of the year' in most lists (including the Cartier Awards), while Kalanisi, who had Fantastic Light behind him twice in 2000, is far adrift of his total.

The solution may be to weight the races that make up the Series, providing more points for those who fight out the Dubai World Cup, the Breeders' Cup Classic or 'King George'. These are arguably still the magnets that attract the best of the best; the peaks of the racing season and the events around which a whole year's preparation is based. This would be a way of making the whole Series concept reflect the true order of merit amongst our top racehorses.
