EXTENDED MEET AT GULFSTREAM? Gulfstream Park has filed for an extended racing schedule in 2002, requesting to run Jan. 3-Apr. 20. The South Florida track will run 63 days, from Jan. 3 through Mar. 16, during its upcoming winter meeting. But next year, Frank Stronach's Magna Entertainment Inc. has thrown down the gauntlet by requesting 93 racing days, a schedule that would take dates away from Hialeah Park's meeting. Hialeah is expected to file for the same dates it has run for the past five years, Mar. 17 through May 23, for 2002, which would mean the two tracks' meets would overlap if both requests are granted. Under current rules, Gulfstream, Hialeah and the third track on the South Florida circuit, Calder Race Course, are not allowed to run head-to-head, but all laws covering Florida racing dates expire June 30, 2001.

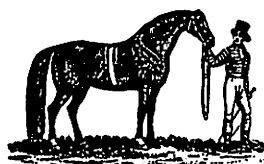

Adnaan was a winner of two of his five starts as a two-year-old, including the Listed Zetland S. at Newmarket. He also won one race at three and was third in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood. His career took something of a unique turn when he was sent to Dubai to work as exercise pacemaker for the recently retired Dubai Millennium (GB). The four-year-old chestnut was a Ir£900,000 yearling purchase at Goffs in Ireland and he will stand for FF10,000 Oct. 1st terms and live foal guarantee.

ZONDA WINS AGAIN

Zonda (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}), winner of the 1997 G1 New Zealand Derby, scored his first victory in nearly three years in Tuesday's G2 Sleepyhead King's Plate at Ellerslie. The six-year-old had been away from the races since March 1998 with various physical ailments, but in his second start back he showed his old acceleration and won easily by 2 1/4 lengths. "The win is a real team effort," admitted owner Kit Davidson. "Everybody involved has had to be patient but the welfare of the horse has always been put first." Trainer Roger James added, "He has come through the race in terrific order. He had a pick and a trot over a couple of laps this morning and looks tremendous." Zonda starts next in Tuesday's G1 Oaks Stud Classic at Ellerslie.

SUNLINE CLOSER TO HOME

Champion **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}) has completed the first part of her journey home from Hong Kong, where she won the G1 Hong Kong Mile on Dec. 17. The five-year-old mare arrived safely in Melbourne and is currently in the quarantine facilities at Sandown. She will spend the next two weeks there before traveling on to New Zealand.

WARNING DIES OF HEART FAILURE

Warning (GB) (Known Fact--Slightly Dangerous, by Roberto) died yesterday of acute heart failure at the Japan Bloodhorse Association's Shizunai Stud. The stallion, bred and raced by Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms, was 15 years old. The co-champion two-year-old in England in 1987, the dark bay was the winner of the G2 Richmond S. and the G2 Champagne S. in an undefeated four-race campaign. Warning added his first Group 1 success with a 1 1/2-length victory in the 1988 Sussex S. and was one-length second to Miesque in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois before defeating Salse by five lengths in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. He was 11th as the favorite in the Breeders' Cup Mile and was victorious in just one of four starts in 1989, taking the G2 Queen Anne S. by four lengths. Warning was retired to Banstead Manor Stud in 1990 with eight wins from 14 starts and earnings of \$937,280 and tasted immediate success as a stallion when his daughter Prophecy (Ire) won the G1 Cheveley Park Stud S. in 1993. He is the sire of 41 individual stakes winners to date, including champion sprinter Diktat (GB) and champion miler Charnwood Forest (Ire), but was sold in 1996 to the Japan Racing Association, who gave the horse to the Japan Bloodhorse Association. Out of the 1997 Kentucky Broodmare of the Year, Warning is a half brother to Irish and English champion and Epsom Derby winner Commander In Chief (GB) (Dancing Brave), multiple graded-stakes winner Dushyantor (Sadler's Wells), and Yashmak (Danzig), winner in the U.S. of the G1 Flower Bowl Invitational.

JERKENS REMAINS HOSPITALIZED

Hall Of Fame trainer Allen Jerkens remained in critical condition in a Hallandale, Florida, hospital yesterday, four days after collapsing at his home with severe stomach pains. The 71-year-old trainer has turned over his stable to younger son Jimmy Jerkens. Officials at Aventura Hospital near Gulfstream Park are neither confirming nor denying a story in today's *Daily Racing Form* which claims the nature of Jerkens' illness as pancreatitis, an inflammation of the pancreas. "The doctors are not sure how long it will be until he can go back to work, but it sounds like it's going to be quite a while" Jerkens' wife Elizabeth told the *Form*.

RECICLADA RETIRED

Diamond A Racing Corp's Reciclada (Chi) (Rictorious) suffered a sesamoid injury during a Christmas Eve workout and has been retired from racing. A Group 2 winner in her native Chile, the five-year-old was victorious in the Ben Walden Memorial S. at Del Mar in 1999 in her second American start, but came to hand for trainer Richard Mandella in 2000. The chestnut took the GIII Eatontown S. at Monmouth Park in August and three starts later dueled the length of the Churchill Downs stretch with Chilukki, only to finish a head behind that rival in the GII Churchill Downs Distaff. Reciclada made what would become the final start of her career a winning one, besting Country Hideaway by 1 1/4 lengths to win the GII Delta Top Flight H. Nov. 24. A half sister to Grade or Group I winners Mash One (Chi) (Mashkour) and Exhortada (Chi) (Cresta Rider); and Chilean Group 2 winner Gran Mujer (Chi) (Single Dawn), she retires with nine wins from 21 starts and earnings of \$364,502.
