## JUVENILE CHAMPIONS TOP EARLY TRIPLE **CROWN NOMINATIONS**

Recently crowned juvenile champions Action this Day (Kris S.) and Halfbridled (Unbridled) were among 434 nominees still eligible for the 2004 VISA Triple Crown series when the early nomination period closed Jan. 17. Todd Pletcher led all trainers with 35 nominees, including GII Sanford S. winner Chapel Royal (Montbrook), while trainer Nick Zito was represented by 22 nominees, topped by Birdstone (Grindstone), Eurosilver (Unbridled's Song) and The Cliff's Edge (Gulch). Leading the owner's ranks was Michael Tabor, alone or in partnership, with 13 individuals, including GI Hollywood Futurity hero Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat). Conspicuously absent from the list of early nominees was Sheikh Mohammed's Godolphin Racing operation, which led all owners with 19 nominations last year. Godolphin's main hope, GII Norfolk S. winner Ruler's Court (Doneraile Court), is currently on the sidelines while recovering from a knee injury sustained late last year. Late nominations, which can be made through March 27, will require a \$6,000 investment per horse.

Can I get a Witness? With lackadaisical ease, the four-year-old Silent Witness captured the first leg of Hong Kong's Champion Sprint Series, running his record to nine wins in as many starts. The star Aussiebred, making his first start since capturing the Dec. 14 G1 Hong Kong Sprint, jumped out to the early lead from his inside post and was relaxed on the front end under jockey Felix Cortez. Facing a sudden challenge by the Anton Marcus-partnered Firebolt with two furlongs to run, Silent Witness lost the advantage briefly, but three shakes of the reins from Cortez was all that was needed for the highest rated horse in Hong Kong to establish a clear advantage once again. The gelding finished with ears pricked as the crowd cheered on in approval. "When he extends, it's like some kind of double overdrive," exclaimed Coetzee. "And it's just so easy for him. [He's] just amazing." Trainer Tony Cruz just doesn't know exactly where the limits of his charge lie. "There was plenty in the tank at the finish there-he's done it with his ears pricked and it seems he's getting better," Cruz said.
