

#### **JOSS COLLINS DIES**

Bloodstock agent Joss Collins, diagnosed with liver cancer in January, died Sunday morning after a short battle with the disease. He was 55. Collins worked for

the British Bloodstock Agency as director of sales for nearly 30 years and was a leading buyer at sales in both Europe and the U.S. Among the yearlings he helped purchase were future champions and leading sires Caerleon, Nureyev and Woodman. Collins also signed the ticket for Seattle Dancer, who set a world record for a yearling at auction in 1985 when selling for \$13.1 million. That Nijinsky II colt, who went on to capture

a pair of Group 2 races, was purchased for a partnership which included Stavros Niarchos, Robert Sangster and John Magnier. More recently, Collins was instrumental in the purchase of top sprinter Cassandra Go (Ire) and Group 1 heroine Rebelline (Ire). Collins, along with Tom Goff, left BBA in 2001 to set up Blandford Bloodstock Agency. He remained an active buyer in the U.S., reigning as the leading buyer at Keeneland January in 2003, and was among the top 10 buyers at the 2003 Keeneland September Yearling Sale. He also served as a consultant to Barton Stud in Suffolk, England. Funeral arrangements have not been announced.

#### NO ACTION THIS DAY

Hung out to dry on the final bend after trailing the field early, champion Action This Day (Kris S.) closed ground as they raced down the lane, but could do no better than fourth behind Master David (Grand Slam) in the Sham S. at Santa Anita yesterday. "I'm happy," trainer Richard Mandella said. "I'd have liked to have won it, but he finished strong and, as long as he comes out in good shape, that's the main thing." Action This Day, who was making his first start since taking the Oct. 25 Gl Breeders' Cup Juvenile, will likely go next in the Apr. 3 Gl Santa Anita Derby. Master David, a maiden winner at Thirsk last September, joined trainer Bobby Frankel's barn after running second in the Nov. 29 Gll Remsen S. and was coming off a third in the Jan. 17 Gll Santa Catalina S. #### IT'S ALL RANDAROO

On the lead from the start, **Randaroo** (Gold Case) shook off **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy) as they came into the stretch and pulled away to win the GIII Shirley Jones H. at Gulfstream Sunday by a resounding 7 1/4 lengths. The four-year-old filly, now first or second in

Undefeated **Frisky Spider** (Frisk Me Now), who made it three-for-three with a Gulfstream Park allowance score Jan. 25, had his final prep for the Feb. 14 GI Fountain of Youth S. yesterday morning. The three-year-old was clocked going seven furlongs in 1:28 over the Gulfstream main track and galloping out the mile in 1:42 4/5. Trainer Bob Durso also conditioned the colt's sire, who won the GII Hutcheson S. in 1997. Comparing the two, he said, "By this time, Frisk Me Now had raced about seven times--he was a little slower to come around and show us what he had. [Frisky Spider] has been with it from the first time he ran."

Canadian graded stakes winner Sheila's Prospect (Not For Love) brought a final bid of \$235,000 to top yesterday's opening session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington. The six-year-old mare, sold as a broodmare prospect, was consigned by Three Chimneys Sales, agent, and Lance Robinson made the winning bid. Sheila's Prospect won the 2002 GIII Bessarabian H. Out of Tequila Sheila (Hagley), she is a half sister to stakes winner Lite Twilight (Twilight Agenda). For the session, Fasig-Tipton sold 159 horses for a total of \$2,320,100 and an average of \$14,592. The median was \$5,500. At the Stallion Access February Sale of Seasons and Shares, which immediately followed Sunday's Mixed Sale session, a 2004 No-Guarantee Season to Theatrical (Ire) brought top price of \$45,000, while a Glitterman share brough \$40,000. In all, 21 stallion seasons sold for \$281,300 and an average of \$13,395. Three shares sold for \$56,500 and an average of \$18,833. The sale continues today at 10 a.m.

Blushing Indian (Cherokee Run), who cruised to a seven-length allowance win going seven furlongs at Gulfstream Park in his latest start Jan. 7, will make his next appearance in the GII Hutcheson S. on the Fountain of Youth undercard. Champion older mare **Azeri** (Jade Hunter), who joined trainer D. Wayne Lukas' stable last month, had her first work of the year at Santa Anita yesterday, going three furlongs in :35.20. "She went very well, excellent," Lukas said. The six-year-old mare has not been out since being moved from third into second in the Sept. 28 GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H.

#### Fogelsonger Headed to Maryland:

Jockey Ryan Fogelsonger, the Eclipse Award-winning apprentice rider of 2002, is heading back to Maryland after a short stint on the Southern California circuit. Sixth in the standings during the Oak Tree meeting and tied for 10th at the fall meet at Hollywood Park, Fogelsonger, 22, had just two wins from 35 mounts in through Saturday's card at Santa Anita. "It's hard to say in a few words [why the decision was made to return to Maryland], but what it boils down to is being happy and I'm just not happy right now," he said. "I miss my friends and family. People say, because I'm young, it should be easier to be away from home, but being 22 and so far away from my family is actually pretty hard. A lot of things are going on in my life right now and I think it's the right move to go back."

**INGLIS PREMIER SALE STARTS** Leading Australian consignors have taken note of the exceptional growth of Melbourne's only major yearling sale, and the catalogue for this year's William Inglis & Son Premier Yearling Sale has consequently been boosted by an influx of yearlings from Hunter Valley farms. The threeday sale, which begins today, includes offerings by sires such as Anabaa, Belong to Me, Danehill Dancer (Ire), End Sweep, Fasliyev, Grand Lodge, Red Ransom, Spinning World and Thunder Gulch. But the northerners might have their work cut out, because the sale has a record of producing top-drawer horses by less fashionable, but enormously reliable, Victorian stallions. Not so long ago, the Premier sale seemed a post-Karaka afterthought and buyers cried it was too hard to find nice types at Oaklands. Those who persisted were amply rewarded--Cox Plate victor Fields of Omagh (Aus) (Rubiton {Aus}) was a A\$50,000 graduate of the 1999 sale, and dual Group 1-winning sprinter Rubitano (Aus) (Rubiton {Aus}) cost A\$95,000 at the same sale. More recently, G1 VRC Sires' Produce S. winner Winestock (Aus) (El Moxie) was purchased at Premier for A\$21,000, while VRC Oaks runner-up Lashed (Aus) (Encosta de Lago {Aus}) was an A\$40,000 buy. Other noteworthy Premier graduates by Victorian-based stallions include Singapore star Ninetyfive Emperor (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}), prolific Hong Kong winner Meridian Star (Aus) (Dolphin Street (Fr) and a squadron of stakes winners by sizzling-hot stallion Encosta de Lago (Aus) (Fairy King {Ire}), who has some 40 catalogued this year. Nevertheless, with a sprinkling of horses by sires such as Danehill, Fusaichi Pegasus and Zabeel (Aus), the Inglis Premier Sale is an increasingly significant leg of Australasia's sale series, with Hunter Valleybased studs including Widden, Yarraman Park, Wakefield, Emirates and Arrowfield consigning horses. The Premier Sale averaged A\$46,127 for 342 sold in 2003. Buyers are aware that two-thirds of the Premier catalogue will wear the lucrative Super VOBIS incentive scheme stamp and, shuffling its incentive race series around, Inglis will run an A\$1 million Inglis Championship at Flemington next autumn for graduates of Premier I (set for today and tomorrow) and Premier II (to be held Feb. 12), and the Classic sale.

#### LION HUNTER DEAD

Lion Hunter (Aus) (Danehill--Pure of Heart {Ire}, by Godswalk), among the most popular of some 50-odd sons of Danehill at stud in Australia, was euthanized Wednesday at Oaklands Park Stud near Toowoomba on the Queensland Darling Downs. The 11-year-old, champion first-season stallion of 2001-02 from a modest fee of A\$5,000, was suffering complications from a fractured hind pastern, the *Sportsman* newspaper reported. The grey had sired dual Group 1 winner Lovely Jubly (Aus) and had 35 winners from 76 runners overall.
