DRAGON FLIES TO APPLETON WIN

Millennium Dragon (GB) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) and jockey Richard Migliore took advantage of a paceless race to score a front-running victory in yesterday's GIII Appleton H. at Gulfstream Park. On the board in five of his seven U.S. starts last season, Millennium Dragon was third in the GII Knickerbocker H. at Agueduct in



November and ended his 2003 campaign with a runner-up finish in Calder's GIII Tropical Turf H. Dec. 6. The five-year-old bay went right to the lead yesterday, cutting out fractions of :24.19, :49 and 1:11.88 before turning back a stiff challenge from **Political Attack** (Hawk Attack) at midstretch en route to a

1 1/4-length victory. "This worked out well because there wasn't much pace in the race so we knew we could let Richie do what he wanted out there," said winning trainer Kiaran McLaughlin. "He seems to be better on the lead. Things work out better for him when he can have things his own way." Migliore added, "I had a lot of horse under me. He's gotten so I can relax him pretty well on the lead. At about the three-eighths pole, I let him out a notch and he stormed home pretty much on his own from there." McLaughlin said the Jan. 31 GIII Canadian Turf H. could be next for Millennium Dragon, but added, "We're not in any hurry. He's a big heavy horse and he can handle his races well. A mile hits him right between the eyes, so he's best between a mile and a mile and an eighth." Favored Proud Man (Manlove) raced just off the pace, was forced to steady turning for home and was in tight in upper stretch but finished well to be third. Click for the brisnet.com chart. AN IMPRESSIVE ADVENTURE

A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy) was making only the second start of her career in yesterday's GIII Santa Ysabel S., but the imposing bay filly overcame her inexperience and spurted clear down the lane for a 3 1/2-length victory at Santa Anita. A.P. Adventure, trained by Wally Dollase, scored an impressive fivelength win in her debut racing one mile at Santa Anita Oct. 30 and she was the 4-5 favorite to go two-for-two yesterday. After breaking slowly and getting squeezed back, the filly stalked the pace while racing three wide. She rallied four wide into the lane and reeled in pacesetting Salty Romance (Salt Lake) to win going away. "We had a rough start leaving the gate, she got squeezed really hard leaving the gate," explained winning rider Alex Solis. "After that I just took my time on her. At the half-mile pole she was running easy and I realized I had a chance of catching [Salty Romance]. This filly has so much untapped class and ability that she just ran the other filly down in the stretch." Cont. p. 2

FALBRAV SHUTTLES TO ARROWFIELD IN 2004

Falbrav (Ire) (Fairy King--Gift of the Night, by Slewpy) will shuttle to Arrowfield Stud in New South Wales, Australia for the 2004 Southern Hemisphere breeding season. A stud fee for the 2003 European Champion Older Male has not been announced. The five-year-old was recently retired to owner Teruya Yoshida's Shadai Stallion Station in Hokkaido, Japan following an impressive win in the G1 Hong Kong Cup at Sha Tin Dec. 14. "In our view, Falbrav is the most desirable stallion prospect in the entire world this year, and I am very grateful to Teruya Yoshida and Shadai Farm for entrusting him to Arrowfield in the southern hemisphere," commented Arrowfield's John Messara. Falbrav is a winner of eight Group 1 races over the course of four seasons on the track, including the Eclipse S., Prix d'Ispahan, Japan Cup and Gran Premio di Milano. The Irish-bred, who won 13 of 26 lifetime starts, retired with career earnings of A\$9,422,828.

"At the top of the stretch I was concerned," trainer Wally Dollase admitted after A.P Adventure's win in yesterday's GIII Santa Ysabel S. "I thought, 'This is the filly I'm so high on and she's sitting there waiting on horses.' Then all of a sudden a bolt of lightning took place and she took off like a rocket." Of his filly's slow start, Dollase said, "I could probably give her a little more experience around the gate but she's such a lackadaisical easy-going heifer. She's got composure that's out of this world. She probably fell asleep in the gate." Dollase said the Feb. 15 GI Las Virgenes S. and a match-up with Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies champ Halfbridled would likely be next for A.P. Adventure. **Click for the <u>brisnet.com chart</u>. THIS WEEK IN RACING HISTORY...

January 4, 1946...Jockey **George Woolf**, known as "The Iceman" for his coolness in the saddle, died the day after a spill at Santa Anita. He was 35. Since 1950, the George Woolf Memorial Jockey Award has been presented annually to a rider who demonstrates high standards of personal and professional conduct, on and off the racetrack.

January 5, 1980...Spectacular Bid began his undefeated four-year-old season, winning the Malibu S. by five lengths at Santa Anita; the gray colt finished his 1980 campaign with a perfect nine-for-nine record.

January 7, 1916...Pan Zareta, who would go on to win 76 races, makes her Fair Grounds debut, winning a six-furlong sprint under 124 pounds.


