PURSES SLASHED AT SANTA ANITA

Officials at Santa Anita have announced an acrossthe-board purse decrease, including eight graded stakes, beginning Jan. 31. Following Oak Tree and Hollywood, this is the third consecutive purse cut in southern California. Santa Anita is owned by Magna Entertainment, which announced in December that it was pulling its tracks' signals from many account wagering services in an effort to lure bettors to their XpressBet service. According to the track's Vice President and General Manager Chris McCarron, handle is down in every sector from last year: two percent ontrack, seven percent off-track and 17 percent out-ofstate. The following stakes have had their purses reduced by \$50,000:

Seeking his third straight win, **Star Cross** will get an 11-pound pull in the weights from defending champion **Congaree**. "I don't think it's enough, but obviously makes a difference," said trainer Darrell Vienna. "It's significant, but if you look at the relative performances of the horses, **Pleasantly Perfect**, who just won the Breeders' Cup, gets 121 pounds and it doesn't seem like that big a spread for a horse like mine that's just finding his way. But can 11 pounds make a difference? Yes, especially in a close race."

Oaks, has been retired from racing, according to published reports. The half sister to GI Breeders' Cup Turf co-hero Johar was withdrawn from her intended start in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf after suffering from a minor illness. She has not started since finishing seventh in the Avigaition H. at Santa Anita Nov. 9. After beginning her career in England, the blaze-faced bay came to hand quickly at three in the U.S., winning three of six starts with a sec-

ond and a third. She heads to the breeding shed with earnings of \$259,560. A Thoroughbred Corp. homebred, Dessert was produced by top turf mare Windsharp, who sold for \$6.1 million at Keeneland November. The four-year-old will be bred to Kingmambo.

ECLIPSING STALLIONS

Prior to the Eclipse Awards, two stallions had the opportunity to sire two American champions. <u>Unbridled</u>'s Halfbridled had juvenile filly honors all but sewn up and Empire Maker looked like he could defeat Funny Cide one more time for champion three-year-old laurels. <u>Sadler's Wells</u> also had a pair of nominees in High Chapparal and Islington in the wide open male and female turf categories.

So when those two were crowned Monday evening, and Empire Maker was not, it was the great Sadler's Wells who became the sire star of the Eclipse Awards season.

It would seem that siring a pair of Eclipse Award winners in the same year would put Sadler's Well in rarified company. But it turns out that eight other stallions have already accomplished that feat.

The first to do it was none other than Mr. Prospector, whose Conquistador Cielo took down champion three-year-old and Horse of the Year honors, while Gold Beauty was named champion sprinter in 1982. Two years later, members of Seattle Slew's first two crops, Slew o' Gold and Swale earned Eclipse championships; champion older male for the former and champion three-year-old for the latter. The next year, Life's Magic (champion older filly/mare) and Vanlandingham (champion older male) were named champions for Cox's Ridge. In 1987 Miesque, by Nureyev, won the first of her two American championships for turf female and was joined by her paternal half-brother Theatrical, who was named champion turf male. Alydar sired the champions Easy Goer (two-year-old colt) and Alysheba (older male and Horse of the Year) in 1988. Deputy Minister's Go for Wand (two-year-old filly) and Open Mind (three-yearold filly) were both named champions the following year. Seeking the Gold sired his two Eclipse winners in 1994, Flanders (two-year-old filly) and Heavenly Prize (three-year-old filly). Cee's Tizzy was the first to do it in the new century with champion older male Tiznow and champion older filly/mare Gourmet Girl in 2001. Cont. p3

Two stallions, Distorted Humor and Cape Town sired their first Eclipse winners last year. Not bad, considering that Funny Cide and Bird Town are members of their sires' first crops. By my count they join 15 other stallions that have sired Eclipse champions in their initial crop of runners. Among those are Danzig (Chief's Crown), Mr. Prospector (It's In The Air), Alydar (Althea), Seeking the Gold (Heavenly Prize), Fappiano (Tasso) and Seattle Slew. Slew is the only stallion to sire two Eclipse winners from his first crop: 1982 champion juvenile filly Landaluce and 1983 champion three-year-old and '84 champion older horse Slew o' Gold. Honour and Glory (Caressing) was the last to do it before this year and Meadowlake (Meadow Star) and Mt. Livermore (Housebuster), Woodman (Hansel) and Quiet American (Hidden Lake) are the other active stallions who can count early champions among their accomplishments. Dynaformer also had his first Eclipse champion in 2003, in the form of steeplechaser McDynamo.

Sadler's Wells, Kris S. and Unbridled all sired their third new champions Monday night. Northern Spur, High Chapparal, also a champion last year, and now Islington are the champs for Sadler's Wells. Halfbridled joins Anees and Banshee Breeze for Unbridled and Action This Day joins Hollywood Wildcat and Soaring Softly for Kris S. Those three bring the total of stallions that have sired at least three Eclipse champions to 16.

Leading the way in lifetime Eclipse champions is the incomparable Mr. Prospector. Aldebaran gave Mr. P his 10th champion and he has now sired an Eclipse Award winner in each of the past four decades: It's In the Air, co-champion juvenile filly in 1978, Conquistador Cielo (champion three-year-old and Horse of the Year), Gold Beauty (champion sprinter), Eillo (champion sprinter), Forty Niner (champion two-year-old), Gulch (champion sprinter) and Rhythm (champion two-year-old) in the 1980s. They were joined by Queena (champion older filly/mare) and Golden Attraction (champion two-year-old filly) in the '90s.

Mineshaft became A.P. Indy's second Eclipse winner, following the ill-fated Tempera in 2001, and there will surely be more in the years to come. A.P. Indy is one of 12 active stallions who have sired multiple Eclipse winners. The others are Cee's Tizzy (two), Mt. Livermore (three), Rahy (two), Phone Trick (two), Danzig (two), Sadler's Wells (three), Deputy Minister (three), Marquetry (two), Seeking the Gold (two), Woodman (two) and Quiet American (two).

(Nijinsky II--Rosa Mundi, by Secretariat), who has stood at Stonehedge Farm South in Williston, Florida since 1990, has been pensioned from stallion duties. The 20-year-old began suffering fertility problems last year. "We've had several specialists look at him, but nobody has really found anything," explained Stonehedge Farm manager Larry King. "We thought maybe the summer off would help, but he hasn't improved, so we decided to stop." Sword Dance, winner of the 1988 GI Del Mar Invitational H., is the sire of MGISW Marlin, as well as GSWs Blazing Sword and Dance for Thee. From 12 crops to race, Sword Dance has sired the earners of over \$18 million. He will spend his retirement at Stonehedge Farm.

Last year's nearly unanimous champion two-year-old filly Halfbridled (Unbridled) outworked her stablemate yesterday at Santa Anita, covering six furlongs in 1:14.40 under jockey Alex Solis, while Rhythm King finished up in 1:15.20. The big filly is scheduled to return to action in the one-mile GI Las Virgenes S. Feb. 15. "She just went beautiful," said trainer Richard Mandella. "She went seven-eighths in :26 and change. She went very slow the first half mile, and then picked it up a little. Then she went a nice :23 and change the last quarter. She's on course, but we've got to pray she doesn't get sick or something. We think we dodged the bullet...she had a little coughing bout, but this [Las Virgenes] will be a test." Awaiting Halfbridled will be another impressive unbeaten filly, A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy), the GIII Santa Ysabel S. heroine who worked in a bullet 1:11.40 Wednesday at Hollywood. "She's brilliant," said trainer Wally Dollase. "It was a great work. I put her behind another horse, she got a ton of dirt in her face, she made a little run down the stretch and did the same thing she did in the race here [closing with a rush to win the Santa Ysabel]. She kicked in big time."

DIAMOND LINED UP FOR STEVENS Trainer Andre Fabre will look to provide retained jockey Gary Stevens with an early chance of European Classic glory as he revealed that the unbeaten Diamond Green (Fr) (Green Desert) is on course for the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 1. Last year's impressive G3 Prix La Rochette winner will avoid a clash with Bago (Fr) and American Post (GB) in the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), allowing Stevens the opportunity to chase his first British Classic. Describing the new relationship with the Hall of Famer as "very exciting," Fabre outlined his plans to the Racing Post. "I've admired Gary very much for a long time, both as a jockey and as a person, and I felt recently he may not have been as committed to the U.S. as before," he explained. "He'll be based full-time in France from April and will ride all my horses." Fabre will free Stevens for the major meetings in Britain when he is not required to ride in France, and Newmarket will be the venue for the return of the exciting Diamond Green. "There's a very good chance that you will see Diamond Green go for the Guineas," Fabre told the Post. "It looks like being a pretty decent year in France with Bago and American Post, and I also think that Diamond Green will be suited by Newmarket."

ATTHERACES TO END AGREEMENT

Attheraces yesterday served notice to terminate their existing media rights deal with 49 of Britain's racecourses, while stating that it "remains committed to the future of U.K. horse racing." Before the existing deal expires Mar. 29, the consortium made up of Arena Leisure, BSkyB and Channel 4 will enter into separate negotiations with individual racecourses, in a bid to satisfy the Office of Fair Trading. The termination of the agreement with the Racecourse Association Limited (RCA), which has generated over £95 million in rights payments to the industry, comes as a result of commercial pressures. "The reduced Tote take-out rate has had a significant adverse impact on attheraces' revenues," Ian Hogg, managing director of attheraces, explained yesterday. "We regret that we have been forced to give notice to terminate, but remain committed to negotiating a new rights deal and firmly believe that securing the long-term viability of attheraces will also benefit the racing industry as a whole." He added, "I'm very optimistic that we will be here in 12 months time."

TATTS YEARLING SALE REVERTS TO ORIGINAL WEEK

Tattersalls Ireland announced yesterday that the September Yearling Sale will revert back to its original week in 2004. The sale, which features candidates for the €300,000 Tattersalls Sales S., will take place Sept. 21-22, with the Open Yearling Sale to be held Sept. 23. "This will ensure we avoid clashing with the popular Ayr Western meeting," said Tattersalls (Ireland) Chairman Edmond Mahony. "Despite the move to an earlier week, last year's sale achieved a record average, aggregate and median in addition to two lots making over €100,000."

"I'm flabbergasted," said Team Valor President Barry Irwin after watching her victory. "She's an incredible looking filly, very powerful. She's been doing very well in Dubai." A maiden

winner at first asking in her country of birth, the filly was sidelined after being involved in a freak incident. "After she broke her maiden, she ran into a pole and caused serious damage to her neck," Irwin explained. "We didn't buy her at first, but in the spring of her three-year-old year, she beat older females in the Group 1 [Cape of Good Hope Paddock S.]. That's unheard of over here, so we bought her. We originally planned on racing her in South Africa [last year], but she wasn't doing very good, so this was her first start for us." Settled towards the back of the pack, Crimson Palace lacked room in the stretch, but showed tremendous acceleration to punch through one off the rail and drew clear to the victory. Trainer Mike de Kock, who also conditioned Ipi Tombe, hinted to Irwin that such an effort was in the offing. "Mike told me, 'I don't want to scare you, but she's giving me the same vibe as lpi Tombe," Irwin said. Crimson Palace could make her next start in the G3 Al Fahidi Fort Feb. 7, a race won last year by Ipi Tombe.



STRONG ENTRY FOR DERBY

A total of 42 nominations have been received by the Hong Kong Jockey Club at the close of first-stage entries for the HK\$14-million G1 Hong Kong Derby. The list is headed by Lucky Owners (NZ) (Danehill), winner of five of his last six starts, including the G1 Hong Kong Mile Dec. 14. With an official domestic rating of 129, he is the highest-rated Derby entry in history. Super Kid (NZ) (Gaius {Ire}) and Hidden Dragon (Aus) (Danehill), first and second, respectively, in the G1 Stewards' Cup Jan. 18 could also line up for the 2000meter event and may be joined by any of a number of recent imports to the SAR. Roosevelt (Ire) (Danehill), third in last year's G1 Irish Derby, has made just two starts in Hong Kong and stamped himself a legitimate Derby contender with his close fourth-place finish in the G1 Hong Kong Vase Dec. 14. Trainer David Hayes, who saddled Elegant Fashion (Aus) to victory in the 2003 Derby, has seven horses entered, as does leading trainer John Size.
