MASTER DAVID DEBUTS FOR FRANKEL

Master David (Grand Slam), who started his career in Britain, makes his first start for Hall of Fame horseman



Bobby Frankel in the GII Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita this afternoon. The chestnut colt came out on the losing end of photo finishes in his first two starts, but put it together to break his maiden at Thirsk Sept. 16. He shipped to the States for his final start as a juvenile and acquitted himself well, running second as a 12-1 shot in the Nov. 29 GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct. Jockey John Velazguez travels to

the West Coast for the ride. Also looking for his first stakes score is the lightly raced St Averil (Saint Ballado). A maiden winner at first asking at Santa Anita Nov. 9, the \$500,000 FTKJUL yearling made his second start in the GI Hollywood Futurity. The dark bay was sent off a well-backed 5-2 in what was his twoturn bow and ran well, finishing 3 1/2 lengths behind Lion Heart in second. "I hope he doesn't bounce on me," trainer Rafael Becerra told Daily Racing Form. "I didn't do much with him [since his last race], just worked him a couple of times." St Averil prepped for the Santa Catalina with a sharp five furlongs in :59 2/5 at Santa Anita Jan. 8. Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm) makes his stakes debut after breaking his maiden in his fourth start. Third behind Lion Heart in his second outing, a six-furlong test at Santa Anita Oct. 24, he was fourth in his maiden route voyage Nov. 23 before posting a 2 1/2-length tally at Hollywood Dec. 17.

The European Pattern Committee has confirmed a host of new opportunities for distaffers while unveiling the major stakes changes for 2004. By upgrading the Prix d'Astarte (at Deauville, Aug. 1), Falmouth S. (Newmarket, July 7), Matron S. (Leopardstown, Sept. 11) and Sun Chariot S. (Newmarket, Oct. 2) from Group 2 to Group 1 status, the Committee has revolutionised the pattern for Europe's three-year-old and up filly and mare milers. The upgrades were further strengthened by the news that the Ridgewood Pearl S. (The Curragh, May 22) will be afforded Group 2 status, while a new Group 2 race at Royal Ascot June 18 for older fillies and mares is to be created. In the intermediate category, the EPC has doubled the current opportunities at the Group 1 level by upgrading the Pretty Polly S. (The Curragh, June 26) and the Premio Lydia Tesio (Rome, Oct. 21), which join Goodwood's Nassau S. and the Prix de l'Opera de Longchamp. Among the other initiatives at this distance include the introduction of the G2 Prix Jean Romanet (Deauville, Aug. 22). The Prix Corrida (Saint-Cloud, May 31) replaces the Prix Jean de Chaudenay, joining the Blandford S. (The Curragh Sept. 18) in being upgraded to Group 2 status. For middle-distance fillies and mares, the G1 Prix Vermeille has been opened to four-year-olds for the first time, while the distance of the G2 Prix Pomone (Deauville, Aug. 7) has been reduced to 2500 metres from 2700 metres. The Lancashire Oaks (Haydock, July 3) and Park Hill S. (Doncaster Sept. 8) have also been upgraded to Group 2 status. Pattern Changes cont. p2

Other major changes include the boosting of the purse of the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-le-Buffard Jacques le Marois (at Deauville, Aug. 15) from €500,000 to €550,000, making it the most valuable mile contest in Europe; and moving the G1 Prix Morny back seven days to the weekend of the illustrious L'Agence Francais yearling sale at Deauville, which is set for Aug. 22. With the refurbishment of Chantilly completed, the track will regain its lost fixtures in 2003, with its major group races scheduled to be run from late June to mid-September.




Ninth Isaac Murphy Award for Baze:

Islington comes from a stamina-laden family; her dam, the Darshaan (GB) mare Hellenic (Ire), won the G1 Yorkshire Oaks and the G2 Ribblesdale S. and was also the runner-up in the G1 St Leger S. Prior to Islington, Hellenic produced her full brothers, German Group 1 winner Greek Dance (Ire) and Election Day (Ire), third in the G1 Gold Cup.


