Dual Grade I winner Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) was given the 8-5 edge over sophomore champion Funny Cide (Distorted Humor), who was made the 2-1 second choice, for Saturday's \$500,000 GI Donn H. at Gulfstream Park. Medaglia d'Oro, owned by Edmund

Gann and trained by Bobby Frankel, arrived at the Hallandale area track Wednesday. Second to Pleasantly Perfect last time out in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Oct. 25, the five-year-old has been assigned top weight of 122, three pounds more than his younger rival. Funny Cide, on the other hand, has already made a start in 2004, win-

ning by five lengths in a seven-furlong \$100,000 optional claimer at Gulfstream Jan. 10. The Sackatoga Stable-owned colt, who is trained by Barclay Tagg, recorded the fastest five-furlong work Tuesday at Palm Meadows Training Center and appears ready for his first Grade I of the year. Also in the lineup for this year's 46th running of the Donn are graded stakes winners Puzzlement (Pine Bluff), Preraid Dawn (Sir Cat), Bowman's Band (Dixieland Band), Seattle Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), The Judge Sez Who (Judge T C), and dual stakes victor Country Be Gold (Summer Sauall).

Godolphin have their first two starters of the New Year in Sutter's Fort, a three-time winner at two, and Frankie Dettori's mount Rosencrans, an impressive five-length maiden scorer in his lone start to date last summer at Arlington Park. Prince of Denmark was second in last summer's listed Dragon S. at Sandown before finishing fourth of 22 in the Weatherbys Super Sprint. Owned by Sheikh Rashid al Maktoum, the bay is perfect in two starts at Nad al Sheba. Clifden has won three of his six career trips to the post, including a four-length score in the G3 Premio Primi Passi in Milan last June. South Africa is represented by dual Group 1 winner Ice Cube as well as GSW Lundy's Liability.

The 16-year-old mare had been battling laminitis since 2002. Trained by D. Wayne Lukas, the Edward P. Evans homebred scored in the GII Forward Gal Breeders' Cup S. and the GII Bonnie Miss S. and later finished second in the GI Kentucky Oaks during her sophomore season in 1991.

The undefeated colt last worked Jan. 26, but has been idle since then because of heavy recent rains and uneven track conditions.

A.P. Adventure Readies for Las Virgenes

Undefeated A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy) continued her march toward a showdown with juvenile filly champ Halfbridled in the Feb. 15 GI Las Virgenes S. with a swift five-furlong work Wednesday at Santa Anita Park. The Bob and Beverly Lewis-owned filly completed her task in :58.40, the fastest of 26 drills at the distance. "It was pretty impressive," said trainer Wally Dollase. "She's such a talented filly." The bay won the GIII Santa Ysabel S. at Santa Anita in her most recent start Jan. 4.

Gulfstream Comebackers Galore:

Comebackers of the equine and human variety are on tap at Gulfstream Park this afternoon. Augustin Stable's With Anticipation (Relaunch) returns from an eightmonth absence to launch his nine-year-old campaign in this afternoon's featured eighth race. The nearly white gelding won three consecutive Grade I races during the summer of 2002, but is winless since taking the GI Man o' War S. that September. He was off the board in just three efforts last season and was last seen when last of seven, but beaten only 3 1/2 lengths, in the GI United Nations H. at Monmouth July 5. He catches a solid field for the comebacker, including MGSW Del Mar Show (Theatrical {Ire}) and Chilean Group 1 winner Host (Chi) (Hussonet). John Oxley's Perfect Story (Tale of the Cat), the half sister to Horse of the Year Point Given, also returns to the races this afternoon. Now four, the chestnut filly owns a pair of victories over the Gulfstream strip, but is unraced since finishing eighth in the GII Beaumont S. at Keeneland Apr. 10. Jockey Pat Day has the call on both horses and is making his longawaited return to the saddle. The veteran reinsman has not ridden since Nov. 26 following rotator cuff surgery.

next, the Oct. 4 Gll Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland, he proved himself a serious animal by manhandling a very good field by 4 3/4 lengths. Zito and company opted to skip the Gl Breeders' Cup Juvenile and instead focus on the first Saturday in May.

Hammered down to 1-5 favoritism in his first start in nearly four months, Eurosilver was hustled up to contest the pace from a three-wide perch, with Seneca Summer (Seneca Jones) and Tenace (Double Honor) to his inside. The rail-skimming Tenace was in a fighting mood as they rounded the turn for home, but Eurosilver lengthened his stride soon after and hit the wire five lengths clear of his rival. "I'm happy," Zito told Thoroughbred Times. "You wait four months and, no matter how you look at it, there's always a little anxiety. But everything worked out." Zito indicated the colt would be aimed toward the Mar. 13 seven-furlong GIII Swale S. on the GI Florida Derby undercard. "At this time, I don't want to stretch him out. He's already gone two turns [in the Lane's End], and that gives me five weeks [between races]." Lifetime Record: GSW, 4-3-1-0, \$305,600.

The stars of the show are likely to be in-foal broodmares, including hip 39, the nine-year-old Polish Affair (Ire) (Polish Patriot). Twice placed at the races, the bay got off to a quick start at stud, producing Portella (Ger) (Protektor {Ger}), who would go on to take the G2 German 1000 Guineas in 2002. She sells in foal on a May 22 cover date to Cheveley Park Stud's first-crop sire Medicean (GB) (Machiavellian) and is part of the Castlebridge consignment. Hip 44, Artistic Blue (Diesis {GB}), is also expected to attract her fair share of attention. Consigned by Milltown Stud, Ireland, the eight-year-old was the winner of the Listed Tyros S. and was second in the G3 Boland S. in Ireland. She is believed to be pregnant to Irish and Epsom Derby winner Galileo (Ire) (Sadler's Wells). Other sires represented by their in-foal mares include Acatenango (Ger), Agnes World, Hernando (Fr), Royal Applause (GB), Silvano (Ger), Slickly (Fr) and Tobougg (Ire). Several horses in training could also prove popular, including Terfel. Catalogued as hip 142, the five-year-old gelding has earned nearly £70,000 during two seasons at the races and has been placed three times in Listed stakes competition. Starting as the 9-4 second choice, Toronto Heights (King Of Kings {Ire}) just got the better of market choice Saviours Spirit (GB) (Komaite) in the second race on the card, a six-furlong maiden event for sophomores. The latter race was won by Fall In Line (GB) (Linamix {Fr}), a four-yearold gelding winning for the fifth time in nine days, who is scheduled to race again in a two-mile handicap at Southwell today.

Tim Easterby, trainer of 2003 G1 Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup winner and DBS graduate Somnus (Pivotal (GB)), was the unamious choice for the 2003 Willie Stephenson Memorial Trophy.
