STRONG START FOR MAGIC MILLIONS

Magic Millions began on a decidedly strong note Thursday as domestic purchasers competed determinedly against a strong international contingent, helping to boost the session average to A\$114,264 from last year's A\$91,000. Trainer Gai Waterhouse struck early with a decisive A\$650,000 winning bid for lot 57, a Danehill--Sommes Sound (Assert {Ire}) colt offered by Stratheden Stud: Waterhouse also gave A\$300,000 for the colt's full brother at Easter 2003. She trained the pair's half siblings, Assertive Lad (Aus) and Assertive Lass (Aus), to Group 1 success. "This colt had enormous presence," said Waterhouse. "The sale is extremely competitive and it is only going to get stronger." Redoute's Choice (Aus) (Danehill) averaged around A\$160,000 with Magic Millions race favorite Not a Single Doubt (Aus) proving a capable advertisement for the young sire. Hong Kong Jockey Club gave A\$240,000 for lot 89, a Redoute's Choice--Suburban

Blues (Aus) colt. Not a Single Doubt also featured as a 3/4brother to the session's toppriced filly by Flying Spur (Aus). Produced by Singles Bar (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}), a half sister to Snippets (Aus), lot 40 was consigned by Arrowfield Stud as agent and was purchased by Graeme Rogerson for A\$450,000. The striking chestnut is also a half to Nat-

ural Is My Name (Aus) (Naturalism {NZ}), multiple stakes placed in Australia, and to Hanky Panky (Aus) (Anabaa), who was second in the G2 Magic Night S.

Big Score...

Perhaps the biggest surprise was lot 181, a colt by Guineas winner Pins (Aus) (Snippets {Aus}) who fetched an remarkable A\$260,000 when knocked down to trainer Bart Cummings. The purchase underscored the emphasis on type that permeates the current market. Pins stood at NZ\$9,000 in 2001 and his first crop averaged A\$52,662. Magic Millions cont. p2

VALLEYS STRIPPED OF MIDDLE PARK

As expected, Juddmonte Farms' Three Valleys (Diesis (GB) has been officially disqualified from first place in the Oct. 3 G1 Middle Park S. after testing positive for the prohibited substance clenbuterol; Sanford Robertson's Balmont (Stravinsky) has been awarded the contest. Conditioner Roger Charlton has stated that the substance was administered as the trade drug Ventipulmin in order to combat a lung infection the colt picked up when finishing third in the G1 Phoenix S. in July. However, he maintains that Three Valleys was withdrawn from the drug nine days before the Middle Park, two and a half days before the recommended period. Charlton was also found in breach of Rule 53 and fined £600 at the hearing. "It is a difficult balancing act to keep your horse on the treatment for as long as possible and as close as possible to the race without breaching the rules," commented the Jockey Club's veterinary director Peter Webbon. The promotion of Balmont, a son of the Seattle Slew mare Aldebaran Light, provides leading freshman sire Stravinsky with his first Group 1 winner, and the £105,560 winner's prizemoney bolsters the young stallion's earnings. Holborn (UAE) (Green Desert) second was moved up to second in the six-furlong contest, while Auditorium (GB) (Royal Applause {GB}) was placed third.

Bidding was fierce for the right individuals, but conditions required that all buyers maintain their determination. "The sale is great for breeders, and nice horses are recording fantastic results, but it is bloody hard to be competitive," said leading Australian agent Mark Pilkington, a theme echoed throughout the day by many would-be purchasers. However, stifling heat in the antiquated barns and the lack of ventilation drove many purchasers away from the sale complex, with a large contingent of Japanese buyers calling it quits early in the day, along with a Korean group. "Who is the marketing genius who decided to assemble the most prominent buyers in Australia and people from throughout the world and put us all in unbearable heat, and expect us to spend hundreds of thousands of dollars on horses," quipped a leading Australian trainer. And for many buyers, the call for Magic Millions to cease focusing on all the associated social events and provide service to purchasers was strident, while some vendors threatened to boycott the sale unless the complex was improved.

FUNNY CIDE RETURNS SATURDAY Kentucky Derby hero Funny Cide (Distorted Humor), an Eclipse finalist for champion three-year-old, will make his fouryear-old debut at Gulfstream Saturday in the 10th race, a seven-furlong, \$100,000 optional claimer/allowance. The New York-bred will break from post three with regular rider Jose Santos in the irons. "I'm looking forward to it," said Santos. "I was on him when he worked New Year's Day [6f in 1:11 2/5], and I could tell right away that he had matured, that he's bigger and stronger than he was last year. He was very strong and he was feeling very good." The chestnut has been training very smartly for his return to action, but trainer Barclay Tagg cautioned that there are bigger goals ahead for the gelding. "He's been doing really good," said Tagg, "but the target remains the Donn H. [9f, Feb. 7]." Six other runners have been entered in the race, including graded stakes winner New York Hero (Partner's Hero).

GISW BONAPAW RETIRED Grade I winner Bonapaw (Sabona--Pawlova, by Nijinsky II) has been retired from racing, according to Daily Racing Form yesterday. "He's got arthritis and he must have developed a breathing problem," said owner Dennis Richard, explaining the reason for the gelding's retirement, told the DRF. Winner of the GIII Count Fleet Sprint H. in 2001 and the GIII Hanshin Cup H. one year later, the Norman Miller III trainee recorded his biggest win later that fall when he defeated leading sprinter Aldebaran in the seven-furlong GI Vosburgh H. at Belmont Park. Bonapaw scored in only one race in 10 starts this term, a 6 1/2-furlong allowance at Keeneland Oct. 10, although the \$6,500 KEESEP yearling purchase finished in the money in a pair of graded stakes, the GIII Whirlaway S. at Fair Grounds Feb. 9 and GIII Texas Mile at Lone Star Apr. 26. Bonapaw closed out his career with a seventh-place finish in an \$80,000 optional claiming event at Fair Grounds Dec. 12. The eight-yearold retires with 18 wins from 45 career starts and \$1,158,752 in earnings.

Frisky Spider Eyes Hutcheson:

Frisky Spider (Frisk Me Now), who remained unbeaten in two career starts with a Gulfstream allowance win Wednesday, may make his next start in the Feb. 14 GII Hutcheson S., a race won in 1997 by his multiple graded stakes winning sire. "He's smart like his sire and seems like a really intelligent horse for his age," trainer Bob Durso, who also conditioned Frisk Me Now, said of his promising three-year-old. "He also seems a little bigger than his dad already, but he's got a great attitude." Frisky Spider won his 5 1/2-furlong debut at the Meadowlands Oct. 28 before his half-length triumph over seven furlongs Wednesday. Durso reported he has had at least five different offers for the colt. "I'm not saying he's not for sale," Durso commented. "They've been calling me since he won his first race. No matter what happens, we know he's going to do a lot for his father's stud value." Durso did not rule out a possible start in the GII Fountain of Youth for Frisky Spider, who is owned by Carol Dender. That 1 1/16-miles race is the same day as the seven-furlong Hutcheson.

QUINN GIVES UP CECIL RETAINER

Richard Quinn has decided not to accept a retainer to ride for Henry Cecil for the coming flat season, the Racing Post revealed yesterday. Having partnered only 16 winners for the Newmarket-based conditioner last year, Quinn cited the journey from his Newbury home to Newmarket as the main reason for the move. Cecil is currently on holiday and will make a decision regarding riding arrangements when he returns.
