SWISS LAKE TOPS DAY 3 AT KEENELAND

Stakes winning **Swiss Lake**, by Indian Ridge (Ire) out of the Petong (GB) mare Blue Iris (GB), realized the top price of \$500,000 at Wednesday's third session of the Keeneland January Horse of All Ages Sale in Lexington.

Consigned by Hopewell Farm, the five-year-old was purchased by Kern/Lillingston Association. "She'll go to Europe," said British bloodstock agent Lincoln Collins, who was sitting alongside the mare's buyer, Luke Lillingston. "She had very high-class speed and she'll be bred to high-class fast horses. It was plenty of money, but our experience, having been the underbidder on [Opera Aida], is that if you want the quality, you have to pay up for it.

The gentleman who we bought her for....she was bought as a long-term proposition. He is to some degree commercial, but he's looking to breed a good horse." Swiss Lake, who was purchased for \$320,000 at the 2000 Keeneland July sale before being sent to England, won the Listed St. Hughes S. and placed in the G2 Flying Childers S. for trainer Gerard Butler. Later sent to the United States, where she was trained Kristin Mulhall, Swiss Lake finished second in the Daisycutter H. at Del Mar and was again runner-up against males in the Green Flash H. at the same track Aug. 20. Swiss Lake's dam, Blue Iris, was sold carrying a foal by Elusive Quality for \$600,000 at the Keeneland November Sale. (*Keeneland report cont p2*)

Hill 'n' Dale Consigns Keeneland January Sales Topper

Hip #393, **BECKYS SHIRT**, dam of Breeders' Cup winner **Cajun Beat (G1)**, sells for **\$850,000**.

Banner Day for Thoroughbred Corp. and Hopewell...

Hopewell Farm, representing The Thoroughbred Corporation, rounded out the day with the top three lots on the day, including hip 997, **Opera Aida (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). The mare was purchased for \$425,000 by Anthony Stroud Bloodstock, who was acting on behalf of a relative newcomer to the game in David Dobson, the owner of North Cliff Farm in Virginia. Opera Aida is a daughter of State Crystal (Ire) (High Estate {Ire}), winner of the G3 Lancashire Oaks and third in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and G1 Prix Vermeille at three. "I didn't actually think [the price] was going to be as strong as it was, to be perfectly honest with you," said Stroud. "We were fully extended. She has a wonderful pedigree." Bought as a yearling by The Thoroughbred Corp. for 280,000 guineas at the 2000 Tattersalls Houghton Sale, Opera Aida was off the board in her lone career start, a Hollywood turf maiden last June. Stroud is intimately familiar with this family; in addition to acquiring this mare, he also purchased a full sister named True Crystal (Ire) for 675,000 guineas as a three-year-old at the 2000 Tattersalls December Sale. The sale's final session begins today at 10:00 a.m.

AVANZADO TO STAND AT HARRIS FARMS Top sprinter **Avanzado (Arg)** (Luhuk--Avian Eden, by Storm Bird) will enter stud this season at Harris Farms in Coalinga, California for a fee of \$6,000, live foal. Winner of the GI Ancient Title Breeders' Cup H. last fall, the grandson of Forty Niner was recently retired after sustaining a splint bone injury. The chestnut, a Group 3 winner and multiple Group 1-placed in his native Argentina, was the runner-up in the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen last March. From the first crop by Strategic Mission (Mr. Prospector), a graded-stakes winning half brother to Sultry Song, this Feb. 6 foal is kin to Gimmeawink (Elusive Quality), who took his lifetime earnings to over a half million dollars with a half-length victory in the Sophomore Sprint Championship S. at Mountaineer Park Nov. 25. It was his sixth stakes score of the year.

Seattle Joke sold for \$310,000 carrying a foal by Seeking the Gold at the 2001 Keeneland November sale, which went on to make \$280,000 at last year's Keeneland September sale. She has a yearling of 2004 by Jade Hunter and was bred back to the son of Mr. Prospector, but is believed to be not pregnant.

This mare has one of the better and more timely updates in the catalogue, due to the recent exploits of her three-parts sister A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy). Ten Times the Fun...

A yearling colt from the first crop of GI Hollywood Derby winner Brahms (Danzig) brought a final bid of \$125,000, the highest price for a yearling, during yesterday's third session at Keeneland. The price represents a multiple of 10 times his 2002 stud fee. Anthony Martin signed the ticket on hip 895 on behalf of an unnamed client, who has not yet decided whether to keep the dark bay colt or resell it later this year. "He is a nice horse by a good young sire and looks like people might be able to take him to the races," Martin said of his purchase. "The guy that bought him told me to get him at all costs. He's got a great body and a great walk and looks like a racehorse--all the [horses by] Brahms look like that." Martin added, "We've been really successful with horses by new sires, and with Brahms, you have a horse with all the qualities to make a top young sire. He's by Danzig out of a great family and you can't go wrong with a horse like that." Seven-year-old Brahms stands the 2004 breeding season for a fee of \$10,000 at Vinery Kentucky.

A Lot of Pedigree...Not A Lot of Dough....

Part of yesterday's draft of horses from The Thoroughbred Corporation included February Storm (Storm Cat), which sold for \$55,000 to K. David Schwartz of Miami. The five-year-old comes with a world of pedigree, as he is out of Lilac Garden (Roberto), who also produced Hong Kong Horse of the Year Electronic Unicorn (Housebuster) as well as the ill-fated GI Kentucky Oaks heroine Blushing K.D. (Blushing John). Sold as a stallion prospect, his page was enhanced even more during Tuesday's bidding, when another half sister, Lilac Lane (Bahri), sold for \$600,000. The dam of GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. runner-up Gran Prospect, she was carrying a foal by that same sire. While not a standout at the races by any stretch, February Storm proved to be a solid horse who held up well to rigorous training. He excelled on the grass, winning his first two starts on that surface and registered his most important victory in winning the Storm Cat S. at Keeneland, defeating Honor In War, who went on to win the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic this past May. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, February Storm concluded his career with a lifetime record of 20-4-2-3 and earnings of \$203,971.

Hip 1207 (c, *Smart Strike*--*Dancing With Wings*, by Danzig)

This two-year-old colt hails from a good Sam-Son family and is a full brother to Soaring Free, winner last season of the GII Nearctic H. and second to Touch of the Blues (Fr) in the 2003 GI Atto Mile. He won a pair of Listed stakes as well last year en route to being named the champion sprinter in Canada.

The schedule features 45 races, 33 in the spring and 12 in the fall and includes five new stakes races. Of the 35 graded events, five are Grade I's, 10 are Grade II races and 20 are Grade III races. "We strive each year to continue to build and strengthen our stakes program at Churchill Downs and we're excited by the growth reflected in our 2004 schedule," said Don Richardson, senior vice president of racing for Churchill Downs Inc. "Horsemen from across North America continued their strong support of the Churchill Downs stakes program in 2003 and we hope the exciting new options available in 2004 will attract even more top horses and stables to compete under the historic Twin Spires." Churchill Downs will offer four major multiple stakes cards. Kentucky Oaks Day on Apr. 30 will offer six stakes worth \$1.3 million and Kentucky Derby Day on May 1 will feature six stakes, including three Grade I events, worth \$2.05 million. Stephen Foster Super Saturday will be held on June 12 with six stakes worth \$1.85 million. Churchill's season finishes with a bang with the Big Four Weekend from Nov. 25 through Nov. 27. The weekend is highlighted by the \$500,000 GII Clark H. and three other stakes worth a total of \$1.2 million. "We have scheduled what should be some truly spectacular days of multiple stakes competition, we've worked to refine the distances and spacing of races within a single division of horses and we've added some exciting new races to our schedule that will increase the stakes options available to our horsemen," said Churchill Downs Racing Secretary Doug Bredar. "Prime examples would be the Winning Colors, which fills a gap in sprint races for older fillies and mares, and the Commonwealth Turf in the Fall Meet offers a final chance for three-year-old turf horses in the East to compete in a stake race against their age group." The \$100,000 Winning Colors will be run on May 22 and the \$150,000 Commonwealth Turf will be run on Nov. 14. Churchill's spring meeting will run from Apr. 24 through July 5. The fall meet runs from Oct. 31 through Nov. 27.

LODER OFF THE MARK

David Loder marked his return as a public trainer by saddling two winners at Lingfield yesterday. After the facile success of **Dawn Piper** (Desert Prince) under Jamie Spencer in the maiden, the former Godolphin juvenile conditioner maintained his 100 percent record when **Diamond Way** (Boundary) followed up under that jockey in the handicap. Loder, who has set up at the historic Egerton Stud with 150 horses in training including 90 juveniles, plans to take a team of four to Dubai at the end of the month for the International Racing Carnival. Spencer, who was riding in Britain for the first time since returning from a brief stint in Hong Kong, is in the process of moving to Ireland where he will start his new job as first jockey for Aidan O'Brien at Ballydoyle.

ATTENDANCES REACH HIGH AGAIN

British racecourses witnessed a total attendance of over six million for the first time in over a half-century in 2003, it was announced Tuesday. Last year's total of 6.02 million was up by eight percent on the attendance in 2002, with total prize money also reaching a new record of £94.1 million, a rise of 12 percent on 2002. There were 2.3 percent more horses in training than in the previous year, rewarded with over five percent more fixtures and over four percent more races. "It is sometimes easy to overlook that British racing is one of the few sports which can honestly say that it is getting stronger and better as each year goes by," BHB Chief Executive Greg Nichols said. "Racing is on the up. This sustained progress is the result of the sectors of the sport working in conjunction with a strong governing authority."

O'BRIEN TRIO BOOST RECORD LINCOLN ENTRY

Three horses from the stable of Aidan O'Brien were the surprise element in a record 141-strong entry for this year's Freephone Stanleybet Lincoln H. at Doncaster Mar. 27. The Irish conditioner's trio is headed by the dual Listed scorer **Shoal Creek (Ire)** (Fairly King). Guy Reed's **Pablo (GB)** (Efisio {GB}), who took the British turf season's traditional curtain-raiser 12 months ago, could return for a title defense. "Pablo is entered and could run again this year, although it is obviously very early days," his owner/breeder said yesterday. Dermot Weld has entered **Akshar (Ire)** (Danehill) and last year's GII American Derby winner **Evolving Tactics (Ire)** (Machiavellian). "In addition to quantity, there are a significant number of quality performers among the entries and we are already looking forward to what promises to be one of the strongest-ever renewals of this historic handicap which has £100,000 in prize money," Doncaster's General Manager Steven Clarke commented yesterday.
