FOUR OTHERS ATTEMPT TO BE LION TAMER

Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith's undefeated Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) will be a deserving odds-on favorite in Saturday's GI Hollywood Futurity as he faces four would-be upsetters. Trainer Rafael Becerra and owner Stan Fulton teamed up to finish fifth in last

year's Futurity with Roll Hennessy Roll. They return this year with a less experienced, but arguably more talented horse in the form of St Averil (Saint Ballado). Fulton, who has become a fixture at America's major yearling sales, forked over \$500,000 to acquire the handsome dark bay at the

2002 Fasig-Tipton July Yearling Sale. The colt made an immediate return on that investment, clocking a swift 1:15 3/5 in taking a 6 1/2-furlong maiden at Santa Anita by three lengths Nov. 9. Like the favorite, St Averil must prove he can handle a distance of ground, but he has license to do so on pedigree. He is a son of Avie's Fancy (Lord Avie), a winner in 10 of her 21 career starts, including a pair of graded stakes on the grass, for earnings in excess of \$400,000. St Averil completed his preparations for the Futurity with a sharp five-eighths breeze over the local main in :59 1/5 last Sunday, accomplished in company with stablemate Rahy Dolly, a candidate for Sunday's GI Hollywood Starlet S. The field is completed by two-time winner Saint Afleet (Northern Afleet), Breeders' Cup Juvenile also-ran That's An Outrage (Quiet American) and recent maiden winner Quiet Cash (Real Quiet).

SPRINT WINNER TO STAY PUT

Breeders' Cup Sprint winner Cajun Beat (Grand Slam) will make his next start in the Jan. 3. GIII Mr. Prospector H. at Gulfstream Park, bypassing the GI Malibu S. at Santa Anita Dec. 26. Trainer Steve Margolis, who trains the three-year-old for Satish Sanan and Joe and John Iracane, told Daily Racing Form that he could not secure satisfactory travel arrangements from his base in Florida

to California. "There was no easy way to get him out there," Margolis told the Form, adding that the trip would have included a six-hour layover in Dallas. "It would be a hard ship on a cargo flight. We didn't think it was in the best interest of the horse." Despite

the absence of Cajun Beat, the Malibu is expected to attract a star-studded field, including Posse (Silver Deputy), fourth in the Breeders' Cup Sprint and winner most recently of the Thanksgiving H. at the Fair Grounds; Midas Eyes (Touch Gold), runner-up to Congaree in the GI Cigar Mile in his latest effort Nov. 29; and GI Santa Anita Derby winner Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo), who would be making his first start since finishing sixth in the Kentucky Derby.

NJSEA Exploring Long-Term Lease of Tracks:

The New Jersey Sports and Exhibition Authority (NJSEA) has voted to authorize its president, George Zoffinger, to issue a statement seeking proposals for the possible long-term lease of Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands. The investment firm Lehman Brothers will serve as advisor to the NJSEA on the matter. "No decision has been made to lease either racetrack," Zoffinger commented. "Today's decision was simply to explore the marketplace. After considerable study, Lehman Brothers advised us that our racing assets have substantial value and that there is likely to be strong interest by qualified parties in the private sector." He added, "We concluded that it is our duty to solicit interested parties, review their plans and decide whether it is in the best interests of the state, the racing industries, the local communities and the work force to transfer racing operations to another party." Officials at the NJSEA are quick to note that this is not a solicitation to sell the properties. "If a transaction is ever to take place, it will be a lease and not a sale," said Carl Goldberg, chairman of the NJSEA. "With a lease, the NJSEA will be able to build in protections as to how the facilities may be used, how the surrounding property is to be protected and other considerations that are important to the various stakeholders."

Funny Cide Fires Bullet at Palm Meadows:

Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. winner Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) continued to thrive in the Florida sunshine yesterday, working a bullet five furlongs in 1:00 1/5 yesterday morning beneath exercise rider Robin Smullen. "He just loves it up here and so do I," trainer Barclay Tagg says in Friday's Daily Racing Form. The conditioner indicated that the near-range goal for the soon-to-be four-year-old remains the GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 7, but "I'd like to get one race into him before then," Tagg told the Form. He indicated that he has ruled out a start in the GIII Hal's Hope H. on opening weekend in Hallandale and also told the Form that he would not run Funny Cide if the weather became too hot. The chestnut gelding has not raced since finishing ninth in the Breeders' Cup Classic Oct. 25. (East Report cont. p2)

"While the focus is always on the three-year-olds, Keeneland's spring meeting provides stakes opportunities for all divisions, both on the main track and the turf," said Director of Racing Rogers Beasley. A 50-percent interest in recent Fair Grounds maiden winner Cartoonist (Comic Strip) has been sold by Kent Foster of Dallas to Barry Irwin and Jeff Siegel's Team Valor. A purchase price was not disclosed. A threeparts brother to the excellent turf mare Voodoo Dancer, the dark bay colt will be transferred to trainer Ralph Nicks at Oaklawn Park. Nicks, a former assistant to Bill Mott, was announced in November as the private trainer to Team Valor. "We will not race Cartoonist until Keeneland in the spring," Team Valor President Irwin said yesterday. "We will let him relax a bit, then build him up for an early start at Keeneland and hopefully have him ready for the three-year-old grass stakes on Derby Day at Churchill Downs." Sixth in his Oct. 19 debut sprinting over the Keeneland main track, Cartoonist handled the switch to grass and two turns with aplomb, winning by two lengths Dec. 11.

DE ROTHSCHILD NEW FRANCE-GALOP PRESIDENT

Edouard de Rothschild has been elected the new president of France-Galop by the French authority's 50 committee members. He was running against Charles-Henri de Moussac and polled 28 votes compared to his opponent's 22. De Rothschild takes over the permanent role of the late Jean-Luc Lagardere, who passed away in March this year, and that of interim incumbent Serge Landon. Following a proposal by the new president, Robert Fournier-Sarloveze is the new vice-president responsible for flat racing, while a similar role has been afforded Nicolas Landon for jumps racing. The son of Baron Guy de Rothschild, Edouard belongs to one of the most prestigious dynasties in both the financial and bloodstock worlds. Born in December 1957, de Rothschild studied law and also gained an MBA at New York University. He has been a partner of the Rothschilds Bank since 1987. A racehorse owner since 1985, he gained his first Group 1 win courtesy of the Jean-Marie Beguigne-trained Oczy Czarnie, a FF640,000 Deauville yearling purchase, in the 1988 renewal of the Prix de la Salamandre. He also owns a broodmare band of approximately 15 mares and enjoyed his best year on the track in 2000 when he owned five group race winners, including G1 Prix Ganay victor Indian Danehill (Ire).
