Nov. 15, was back in the winner's circle at Gulfstream Park yesterday afternoon. Sent off the 8-5 favorite in the GIII Spectacular Bid S., the bald-faced chestnut closed from off pace to win it by 1 1/4 lengths over Saratoga Wynn Dot Comma Equi-Photo County (Valid Expectations).

"The pace was setting up nicely," jockey Joe Bravo said. "I knew the others were kind of rambling along because I broke a length and a half in front of them and was able to let them go. [Trainer Martin Wolfson] told me this horse could lay back or he could go to the front and that gave me the confidence to know I would be there when the picture was taken."

MEGAHERTZ SPURTS TO SANTA ANITA SCORE

Last of four early, Megahertz (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) flew through a final furlong in a tick over :11 to take yesterday's GII San Gorgonio H. at Santa Anita by a length over front-running Garden in the Rain (Fr) (Dolphin Street (Fr)). The five-year-old mare had just missed in the race last year, finishing second by 3/4 of a length to stablemate Tates Creek. The 3-5 chalk to make amends this time, she trailed the compact field as Garden in the Rain lazed through splits of :25.51, :51.08 and 1:14.79, but turned on the afterburners in the stretch to win going away. "This is a real good filly--she ranks up there with any of them," said trainer Bobby Frankel, who was recording his seventh win in the San Gorgonio and his 100th Santa Anita stakes win overall. He added, "A snail's pace in a small field doesn't hurt her because she can outfinish them...she's got a better turn of foot than most horses." San Gorgonio cont. p2

The \$350,000 KEESEP yearling dogged Excessivepleasure (In Excess {Ire}) through the early fractions and looked ready to take over at the top of the stretch, but 9-1 chance Touch of the Wire (Birdonthewire) got the jump on him, driving through along the rail to grab the advantage. The eyecatching colt romped home a 6 3/4-length winner despite racing greenly as the 17-10 favorite, drawing the attention of owner Martin Cherry, and made his next start carrying new colors. Wynn Dot Comma won his first three starts for Cherry, taking an entry-level allowance at Calder July 27 and adding daylight stakes wins at that track Aug. 30 and Oct. 11. He suffered his first loss in the Jack Price, but bounced back here as the crowd's choice. Reserved off fractions of:22.47 and:45.97, the Florida-bred rallied wide down the lane to win going away. As for what's next, Martin Wolfson said he may skip the Feb. 14 GII Hutcheson S. "What I'd really like to do is run him in the Gotham [Mar. 20, Aqueduct] and see how he does in a one-turn mile," Wolfson said. Skipaslew was haltered out of a third-place finish in a \$50,000 maiden claimer at Hollywood July 9 and has proved to be a solid claim. He earned his first win in his next start versus \$62,500 maiden claimers at Del Mar Aug. 11, then ran fourth in the Bea Brummel S. at Fairplex Sept. 16. Returning nine days later, he captured the Gateway To Glory S. at Fairplex before placing third in the Bay Meadows Juvenile S. Oct. 19. 

Gai Waterhouse, who saddled Dance Hero (Aus) (Danzero {Aus}) to victory in vesterday's A\$1 million Magic Millions Classic at the Gold Coast, has spent A\$2.4 million on 12 yearlings thus far. The fourth and final session of the MM Select Sale will be held today, with bidding beginning at 11 a.m. The fifth session sale is set for Tuesday. "There are still plenty of bargains to be had," Chester said. "We have some cracking yearlings catalogued [today] and hopefully we can beat some long-standing records."

FUNNY CIDE SHARP IN RETURN Funny Cide (Distorted Humor), a finalist for the Eclipse Award as top three-year-old of 2003 after winning the GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness, made his four-year-old debut at Gulfstream Park yesterday afternoon and looked

better than ever. Sent off the 2-5 favorite in the 10th race, a \$46,000 allowance test at seven furlongs, the chestnut gelding was on the bit as he chased the pace from the inside. He pulled his way to the front after a half in :45.78 and left his four rivals in his wake as he cruised to a popular five-length triumph. "He

felt very strong today," jockey Jose Santos said. "I was thinking to stalk the pace a little, but he was dragging me. I hit him a little, just once inside the sixteenth pole so he would finish strong, but he galloped out a little too much. The pony boy had to pick me up or else I go around again, and had to bring me back also, because I couldn't hold him." Funny Cide is slated to make his next start in the GI Donn H. Feb. 7.

BITTER COLD WIPES OUT LIVE RACING The frigid temperatures gripping the Northeast portion of the country forced the cancellation of live racing at Aqueduct, Philadelphia Park and Laurel Park yesterday. Aqueduct's featured GIII Affectionately H. will be reopened to original nominations and will be run next Saturday, Jan. 17. Officials at the Maryland Jockey Club were forced to cancel racing when the Laurel Park jockeys refused to ride due to the weather. No decision has been made regarding the rescheduling of the \$75,000 Native Dancer S. Temperatures in the region are expected to moderate today.

It had been a long time between winner's circle pictures for the dual Classic winner, but Funny Cide has not forgotten how to pose. The striking chestnut made a resounding return to the races yesterday, winning his prep for the Donn H. with consummate ease. Following a career-best performance in the Preakness, the New York-bred was third to Empire Maker in the Belmont in June then finished a dull third in the GI Haskell Invitational H. two months later. After much deliberation, Funny Cide was shipped to California for the Breeders' Cup Classic, but never factored, beating just one horse home. The gelding had adapted well to his surroundings at Palm Meadows, showing a series of fast works, and was the heavy chalk to kick off the year on a high note. Very eager beneath Jose Santos, Funny Cide tugged his way along early, began to open up on the far turn and kicked smoothly clear in the stretch. "It was just right, it was just what I wanted," said winning trainer Barclay Tagg. "He needed a confidence builder and this sevenfurlong race was perfect. It helped get him fit without knocking him out. That's why I wanted him to go seven furlongs--because he was so fresh."
