Following a poor showing in the G1 Japan Cup in late November, The Thoroughbred Corporation's **Johar** (Gone West) will be "getting a rest," according to trainer Richard Mandella. The GI Breeders' Cup Turf dead-heat winner failed to fire over a rain-soaked Tokyo Race Course sod that Mandella termed "a bog," finishing 16th of 18 runners. Of future plans, Hall of Famer Mandella said, "He'll run later in the spring some time and probably be pointed to the Jim Murray and the [GI, Charles] Whittingham H. at Hollywood."

Half to Flander Debuts Today:

A half brother to **Flanders** (Seeking the Gold), who was named two-year-old filly champion after winning the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 1994, makes his debut today in the first race at Santa Anita. JUDDMONTE AGAIN LEADS FRENCH OWNERS

Prince Khalid Abdullah's Juddmonte Farms captured France's leading owner title for the second year in a row after a suspense-filled contest that saw the contest go down to the year's final day of racing. Juddmonte held the lead in the standings before the Aga Khan forged ahead when his homebred Dalakhani won the Arc. Juddmonte closed the gap with wins by American Post in the G1 Gran Criterium, Weightless in the G2 Prix Dollar and Moon Search in the G2 Prix de Royallieu. The month of October proved a successful one for the Juddmonte colours with a success by Etoile Montante in the G1 Prix de la Forêt and Apsis's victory in the G3 Prix Thomas Byron. By mid-December Prince Khalid's lead was €30,000, but the Aga Khan stable started to roll again and by Dec. 20, on the eve of the last two days of flat racing at Deauville, the Aga Khan was back in the lead by a mere €215. On Monday at Deauville, Prince Khalid's last runner of the year, the three-yearold filly Real Trust was the heavy 5-10 favourite in the Prix de Rabodanges. In an event restricted to jockeys and apprentices who had not won 15 races in 2003, Bruno Marchand was aboard the fancied filly. Opening four lengths soon after the break, Real Trust turned for home six in front. Still four in front one out, her rider dropped his hands only to see the fast-finishing Solo Tango come by 75 yards from home. Real Trust had to settle for second and her rider was suspended eight days, but Prince Khalid was again in front by €2,585. Tuesday's card at Deauville was France's last day of flat racing for the year and it provided the Aga Khan with two chances to secure the owner's title. With a third-place finish in the first race, the Aga Khan needed only a fifth-place effort from one of a pair of runners in the fourth race, but neither could threaten.

With an €185 lead, the smallest in French racing history, Prince Khalid Abdullah retained the title he gained for the first time last year. His horses amassed €2,488,840. Juddmonte was also the winningest owner of group races with 12 wins (four Group 1s, five Group 2s and three Group 3s), ahead of the Wildenstein stable (two Group 1s, five Group 2s, three Group 3s) and the Aga Khan (three Group 1s, three Group 2s). Juddmonte's 2003 French Group 1 winners are: Nebraska Tornado (Storm Cat) (Prix de Diane and Prix du Moulin de Longchamp), Etoile Montante (Miswaki) (Prix de la Forêt) and American Post (GB) (Bering {GB}) (Grand Critérium Jean-Luc Lagardère.

Alan Li Fook Sum, who was part-owner of top runners Sagace (Fr) and Strawberry Road (Aus) and was a former chairman of the Hong Kong Jockey Club, died Tuesday from an apparent heart attack. He was 66 years old. A near 40-year veteran of the Club, Li was elected a Steward in 1987 before ascending to the role of chairman in 1998. During his four years in that position, purse money for the Hong Kong International Races more than doubled from HK\$20 million in 1998 to HK\$54 million in 2002. An accomplished owner, Li's red, green and black colors were most prominently carried in Hong Kong by Giglit (Fr), who set a track record in winning the 1984 Stewards Cup. He also maintained racing and breeding interests overseas, particularly in France, where he was the part owner of 1984 G1 Arc de Triomphe winner Sagace (Fr) as well as Strawberry Road (Aus), the 1983 Australian Horse of the Year who went on to campaign successfully in Europe and the United States. "Alan Li loved his racing," commented current HKJC Chairman Ronald Arculli. "His contribution to racing was immeasurable. Not only did he put Hong Kong on the world map of Thoroughbred racing, but he was also held in high esteem throughout the world. As a good and old friend, I will miss him and his guidance very much."
