STORM CAT MARE TOPS THURSDAY SESSION

A stakes-winning Storm Cat mare in foal to Broken Vow topped Thursday's strong penultimate session of the Keeneland January Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Saturday's Child, selling as hip 1415 from the draft of Mill Ridge Sales, agent, elicited a bid of \$260,000 from Domino Stud of Lexington, LLC. Out of the stakeswinning Capote mare Bashful Charmer, Saturday's Child won Delaware's Hildene S. as a two-year-old

before being retired after finishing unplaced in a pair of three-year-old starts. She's from the extended family of leading sire Unbridled's Song. This will be the five-year-old's first foal. The only other mare to bring six figures on the afternoon was hip 1493, the Slewacide mare Twin Induction, who was knocked

down to Lane's End Farm's William Farish, Jr. for \$150,000. The seven-year-old Warrendale Sales, Agent XXVIII, consignee received a big boost just prior to the sale when her unbeaten three-parts sister, sophomore A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy), won the GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita Jan. 4. Twin Induction is in foal to Prospector's Music. Leading the way for the yearlings was hip 1314, a Tiger Ridge colt purchased for \$87,000 by Reiley McDonald & Tom VanMeter. Out of the Copelan mare Lantana, the Feb. 28 foal was consigned by Lakland LLC, agent. Coverage cont. p.2

Though Mother Nature is having her way with the East Coast, laying down blankets of snow and forcing track cancellations with arctic temperatures, tomorrow's GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream Park is a reminder that the first Saturday in May is just around the corner. The first legitimate stop on the road to the GI Kentucky Derby will offer a chance for owner/trainer Bill Cesare's Second of June (Louis Quatorze) to prove he's the real

deal. The well-muscled sophomore was sent off the second choice behind GI Hopeful S. winner **Silver Wagon** (Wagon Limit) in the Dec. 13 What a Pleasure S. at Calder, but was the best horse on the afternoon and romped by five lengths as Silver Wagon struggled home third. The two will line up

against each other once again with eight challengers joining the fray. While the jury is still out on Second of June's Classic potential, don't expect conditioning to play a factor: Cesare has been busy hammering endurance into his young charge, sending him out to one-mile works in his last two recorded moves. The dark bay got eight panels in 1:41 3/5 in his latest work at Calder Jan. 7. Cornelio Velasquez will be in the irons for the Holy Bull.

Chicago-based trainer Jere Smith, Sr. died Wednesday morning from pancreatic cancer. He was 63 years old. Smith saddled his first winner at 15 at Beulah Park in 1955 before moving to Chicago in the 1960s. He earned six training titles at Sportsman's Park, five at Hawthorne and one at Arlington. Smith's most famous charges were Recoup the Cash, who became a millionaire while winning four graded stakes; and Chicago Six, a GSW of over \$730,000. Funeral arrangements have not yet been announced.

INTEGRITY ISSUE BRINGS FORCES TOGETHER

Relations between the Association of British Bookmakers and the Jockey Club took a step forward yesterday when both sides agreed to strengthen the defence of racing's integrity. By entering into the Memorandum of Understanding, Britain's bookmakers have a structure to inform the authorities of abnormal betting patterns and other signs of possible corruption. "This represents another step forward with regard to our increasingly positive working relationship with the betting industry," the Jockey Club's Director of Security Paul Scotney told PA Sport yesterday. "By signing the Memorandum of Understanding, the ABB is signalling the association's desire and intention to protect and maintain the integrity of racing by assisting the Jockey Club security department in its investigations, where appropriate."
