### AN ENCINO ENCOUNTER

Victory Encounter (Victory Speech) completed her transformation from claimer to graded stakes winner with a 1 1/4-length victory in yesterday's GII El Encino S. at Santa Anita. The dark bay filly was claimed for \$32,000 from her nine-length maiden score at Santa Anita last spring. She concluded her sophomore campaign with three straight wins, culminating with her first stakes victory in the Sept. 7 Torrey Pines S. at Del Mar, but had not raced since. After settling off the pace. Victory Encounter moved to the front with a fourwide move into the stretch and held off the late rally of favored Personal Legend (Awesome Again). "I was thrilled with the race," admitted winning trainer John Sadler. "She's absolutely surpassed my expectations. You just expect to make a nice claim and win a few races, but she's just improved steadily, so it's all been good." Sadler said the Feb. 14 GII La Canada S. would be next for Victory Encounter. Morning-line favorite Island Fashion (Petionville) was scratched from the El Encino in favor of next Sunday's GI Santa Monica H. Click for the RaceReplays.com replay. Sweet Return was third in the Del Mar Derby and missed by just a head in the Oct. 4 GII Oak Tree Derby before his front-running score in the Hollywood Derby. The lightly raced Nothing to Lose is a winner of six of four lifetime starts and is unbeaten on the turf, but he has been off since sweeping late to win the GIII Palm Beach S. at Gulfstream last February. The bay colt, previously trained by D. Wayne Lukas, is making his first start for Bobby Frankel. Puerto Banus, winner of last summer's GII Sunset H., has been off since running a dull sixth in the Aug. 9 GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga.

Super Kid provided trainer John Size with his third consecutive renewal of this event, following up on the back-to-back victories of Electronic Unicorn in 2002 and 2003. After failing to meet his NZ\$10,000 reserve at auction, the bay colt went on to win the G3 Highview Guineas and was third in the G1 Bayer Classic in his native country during his three-year-old season. Sent to Hong Kong late last fall with an eye on the Hong Kong Derby, he took a Class 2 event Nov. 15, was fifth in Class 1 company on the International Races undercard Dec. 14 and was most recently beaten a nose at that level Jan. 1. Making his local Group 1 debut, Super Kid was well placed in fourth behind Hidden Dragon, who cleared the field from his outside post and led through fractions of :24.5 and :47.2. The latter still led after 1200 meters in 1:11.7 and traveled smoothly into the stretch, but he began to shorten stride and was overhauled in the final 50 meters by Super Kid. "I was a little worried at the top of the home straight when Hidden Dragon led me by about three lengths so I had to get after him," said winning rider Shane Dye. "But the way he was finishing off, I knew I was going to win at the 200 meter [mark]. He's a very good and very tough horse." Bowman's Crossing, second in the G1 Hong Kong Mile, rallied from well back to be third, while Elegant Fashion (Aus) (Danewin {Aus}), third to Falbrav (Ire) in the G1 Hong Kong Cup, appeared to struggle over the wet going and finished well back in fifth.

# Sophomores On Track:

GII Remsen S. winner **Read the Footnotes** (Smoke Glacken) worked a bullet half mile in :47 at Palm Meadows Training Center Friday. "It was great," trainer Rick Violette said of the drill. "He did it easily but he's still very fast." The colt is expected to start next in the Feb. 14 GII Fountain of Youth S. "He's exactly where he needs to be," commented Violette. "If we turn out to be good enough to get to the Derby, I would like to get three races into him and the Fountain of Youth, the Florida Derby and either the Wood Memorial or the Blue Grass would fit really nicely. He's already won around two turns and got a mile and an eighth so he's cooperating with the game plan."

Trainer Nick Zito sent out a star-studded sophomore trio to work at Palm Meadows Saturday. Gll Lane's End Futurity winner Eurosilver (Unbridled's Song) drilled five furlongs in 1:02, while GI Champagne S. winner Birdstone (Grindstone) went the same distance in 1:02 2/5. GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. winner The Cliff's Edge (Gulch) worked a half mile in :49. "They all went good," Zito reported. "I'm happy with their progress. As for what is next for the colts," Zito said, "Hopefully, before too long they'll make an appearance. Everything is still a long way off, and we're just hoping everything stays on track." Zito also reported that El Prado Rob (El Prado {Ire}), third in last year's GI Futurity S., exited his fourth-place effort in Saturday's GIII Holy Bull S. in fine shape. "We're a little disappointed," Zito admitted. "That's not the way our stable progresses. Luck is a big factor, though, and he's not up to the level of a Second of June or Silver Wagon quite yet. Plus, we were trying to do something with him to get him to rate and he ended up on the lead. That was the last thing we expected. We'll see where we go from here with him."

# STRONG START TO INGLIS CLASSIC SALE The

Australasian sale season has started off on a strong note with the boutique Inglis Classic Sale echoing Magic Millions bullishness, recording a 16-percent average increase during the first session in Sydney yesterday. A record crowd attended the sale at the Inglis Newmarket complex, where Randwick trainer Bart Cummings gave top price of A\$220,000 for Lot 21, a Redoute's Choice (Aus)--Angel In Disguise (NZ) (Sky Chase {NZ}) colt. The yearling is from a three-guarter sister to Australian Horse of the Year Saintly (Aus), who Cummings trained to Cox Plate and Melbourne Cup victories. The colt was consigned by Edinglassie Stud's Mick Talty, who said his confidence grew as the colt proved so popular during pre-sale inspections. "He was a big, strong, precocious colt, a beautiful walker, and it is a great result for his breeder Bob Oatley of Rosemount Estate winery, who has been in the industry a long time," said Talty. "We didn't have great expectations until we arrived at the sale, and he was so popular with buyers coming back again and again to see him. He certainly sold for more than we had initially expected," he added. Vinery Stud general manager Peter Orton summed up prevailing sentiment, saying, "It is very strong and consistent with plenty of buyers and from what I can see it is a good line up of horses. The first crop of horses by More Than Ready have been well-received; they have gone to good stables and averaged more than three times his service fee." Sydney-based bloodstock agent Vin Cox said, "It is very competitive. There's a nice lot of horses and I have no doubt the market will continue on a strong note throughout the rest of the year. The really positive thing is the strength of the local market, there's a lot of people here trying to buy a horse and have a bit of fun." The opening session was solid throughout, averaging A\$34,500 compared to an overall average of A\$29,812 last year, with a clearance rate of 86 percent. A further 250 lots will go under the hammer Monday beginning at 10:30 a.m.

# THIS WEEK IN HISTORY...

January 20, 1979...Odds-on favorite Affirmed, with Steve Cauthen aboard, finished second in the San Fernando S. at Santa Anita, beaten 2 3/4 lengths by Radar Ahead. It was their fourth consecutive defeat. Cauthen subsequently lost the mount on Affirmed to jockey Laffit Pincay, Jr., who rode the horse for the remainder of his four-year-old season, winning seven victories in as many starts. Affirmed was later voted Horse of the Year for 1979. Cauthen had ridden Affirmed to a Triple Crown sweep the previous year and the pair recorded 11 wins in their 16 races together.
