A NEW YEAR FOR OLMODAVOR?

The newly turned five-year-old **Olmodavor** (A.P. Indy), who will make just his 10th career start, could use today's GII San Pasqual H. at Santa Anita as a spring-

board towards challenging for divisional honors. Runner-up last winter in consecutive starts to Medaglia d'Oro and Mineshaft, the Wertheimer homebred was sidelined with ankle trouble for seven months, but proved a determined winner of the GIII Native Diver H. at Hollywood Dec. 6, running down the game Nose the Trade (GB) (Cyrano de Bergerac {GB}) in his second start off a layoff. "He's not easy to keep sound," explained trainer Richard Mandella. "He's had

his troubles through the years, but when he's there he's good, and he's good right now." Star Cross (Arg) (Southern Halo) was a close third--beaten 1 3/4 lengths--in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. Oct. 4, finishing behind Pleasantly Perfect and Fleetstreet Dancer, who went on to capture the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and the G1-Jpn Japan Cup Dirt, respectively. The chestnut bounced off his Goodwood effort with a non-threatening 10th in the Seabiscuit H. Oct. 25, but rebounded to take Golden Gate's Forty Niner H. Nov. 28. The dark horse in the race has appropriately drawn the outside: Sharp Breeze (Mr. Prospector). This \$1.9 KEEJUL yearling, now a gelding, makes his U.S. debut after a pair of all-weather track victories in England.

FUNNY CIDE SHARPENING UP Sackatoga Stable's dual Classic winner Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) continued to edge closer to a return to the races, working a brilliant six furlongs Thursday morning in 1:11 1/5 at the Palm Meadows training center. "He came out of the work very well," trainer Barclay Tagg commented. "Ideally, I might have liked him to go a little slower early, but he did it very easily. I am tickled with the way he's doing down here." Tagg has singled out the GI Donn H. on Feb. 7 as a target for the four-year-old gelding, but is unsure whether he will train Funny Cide up to the nine-furlong event, or try to get a prep race into him before that. "I'm not sure that I have him fit enough to run yet," the conditioner admitted. "Doing it against the competition is much different from doing it in the morning. I am not going to be pressured into running him. He's not a three-year-old anymore, so I don't have to make those races. If it's too hot, I'm not going to run him; if it's too hot, I'm not going to work him." Funny Cide is likely to have another workout at Palm Meadows this coming Wednesday.

Equibase Releases Year-End Stats:

The 2003 races for top owner, trainer and jockey by North American earnings were all runaways. According to the final figures released by Equibase, Bobby Frankel led all trainers with a record \$19,143,289 in purses, besting runner-up Todd Pletcher by \$6,786,365. Only seven trainers, including Frankel and Pletcher, earned more than the amount of money that separated the top two in 2003. Jerry Bailey established a new earnings mark for the third straight year, topping the jockeys' list with \$23,354,960 in earnings. Edgar Prado was second with \$18,475,582 in purses. Michael Gill led all owners at \$9,236,530, followed by Stronach Stable at \$7,289,114.
