NATIONAL CURRENCY SOLD On the heels of his impressive 6 1/2-length victory in yesterday's Listed Al Shindagha Sprint at Nad al Sheba Racecourse (see ATW, p7), South Africa sensation National Currency (SAf) (National Assembly) has been sold for a reported 12 million South African rand (approximately \$1.71 million), reports South Africa's Sporting Post. Plans call for a start in the G3 Mahab al Shimaal in Dubai followed by the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen. He will then continue his career later this year in England.

Gandolfo (Gone West--Golden Oriole, by Northern Dancer), a Group winner and twice Group 1 placed at two, has been retired to stand at Walmac International beginning with the upcoming breeding season. He will command a fee of \$6,000, live foal. RECORD TURNOVER AT FEBRUARY SALE Yesterday's single-session Tattersalls February Sale in Newmarket saw record turnover as well as the highest price ever paid for a mare in the five-year history of the event. Gross receipts totaled 893,900 guineas, a 16.2percent improvement versus the 2003 renewal of the sale while the average of 7,575 guineas represented a 20.1-percent gain against last year. The median of 4,000 guineas was a 14.3-percent boost on last year's figure. A record 70,000 guineas was the winning bid on hip 42, the nine-year-old mare Gipsy Moth (GB) (Efisio {GB}). Consigned by Lloyd Farm Stud, the bay was purchased by C.B.A. Ltd. and is carrying a foal by Halling. Bidding on Artistic Blue (Diesis {GB}) reached 74,000 guineas, but the winner of the Listed Tyros S. was led out of the ring unsold. A pair of offerings were sold for 50,000 guineas. Gipsy Rose Lee (Ire) (Marju {Ire}), who immediately preceded the eventual topper into the pavilion, was knocked down to the bid of Ballinamona House Stud and was also consigned by Lloyd Farm Stud. Terfel (GB) (Lion Cavern), a three-time winner and three times placed in Listed company, went to Danny Murphy and was consigned to the sale by Fitzroy House Stables. Said Tattersalls Chairman Edmund Mahony, "The individual highlight was, without doubt, the 70,000 guineas paid for the mare Gipsy Moth, which was the second highest price ever at the February Sale...but the record median has been the real feature of the day. The number and diversity of buyers have produced a vibrant trade from start to finish."

GO AHEAD FOR NEWMARKET AW TRACK

Planning consent for Newmarket's proposed all-weather track was granted at a meeting of the local Forest Heath District Council on Wednesday night. "The response from the Council was extremely positive at the meeting and we now have the green light to move on to the next stage" commented Newmarket's Michael Prosser, who added, "A number of expected conditions were attached and meeting these conditions will not cause us any problems. Next up is winning approval from the Jockey Club for our track design which we could only submit to them once we had planning permission. If the response to that is positive, the final crucial hurdle will be to get an allocation of fixtures for 2005 from the BHB. The fixture allocation process starts in April, so with planning permission now achieved we are well ahead of schedule." If fixtures are allocated, Newmarket's £6 million scheme, including a 10-furlong polytrack straight, would be completed in time for racing to start in January 2005. The track's Managing Director Lisa Hancock said: "Racecourse Holdings Trust, our parent company, has been looking for some time to include an all-weather track in its portfolio of 13 courses. All-weather racing is a huge growth area which is predominantly betting-driven."

CURRENCY WOWS 'EM IN DUBAI Consider the question answered. National Currency (SAf) (National Assembly), a champion at two and a multiple Group 1 winner in his native country, proved he could handle the dirt yesterday, making a mockery of the field in the co-featured AI Shindagha Sprint at Nad al Sheba. The handsome bay colt was having his first start of 2004, since tripling his career earnings when a one-length second to Silent Witness (Aus) in the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 14. Bet down in U.S. wagering to 3-10 favoritism, the four-year-old was alertly away from the stalls and was angled over to the near-side rail to set the pace. He carried a three-length advantage into the final 400 meters then sprinted away to win by a widening 6 1/2-length margin. "When you have a champion, they run on any surface," winning trainer Michael Azzie commented when asked about his pupil's first start on the sand. "He's a wonderful animal and a pleasure to train. His preparation here was so much better [than in Hong Kong]." Winning rider Weichong Marwing added, "I have to believe that he is going to get better for me and that there is more improvement to come." The winner is likely to make his next start in the G3 Mahab al Shimaal Mar. 6, the final prep for the \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen three weeks hence.
