LUHUK TO GAINESWAY

Luhuk (Forty Niner--Royal Stance, by Dr. Fager), the leading freshman sire in Argentina for 2000, arrived at Gainesway in Lexington, Kentucky yesterday, where he will stand next season for a fee of \$10,000, live foal. The nine-year-old raced in Britain, where he won three of 10 starts, including a pair of Listed stakes. The chestnut was also second in the G3 Greenham S. and third in the G3 Rose of Lancaster S. The Kentucky-bred had six Group 1 performers from his first crop, led by Guernika (Arg), who captured the G1 Polla de Potrancas and G1 Gran Premio Consagracion de Potrancas and was third in the G1 Gran Premio Seleccion (Argentine Oaks); and three-time Group winner Theol (Arg). "Luhuk arrived in excellent health and condition," Michael Hernon, Gainesway's director of sales, said. "Sold at the 1992 Keeneland July Sale for \$500,000, he was the highest-priced yearling by Forty Niner that year." Luhuk is available for inspection.

The Maryland State Fair Grounds in Timonium may not be the first port of call for buyers looking for a potential Grade I winner, but Jan, Mace and Samantha Siegel must now be delighted that they made the journey last year. In a six-horse buying spree at Fasig-Tipton Midlantic's Eastern fall yearling sale, the Siegels paid \$315,000--the sale's highest price for a filly--for a daughter of Pleasant Tap. This filly, I Believe In You, made a memorable stakes debut when she inflicted the first defeat on Jetin Excess in no less a race that Sunday's GI Hollywood Starlet S.

This filly's success rounded off a rewarding year for Pleasant Tap, pushing the earnings of this Lane's End resident towards the \$3 million mark. In fact, the year has been so successful for this champion son of Pleasant Colony that his fee for 2001 has been set at \$25,000, double the price he commanded last spring.

With around 80 runners this year, Pleasant Tap has roughly only half the representatives of such as Rahy, Dynaformer, Carson City, Red Ransom, Gilded Time and Phone Trick. Yet he now has the very satisfactory total of nine stakes winners to his credit, with I Believe In You heading a list which also features Pleasant Breeze (GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H.), Tap To Music (GII Barbara Fritchie H.), Lager (two Grade III wins), Masada, Boss Ego and Buff.

Pleasant Tap has proved something of a slow burner and it is worth examining the way his stallion career has gone. He made his debut alongside his sire Pleasant Colony at his owner's Buckland Farm in 1993 with his fee set at only \$10,000. That rose to \$15,000 for the rest of his five-year stay at Buckland and even this higher price looked inexpensive for a horse of Pleasant Tap's pedigree and performance.

He had, after all, done well from two to five and his achievements included a third in the Kentucky Derby--a race won four years later by his three-parts brother Go For Gin. Pleasant Tap possessed enough speed to finish second in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at four and enough stamina to take second in the Breeders' Cup Classic at five, when his victories in the Suburban H. and Jockey Club Gold Cup helped him take the title of champion older male. Add to this a female line tracing to Black Helen and you have an attractive stallion prospect-especially when he is a big, handsome individual.

However, breeders didn't seem to see it that way. Large numbers were never the policy at Buckland, but Pleasant Tap merited more than the 42 mares he received in 1996 and the 37 he covered in 1997. Although his move to Lane's End didn't produce an instant resurgence--he covered 32 mares in 1998--Pleasant Tap has finally begun to receive his just rewards, with books of around 100 mares in the last two years.

I Believe In You's popularity as a yearling no doubt owed something to her successful female line. Her dam, I'll Get There, is a half-sister to Is Your Pleasure, winner of the GI Jerome H., and to the successful broodmare In Jubilation. The next dam I'm A Pleasure notched up two Grade I placings to earn a weight of 116 on the 1973 Experimental Free Handicap.

I'm A Pleasure in turn was one of four daughters of laround with an important winner to her credit. One of the others was Irule, dam of G1 Cheveley Park S. winner Sookera. Sookera kept up the family's good work, numbering the high-class performers So Factual, Bold Fact, Hawksley Hill and Dansili among her descendants.

Both Bold Fact and Dansili will commence stallion duties in Europe in February, and breeders have given a very warm welcome to Dansili, who produced such a spectacular stretch run in the Breeders' Cup Mile.

RECORD CONTRIBUTION FROM EBF

The British European Breeders' Fund contributed a record total of £520,000 in prize money during the 2000 Flat season and supported over 330 races. While the 2001 contribution figure will not be known until late February, it is likely to break the 2000 record. Each of the BEBF-backed contests had further Breeders' Prizes of up to 25 percent of added values, dependent on certain criteria. The BEBF, which sponsors at all of the country's 59 racecourses, distributed an additional £242,000 in Breeders' Prizes during the 2000 Flat season. Set up in 1983 as a counterpart to the American Breeders' Cup, the European Breeders' Fund (EBF) is a self-help organisation whose income is mainly derived from the average fee from all participating stallions, whose progeny are then able to compete in EBF races.

SOUTHWELL LOST IN THE FOG

The abandonment of Southwell's flat card yesterday proved that even all-weather fixtures are not safe at this time of year, as dense fog made the track unraceable. The eight-race card fell to the conditions at mid-day yesterday, and Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser said, "We are very disappointed to lose a valuable pre-Christmas meeting such as this. I was very hopeful before 11 a.m. but the fog just didn't lift in time. It was an easy decision in the end."

BEADMAN SIDELINED

Jockey Darren Beadman will be sidelined for a month after doctors diagnosed a blood clot on his liver following a fall at Randwick on Dec. 9. Beadman was thrown from his mount Pembleton (Aus) (Marauding {NZ}) after the horse appeared to resent being hit with the whip and bucked in the straight.

W.B. COX INQUIRY

The deferred inquiry into a seven-horse race fall in the G2 W. B. Cox S. at Perth's Ascot track on Saturday may focus on the role of early leader, 330-1 chance Bar Stormer (Aus) (Hideyoshi {USA}). Bar Stormer is yet to win in 11 attempts and his total earnings stand at A\$80, but he was among an 18-horse field in the Group 2 event and early reports indicate when he started to lose ground it precipitated the pile-up. Six riders were taken to hospital and one was treated at the track after the accident. Jockey Paul Harvey was released from hospital Sunday and aims to be back riding on Boxing Day for the WATC Derby meeting. Harvey's mount Dominance (NZ) fell at the 800m of the race, creating a chain reaction in which six others came down. Dominance was the only fatality in the accident with the other six horses crossing the line riderless.

CUMMINGS TO TRAIN PHAREIN

Flemington trainer David Hall confirmed that G1 Salinger S. winner Pharein (Aus) (Phar Feather {USA}) would leave his care and would be prepared by Bart Cummings. Hall prepared Pharein to win the Salinger S. as well as the G2 Emirates S. last spring; she has five wins from eight starts for \$493,200 in earnings. But after finishing fifth in the G1 Lightning S. last autumn, Pharein was sent back to the paddock and when she resumed in the G2 Schillaci S. in October, she incurred an automatic three-month ban for bleeding. "After she bled, I advised her owners to retire her and send her to stud; she had her fair share of problems and I think it would be tough for her to come back," Hall said.

NEW BARN FOR SKALATO

Skalato (Aus) (Semipalatinsk {USA}), who last month lost the Caulfield Guineas pending an appeal against a positive swab, will be prepared by Lee Freedman after the gelding's owners sacked trainer Clarry Conners. Skalato's owners, including prominent Australian political cartoonist Ron Tandberg, lost the \$489,500 first prize when Skalato was disqualified from the Caulfield Guineas win on Oct. 14 following a post-race positive urine test for Ketoprofen, a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory. Skalato has been nominated for the \$500,000 Cadbury Guineas at Flemington on Feb. 18 and will target the AJC Australian Derby at Randwick during the Easter carnival.

ROBINSON HEARING FRIDAY

Jockey Alan Robinson, who set a new national record of 207.5 winners for the season in 1998-99, will appear before the Thoroughbred Racing Board on Friday to show cause why his licence shouldn't be revoked after providing his hometown Newcastle newspaper with inflammatory quotes regarding racing stewards. He was quoted as saying, "I'll crunch a steward, I'll stand up and take one down. They are a bunch of uneducated idiots. They don't earn what I pay in taxes." He continued his tirade in Sydney newspapers, but his bravado vanished when Thoroughbred Racing Board chief steward Ray Murrihy advised him during a two-minute inquiry that stewards wouldn't hear the matter. Robinson was also reminded a condition of his licence was not to discuss matters pending inquiries-but despite appearing a little shaken, Robinson couldn't help himself and gave interviews immediately afterwards.
