Sweet Return (GB) (Elmaamul) went off a 6-1 chance despite having captured the GI Hollywood Derby in his most recent, but looked like an odds-on choice as he dug in with gritty determination to prevail in Monday's co-feature at Santa Anita, the GII San Marcos S. The four-year-old British import rounded into form last autumn, finishing third in the Sept. 6 GII Del Mar Derby, missing by a head when second in the Oct. 4 GII Oak Tree Derby, then taking the Nov. 30 Hollywood Derby in front-running fashion after being allowed ploddingly slow fractions over the 10-furlong trip as a 16-1 outsider. Intent on proving that was no fluke, the Ron McAnally trainee was away well from his outside post and cleared the field under a confident Gary Stevens. Clicking off sensible fractions of :23 3/5, :47 4/5 and 1:12 1/5 with Blue Steller (Ire) (Barathea {Ire}) and Nothing to Lose (Sky Classic) tracking just behind, the chestnut turned for home with the latter gearing up his bid. Nothing to Lose, coming off an extended break, fought tooth-and-nail down the lane, but Sweet Return wouldn't be denied in giving McAnally his fourth San Marcos. 

If I were asked to cite an example of pedigree sometimes proving more important than performance, Sovereign Dancer would have to be high on my list.

After four starts in the U.S. had yielded less than \$3,000, this royally bred son of Northern Dancer partly redeemed himself as a four-year-old in France, where he won two of his 10 starts and earned black type by finishing second at Group 3 level in the French Provinces. While this represented a marked improvement, form of this standard would not, on average, be enough to earn a trip to Florida and a place at Ocala Stud.

There was nothing average, though, about Sovereign Dancer's bloodlines: his dam, the stakes-winning Bold Princess, was one of six foals sired by the great Bold Ruler from the remarkably successful Grey Flight. In other words, Bold Princess was a sister to the dualchampion sire What A Pleasure, as well as being a half sister to Misty Morn, the champion racemare who produced the champion two-year-olds Successor and Bold Lad to Bold Ruler.

Breeders hardly rushed to use Sovereign Dancer, who had only 18 named foals in his first crop, but four of those 18 became stakes winners and one of them--the quirky Gate Dancer--was good enough to win the 1984 Preakness and Super Derby. *Caulfield cont. p.3*





Remarkably, Gate Dancer proved to be no flash in the pan. Sovereign Dancer's 1987 crop--the last he sired in Florida before his transfer to Lane's End Farm--produced the champion turf horse Itsallgreektome and Priolo, who collected two of France's most competitive mile races, the Jacques le Marois and the Prix du Moulin. Then, in his penultimate crop, Sovereign Dancer came up with Louis Quatorze, who matched Gate Dancer's achievements of winning the Preakness and finishing second in the Breeders' Cup Classic.

When Louis Quatorze retired to Ashford Stud in 1998, the jury was still out over Sovereign Dancer's merit as a sire of sires. Gate Dancer hadn't set an encouraging precedent, siring nothing better than a handful of Grade III winners despite an opening fee of \$25,000. On the other hand, the Grade II winner Leo Castelli got off to a fine start in 1991, with four juvenile stakes winners among his first runners, but his long-term prospects were hindered by his having spent his third and fourth seasons in Russia.

I was inclined to think that the best indicator to Louis Quatorze's prospects was going to be Priolo, because there were similarities between their pedigrees. Priolo had the distinction of being inbred 3x4 to both Bold Ruler and Grey Flight, through the sisters Bold Princess and Pleasant Flight, whereas the inbreeding in Louis Quatorze's pedigree included 3x4 to Bold Ruler and 3x5 to Grey Flight, through Bold Princess and Bold Lad. Priolo has three lines of Nasrullah, compared to Louis Quatorze's four.

The fact that Priolo is now available at a fee of only 4,500 euros tells us that he hasn't been a runaway success, and he is now in France after starting his career in Ireland. However, his achievement of coming up with a Group 1 winner in four of his first five crops means that Priolo can't be described as a failure--especially as one of those Group 1 winners was Sendawar, an excellent miler whose first foals race this year. The problem with Priolo is that his seven group winners represent less than two percent of his racing-age offspring.

It looks as though history is repeating itself with Louis Quatorze. The fact that he has been sold to stand at a fee of \$6,000 at Murmur Farm in Maryland after six seasons at Ashford tells its own story. I should add that he attracted only 34 mares in 2003, having covered 179 in 2002 and 162 in 2001. That bumper book of 179 mares coincided with some high-class efforts by Louis Quatorze's son Repent. After being ranked third behind Johannesburg and Siphonic among the two-year-old males of 2001, Repent looked to be en route to Churchill Downs after his wins in the GIII Risen Star S. and GII Louisiana Derby, but an ankle chip incurred in the Illinois Derby ended that particular dream. Although Repent later did well to finish second in the Travers, he spent last year on the sidelines and will soon be covering his first mares in Florida.

With nothing of note emerging from his second crop, which numbered only 41 named foals, Louis Quatorze was in trouble by the start of the 2003 covering season, but he has now come up with another possible Derby contender in Second of June, who gave weight and a beating to Silver Wagon in the GIII Holy Bull S.

If Second of June continues to progress, Louis Quatorze's new owners, Mr. and Mrs. E. Allen Murray Jr, could have struck gold once more, just as they did with Our Emblem. With Louis Quatorze's large crops of 2002 and 2003 probably representing his best chance so far, his record could look a lot better by the end of this year.

Louis Quatorze's popularity was at a low ebb when Second of June--then called Gaudy--came up for sale at the OBS Winter Mixed Sale a year ago. This no doubt contributed to the colt selling for only \$7,500, but another factor may well have been the youngster's very late foaling date, which gave him his new name. I would normally have considered a June birthday to be quite a handicap, but it hasn't stopped Second of June winning four of his six starts. It's surely reasonable to expect him to continue improving when most of his rivals have stopped.

Second of June's purchase price certainly didn't reflect the quality of his pedigree. When his dam, Whow, a daughter of Spectacular Bid, visited Sovereign Dancer in 1993, she produced Jack Flash, a \$195,000 yearling who went on to be second in the GIII Jim Beam S. Whow herself collected a couple of stakes victories over 8.5 furlongs to become one of five stakes winners out of the Hollywood Oaks winner Hooplah. The others included Afifa (GI Vanity H.) and Auction Ring, a very fast English colt who sired some good winners. Hooplah also produced Passing My Way, an unraced daughter of Pass the Glass who became the dam of Phone Chatter (GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies), so this family is certainly no stranger to success at the top level.

SLIGHT DECLINES IN NYRA NUMBERS The daily average handle and attendance showed slight declines during the 250 days of racing at New York Racing Association tracks in 2003. The daily average attendance for the year was 9,534, down one half of 1 percent from 2002. The daily average handle from all sources was \$10,953,180, off 1.8 percent, while the daily average on NYRA races was \$10,408,413, a decrease of 1.8 percent as well. The daily average turnover on-track was \$1,970,521, down 4.4 percent, and the daily average on-track betting on NYRA racing was \$1,425,767, off 5.9 percent. "It was a difficult year for us in a number of ways," NYRA Senior Vice President Bill Nader said. "We saw the introduction of unlimited simulcasting to OTB in May, which certainly cut into statewide wagering on our product. We also had many more cancellations due to weather in 2003. We ended up the year losing a net of 11 cards, compared to four in 2002. We were also hit hard with bad weather on key racing days throughout the year." He added, "We are looking forward to 2004...it is a new start for NYRA. And we hope that, by the end of the year we'll not only be presenting great racing to New Yorkers, but a first-class VLT operation as well."

CO-TOPPERS AT OBS WINTER OPENER Two lots shared top billing at yesterday's opening session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale in Ocala, Florida. First to attract top price of \$95,000 yesterday was hip 226, a yearling daughter of Deputy Commander out of O K Three Wire (Relaunch). Consigned by Nancy Bauman, agent, the chestnut filly was purchased by Sandy Creek Farm. Also bringing \$95,000 was hip 231, the 11-year-old mare Natkeeta (Gulch). The chestnut mare, consigned by Kaizen Sales, agent, is in foal to champion juvenile Johannesburg. She is the dam of stakes winner Interminable Gold (Gilded Time). Sally Andersen made the winning bid. For the session, the average sale price was \$19,545, up 21 percent from a year ago, while the median rose 12 percent to \$14,000. 

Jose Flores Injury Prompts Philly Park Cancellation:

Racing was called off after the second race at Philadelphia Park yesterday when jockeys agreed that track conditions were unsafe, a determination that followed the injury of jockey Jose Flores in the card's first event. Flores was injured when his mount, Faygo Rocks, broke down turning for home, throwing Flores onto a racing surface frozen by a bitter cold spell. It was unclear from track replays whether the horse following Flores stepped on the jockey as he lay prone on the track. Flores was taken from the track on a stretcher and was sent to Frankford-Torresdale Hospital to be evaluated for a possible concussion and injuries to the left side of his rib cage. Word on Faygo Rocks was not immediately available. Jockeys at the Bensalem track rode the second race, but afterwards decided that the track was in an unsuitable condition. Racing is expected to resume today at 12:25 p.m. and will also be offered tomorrow, typically a dark day.

The Richard Mandella trainee is expected to emerge in the one-mile GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita Feb. 15. "She went fine," said Mandella. "All systems go."...With an eye on this weekend's GI Santa Monica H., four-year-old Island Fashion (Petionville) breezed four furlongs in :47 1/5. The gray filly was scratched out of Sunday's GII El Encino S. in favor of the seven-furlong Santa Monica...GI Malibu S. victor Southern Image (Halos Image), gearing up for a tilt in Saturday's \$1 million Sunshine Millions Barretts/CTBA Classic at Santa Anita, sped through five panels in a sharp :58 4/5, the second-fastest of 41 at the distance...Also working yesterday at Santa Anita was GI Breeders' Cup Sprint runner-up Bluesthestandard (American Standard), whose five-furlong move in 1:00 2/5 was the 10th fastest of 41 at the distance. "He worked real handy and just about the way we wanted," said Ted West, assistant to his father, Ted H. West. The seven-year-old Georgia-bred is slated to make his first start since the Sprint in the GII Palos Verdes H. Feb. 1.



Five horses fetched more than A\$100,000 at yesterday's second session, including Lot 281, who topped the session with a final bid of A\$210,000. Consigned by Shipton Lodge, the bay colt by Encosta de Lago (Aus) out of Money Maker (Aus) (Twenty Four Karat), was purchased by trainer Noel Mayfield-Smith on behalf of owner Bill Fisher, who purchased Group 1 winner In Top Swing (Aus) (Beautiful Crown) from the same sale. Strong demand for Danehill sire Redoute's Choice continued with Lot 388, a filly from Satin Sheets (Aus) (Dehere), herself a half sister to Group1 winner Solar Circle (NZ). John Shannon paid A\$135,000 for the filly, who was consigned by agent Byerley Stud. Glen Burrows of Willow Park Stud in the NSW Hunter Valley, among vendors to record solid results at both Magic Millions and Classic, commented on this year's edition of the sale. "The success of the Aushorse Inward Buyer Scheme bringing new international faces to Magic Millions and a whole host of new people at Classic has provided a great base from the bottom of the market right through to the top, and I believe the sale season will be strong all the way through," he said. Korean purchasers, perhaps finding the barometer too high at Magic Millions, were also active at the Classic sale. "The outstanding success of Classic yearling sale graduates in recent years attracted a huge crowd to Newmarket, with spirited bidding on all horses," said Inglis Managing Director Reg Inglis. "This is the best-ever Classic Yearling Sale and we now look forward with great anticipation to the Melbourne Premier and Australian Easter Yearling Sales."
