### SUN SHINES ON OBS

After a weekend of torrential rain in the Miami area, the sun has come out for the first two-year-old sale of the new year as the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company conducts its Selected Sale at Calder Race Course, beginning at noon. Always a good source of solid performers and popularly termed a buyer's sale, the auction is coming off a year which yielded three of the best



juveniles of 2003. **Chapel Royal** (Montbrook), who set an OBS record when selling for \$1.2 million at last year's sale, went on to capture a pair of graded stakes and place in three Grade I races, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile. He also ran second in the GI Hopeful S. to another OBSFEB graduate, **Silver Wagon** (Wagon Limit), who sold for

\$120,000 in 2003. They are joined by **Ruler's Court** (Doneraile Court), a \$400,000 purchase a year ago who put up one of 2003's most brilliant performances in winning the GII Norfolk S. by 14 lengths. "I expect this

sale to be as good or better than last year," said Tom Ventura, director of sales for OBS. "I think [2003] was a very solid sale, and the horses that sold there turned out to be nice horses, including the sale topper, Chapel Royal. I think the way the yearling sales and the mixed sales went in the fall and the winter were good signs for the

horse industry in general, and I think the fact that this sale has been so successful at producing racehorses; people pay attention to this sort of things. There's a study that just came out that this sale has produced 11.7 percent stakes winners over a 10-year period, and those are phenomenal numbers, really." Ventura is quietly confident that the overall upward trend at recent sales will continue today. "Our buy-back rate historically has been very good at this sale, in comparison with other selected sales," he said. "We were below 30 percent last year, which, in these times, is very good. I would like to see our average go above the \$110K mark." *Coverage cont. p2-4* 



## ANGEL FEVER, DAM OF FUPEG, DEAD

Angel Fever (Danzig--Rowdy Angel, by Halo), the dam of Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus and a full sister to Classic winner Pine Bluff, died Jan. 30 after suffering injuries in a paddock accident at Arthur B. Hancock III's Stone Farm in Paris, Kentucky. A farm spokesperson said the 14-year-old mare fractured her pelvis, severing a major artery. She was carrying a

three-parts sibling to Fusaichi Pegasus by Seeking the Gold. "From the beginning, Angel Fever was a very special mare to me," said Hancock. "This is a tragedy, but we were blessed to have been a part of her life." By Danzig out of the Halo mare Rowdy Angel, Angel Fever made just two starts as a two-year-old--breaking her maiden by 11 lengths and

placing second in the Colleen S.--before an injury ended her racing career. Purchased by Hancock and partner Robert McNair for \$525,000 at the 1994 Keeneland November Sale from the Loblolly Stable dispersal, the bay began paying immediate dividends when her daughter, Blissful, by Mr. Prospector, went for \$1 million at the 1996 Keeneland September Sale. The real fireworks would occur two years later, however, when a full brother to Blissful was knocked down for \$4 million to Fusao Sekiguchi. That colt, named Fusaichi Pegasus, would go on to win the Derby and become one of the most sought-after stud prospects in recent years. The heroics of Fusaichi Pegasus, now a stallion at Ashford Stud, ensured further success in the ring for the offspring of Angel Fever. Blissful, selling in foal to Deputy Minister, elicited a bid of \$4 million at the 2000 November Sale, while Bless, another by Mr. Prospector, would equal that \$4-million tag at the 2002 November Sale while in foal to Storm Cat. To date, the offspring of Angel Fever have grossed over \$14.3 million at various sales.

#### High Expectations...

With a high standard set by the results of last year's graduates, how will the 2004 group compare? "I think we've got a good group of horses this year," Tom Ventura, director of sales for OBS, explained. "I don't know if we've got a horse that's going to break the million-dollar mark. [But] I don't know if you asked me that same question last year, if we had a million-dollar horse at this point. We do have the players here that can spend that kind of money. If there's a horse of that quality, with the pedigree, the physical, and all of the aspects that they desire, that more than two of them land on, it could happen, but it's hard to say."

#### **Buyers Becoming Aware...**

By providing a consistent amount of quality performers from year to year, the OBS Calder Sale has carved a niche for itself and is popular with many trainers and buyers. But new faces are making the journey to Miami as well. "We've had some new credit requests from people that haven't been buying here in the past," said Tom Ventura. "We haven't had the Japanese interest compared to some of the other sales, but there are [a few] Japanese groups walking around with some interest. A lot of the high-profile buyers are here, and I think we have enough horses for them." Consignor Becky Thomas, who sold the world-record \$2.7 million colt at Barretts last year, said, "A lot of people come here looking for a good horse without having to [spend a lot of money]. People think they can't buy at a Fasig or a Barretts, even though that's not the case. But they're afraid they can't, so a lot of people come here for the mid-market horse. There are a lot of trainers here: for example, Steve Asmussen is here, and Steve Flint, and Bernie Flint." Another consignor, Donna Wormser, summed up the appeal of the OBS February Sales. "This is a buyer's place, this is a buyer's heaven," she said. "Dollar for dollar, more runners come out of this sale than any other sale. There are a lot of buyers here looking for a top horse. This sale is hard for a lot of owners to focus on because the pedigrees aren't as strong, maybe, as some of the other sales. We had 11percent stakes winners last year, and all you heard was that there wasn't that much pedigree, there wasn't that outstanding individual. But this sale produces winners, runners, stakes winners."

### Where's Gill?

At last year's sale, controversial owner and 2003 Eclipse Award finalist Mike Gill signed the ticket on 32 horses for over \$2.9 million. But Gill recently stated that he would not be buying horses at the Calder sales (OBS and Fasig-Tipton), citing the fact that the track has denied him stalls. What sort of an effect will that have on this sales? "I think that if you lose a buyer who bought 30 of your horses, that's got to have an impact," said Tom Ventura. "He was bidding on a lot of horses. But he's a competitive person. I'm hoping he has a change of heart; some of the horses that he bought out of here have turned out to be successful." What level of the market will be most affected by Gill's absence? "He was bidding on horses at all ranges," Ventura said. "I don't think we're going to have any trouble in the upper end, but he was bidding on horses from \$50K on up to half a million. I'm hoping that some of the new interest we've been getting will fill in some of those gaps."

#### What's Really Important?

Consignor Donna Wormser hasn't focused on paper in offering young horses at auction. "For some reason, people want expensive pedigrees," she said. "It confuses me, because I've made a good living for 30 years selling runners. I think we could keep owners in the business more if they could win more races. So let's try



to buy them runners and winners, more of an athletic horse. Because if an owner has winners, they'll stay in the business." Though Wormser is not expecting the board to light up, she is confident about her horses' potential. "I know I have some nice horses here," she continued. "They may not bring a lot of money, but they'll all run. There's some sharp, good people Wormser and Hip 103 down here selling horses. They proba-

bly prepare their horses better than I do, and they're more ready to run than mine are." The downpours which struck the area,

and have cause the cancellation of racing at Gulfstream for the past two days, weren't much of a concern for Wormser in sending her two-year-olds out to breeze Sunday. "Everybody stayed off the bad spot, which was down at the rail," she explained. "It was wet, but it wasn't a dangerous track at all. This track can take a lot of water and still be safe. If it rained this much at Keeneland, New York or Gulfstream, it would be a dangerous track. [Calder] gets fast when it gets wet."

## A Glamorous Group...

Last year's graduates Silver Wagon and Ruler's Court were from the first crops of their respective sires, and this year's sale features some very promising freshman sires. Three of the best three-year-olds of 2000--Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), European stalwart Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat) and Breeders' Cup Mile hero War Chant (Danzig)--took impeccable pedigrees to stud and have had their first youngsters sell well as weanlings and yearlings. All three are represented at this auction: Fusaichi Pegasus has hip 202, Giant's Causeway has hip 56 and War Chant is the sire of hip 120. Other first-crop sires include a pair of Grade I-winning millionaires by A.P. Indy, Golden Missile and Stephen Got Even; champion Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo); two Florida-based sons of the late Saint Ballado, Straight Man and

Sweetsouthernsaint; Met Mile hero Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado); and top performers such as <u>Cape</u> <u>Canaveral</u> (Mr. Prospector), Chief Seattle (Seattle Slew), <u>Commendable</u> (Gone West), <u>Dixie Union</u> (Dixieland Band), K One King (Apalachee), More Than Ready (Southern Halo), Precise End (End Sweep), Successful Appeal (Valid Appeal), <u>Vicar</u> (Wild Again) and Yes It's True (Is It True).

## PEDIGREE INSIGHTS BY ANDREW CAULFIELD

## The Influence of El Gran Senor...

During the dark days of this winter, the Racing Post has stimulated memories of some much brighter times by asking readers to nominate their favorite racehorses of all time. One thing this poll has revealed is the enormous affection that British and Irish racegoers have for the top hurdlers and steeplechasers: no fewer than 59 of the horses which fill the top 100 places were jumpers, including 13 of the top 20. The explanation for this phenomenon is that, unlike many of Europe's top flat performers, these durable jumpers are often around for six or seven years and, by the time they retire, they are regarded as old friends.

Unfortunately, one of my personal favorites, El Gran Senor, did not enjoy a full innings, with his eight starts and seven wins spanning just 11 months. No doubt the shortness of his career contributed to his figuring no higher than 62nd among the top 100.

El Gran Senor's career may have been on the short side, but it was certainly very sweet. His first visit to England saw him start favorite for the 1983 Dewhurst S. on the strength of three wins in Ireland, including the G1 National S. He duly turned in a performance which secured him the title of Europe's champion two-year-old. In defeating the future Arc winner Rainbow Quest by half a length in the Dewhurst, the pair drew six lengths clear of the French raider Siberian Express, whose previous ventures into Group 1 company had produced a victory in the Prix Morny and a close second in the Prix de la Salamandre.

El Gran Senor's reappearance at three saw him matched against Sadler's Wells, another of Vincent O'Brien's unbeaten sons of Northern Dancer, in the Gladness S. over seven furlongs. The result--a two-length victory for El Gran Senor--confirmed O'Brien's comment that "Sadler's Wells is a good horse, but El Gran Senor is exceptional." *Cont. p6*

Just how exceptional we were to find out when El Gran Senor made his next start in the 2000 Guineas, when the opposition included the unbeaten Lear Fan, the richly talented Rainbow Quest and Chief Singer. Chief Singer's next three starts after the Guineas were to produce an eight-length win in the St James's Palace S., a victory over some outstanding sprinters in the G1 July Cup and a win in the G1 Sussex S., but El Gran Senor treated him with disdain, quickening away to score by two and a half lengths. The winning time supported the view that El Gran Senor had achieved something truly out of the ordinary and the compilers of the International Classifications rated his performance 138. This remains the standard by which all other performances over a mile are still judged, and no other miler has matched it in the 27-year history of the Classifications.

I always had doubts about whether El Gran Senor would prove as brilliant over a mile and a half. I haven't changed my mind even though he won the Irish Derby in style, having narrowly lost the Derby through pilot error. The official handicappers couldn't rate his form over a mile and a half within eight pounds of his Guineas display, but he was clearly blessed with an enviable mix of stamina and speed. Add in an excellent pedigree (his second dam, Best in Show, had been voted Broodmare of the Year in 1982) and a fine physique and it's no wonder that El Gran Senor was regarded as Northern Dancer's rightful heir when he joined his sire at Windfields.

Of course, El Gran Senor's perpetual fertility problems left those dreams in tatters, but he still enjoyed tremendous success. His tally of 14 percent stakes winners and roughly 7.5 percent graded winners always leaves me wondering what might have been. After all, his fertility figures must have deterred many breeders from sending him their very best mares. His AEI stood at 2.74 last fall, against a CI of 2.21, so he generally upgraded his mares. In the circumstances, it is disappointing that none of his sons has proved capable of carrying on his good work. Fortunately, El Gran Senor's broodmare daughters are making sure his name lives on (following in the footsteps of the daughters of El Gran Senor's broodmare sire Buckpasser).

Last year was a particularly successful time for El Gran Senor's daughters, who were represented by the Grade/Group I winners Empire Maker, Leadership (in Italy), Le Vie Dei Colori (Italy) and Grand Vitesse (Argentina), plus their fellow graded winners Olmodavor, Conroy (in UAE), Willa on the Move and Aynthia (in Italy).

Of course, last year also saw El Gran Senor's extraordinary daughter Toussaud voted Broodmare of the Year, thanks to the cumulative efforts of Chester House, Honest Lady, Decarchy, Chiselling and Empire Maker.

And last year also saw Grand Slam--one of the first Grade I winners out of an El Gran Senor mare--make a sizeable impact with his first three-year-olds, which included Strong Hope, a colt inbred 4x3 to El Gran Senor's dam Sex Appeal.

El Gran Senor's daughters have built up an impressive record of around eight percent stakes winners among their foals, and have achieved 16 percent with sons of Mr. Prospector. They are also doing very well with the Seattle Slew line. They so far have only seven foals of racing age by Seattle Slew, but they include the excellent Honest Lady and Grand Slam's Grade IIII-winning half-brother Leestown. Their first two foals by Seattle Slew's son A.P. Indy are the Grade III winners Indygo Shiner and Olmodavor, the latter looking as though there is still plenty to come when he took the Whirlaway H. two days ago. Hopefully this bodes well for Tousaud's 2003 covering by A.P. Indy.

Corey Lanerie, who partnered Olmodavor to victory at the Fair Grounds, predicts that the five-year-old will improve with distance. This seems likely, as both his sire and broodmare sire were major winners over a mile and a half. His dam, Corrazona, also possessed a measure of stamina, as she showed by becoming a Grade I winner over a mile and an eighth. Stamina is also implied by the fact that Corrazona is a half-sister to the Belmont S. second Thirty Six Red (who, like Olmodavor, was sired by a son of Seattle Slew) and is out of a daughter of the Belmont winner Stage Door Johnny.


