HALFBRIDLED TO SKIP LAS VIRGENES

Feeling that his filly will benefit from some extra time before her 2004 debut, trainer Richard Mandella has decided to pass Sunday's GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita with Eclipse Award winner **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) and instead point for the Mar. 13 GI Santa Anita Oaks.

"She coughed a couple of weeks ago," Mandella said. "She's over it and she seemed fine when I worked her, but she looked a little light coming out of it. So I am not going to push her up against a wall. I'll wait and start her in the Oaks." But the delayed return does not mean the Kentucky Derby is no longer under consideration. Mandella said yesterday that after the Santa Anita Oaks, Halfbridled will likely make her next

start in the Apr. 3 GI Ashland S. at Keeneland. That race will serve as a prep for either the May 1 Derby or the Apr. 30 GI Kentucky Oaks. "I would have liked to start her in this race, but I've come to the point where I think if I ran her I might drive her backwards, not forwards. I can't do that. There's nothing seriously wrong with her. She just isn't in full bloom right now. Her hair still isn't what it ought to be. She was coming with her weight until she got that little cough. That, and trying to keep up with her, knocked a little bit off. In a month, I think she'll have bloomed on out and be in great shape again."

Mandella was not discouraged by the colt's performance in his three-year-old debut. "Thinking he would win anyway, I told [jockey David Flores] to come wide with him and not take any chances of getting in trouble," Mandella said. "I wanted him to finish good and have a nice, safe trip. As it turned out, I blew a race. I don't mean

we were giving him one. I truly believed he could do all that and still win. He probably would have anyway, but he hung a little bit in the last sixteenth. He looked like he needed the race."

Meiner Dupre gave trainer Yoshihiro Hatekayama his first graded stakes success with his win here and stamped himself as one of the leading contenders for the Japanese Triple Crown. The bay colt, settled in the back of the 10-horse field, showed an impressive late kick from the outside and swept to a 1 1/4-length victory. Winning jockey Hiroshi Kitamura said, "He was very relaxed and when I asked, he really responded." Third in an Oct. 19 maiden, Meiner Dupre won a novice race on Nov. 1 before finishing seventh in the G3 Tokyo Sports Hai Nisai S. in November. He ended his juvenile campaign with a win in the Dec. 20 Hiragi Sho last time out.

It's now nearly nine years since Forty Niner departed Kentucky for Japan, but his influence is still strong, as we saw last week. On Thursday, in Dubai, the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas was won by Little Jim, an Argentinian-bred colt by Forty Niner's well-bred son Roar. Moving on to Gulfstream Park on Saturday, a desperately close finish to the GII Davona Dale S. saw Forty Niner's son Coronado's Quest supply both the winner Miss Coronado and the third-placed Society Selection. The latter deserves a share of the honors, as she was giving weight to the two that beat her. Another of Gulfstream's feature events, Sunday's GIII Shirley Jones H., completed the hat trick for Forty Niner's sons when Gold Case's very speedy daughter Randaroo romped home more than seven lengths ahead of Harmony Lodge. Unfortunately for Funny Cide's many fans, a fourth important success eluded Forty Niner's sons when the Distorted Humor gelding could finish only third in the Donn H. The bold showing by Coronado's Quest's two daughters raised the prospect of a turnaround in the fortunes of the former Claiborne stallion, who has followed Forty Niner to Japan. It is worth remembering that Forty Niner appeared to be struggling at the time of his sale, but later enjoyed such a strong revival that he became champion sire in 1996.

Will the parallels continue between father and son, both of whom won the Travers and Haskell Invitational? I'm reminded of a comment I made in this column in May 2002, after Forty Niner's son Sunday Break had landed the GII Peter Pan S.: "Forty Niner now looks a definite loss to the American industry," I wrote, "but has America's loss proved to be Japan's gain? I wouldn't say so on the evidence so far. Sunday Break comes from Forty Niner's third Japanese crop and he is only the second winner at group level from these crops, following T.M. Southpaw, a Group 2 winner at two in 2000. "Could it be that Forty Niner--who raced exclusively on dirt during a 19-race career--is not an ideal stallion for Japan, where the bulk of the top prizes staged by the JRA are on turf?" Interestingly, Forty Niner's fortunes have subsequently picked up considerably in Japan, principally thanks to his progeny which have been racing on dirt in the National Racing sector. Utopia, Admire Hope, Koolinger and Biwa Shinseki are among those who have thrived under these conditions and it was noticeable that Forty Niner's feat of siring the first and second in a JRA Group 3 race last October came on dirt. Meiner Select, the winner that day, has added another Group 3 win on dirt this year. This preference for dirt has been so strong that one has to wonder whether a similar future awaits Coronado's Quest in his new home. While Coronado's Quest has been lost to Kentucky breeders, there are still several sons of Forty Niner, headed by Distorted Humor, available to them. Sunday Break has joined Luhuk (sire of Avanzado) at Gainaway, and Gold Case is no doubt heading for a busy season at his fee of \$7,500 at Adena Springs. Randaroo is one of the 66 named foals in Gold Case's second crop, which also features Betty's Wish, a Grade III turf winner, and Despreciado, a multiple Grade I winner in Puerto Rico. There are also an encouraging number of young stakes horses, such as Korbyn Gold, Megan's Appeal and Night Sky in his third crop--sired at a fee of only \$5,000. Gold Case's modest fee reflects the fact that he was forced into premature retirement before he had had a chance to tackle graded company. After taking his first start by more than eight lengths at Arlington in the October of his juvenile season, Gold Case headed south to the Fair Grounds, where he took the Old Hickory S. over six furlongs by four lengths and then maintained his unbeaten record with his end-of-year win in the Sugar Bowl H. over the same distance.

Sadly, that was the last we saw of Gold Case on the track, so the extent of his talent and stamina was never firmly established. However, his potential as a sire was soon underlined by the considerable success enjoyed by Forty Niner's first-crop sons End Sweep, Tactical Advantage and Twining in 1998, the year that Gold Case covered his first mares. Gold Case has sired Randaroo and Megan's Appeal from daughters of Valid Appeal. Randaroo's dam, Validated, numbered two minor stakes successes over five furlongs--one on turf, the other on dirt--among her total of six wins from 15 starts. While Randaroo's broodmare sire is a familiar name, the same cannot be said of the stallions responsible for her next two dams. Her second dam, Sail or Cerf, was by Cerf Volant, who owed his place at stud to his being a half-brother to La Prevoyante and to having a sister to Northern Dancer as his dam. The next dam, Sailing Gal, was a minor winner by Sail On-Sail On. Sail on-Sail On, who won only a maiden race from three starts, sired five daughters from Towson Town Gal, a dual winner by the talented two-year-old Cornwall. Remarkably, four of these five obscurely bred sisters now have at least one graded winner among their descendants. Sailongal is the second dam of Freedom Cry, winner of the GI Santa Monica H.; B F's Sailingal produced Faustus, a very talented English colt who won six of his first seven starts; Sailingon, who twice won the Chrysanthemum H., is the third dam of the triple Grade I winner Manistique; and Sailing Gal ranks as the third dam of Randaroo. Randaroo may now try to provide her formerly blue-collar female line with its third Grade I-winning filly by challenging for the Dubai Golden Shaheen, which shows what can sometimes be achieved with seemingly ordinary material.

TURFWAY JOCKEY ROWLAND DIES Michael Rowland, the Turfway Park jockey who suffered massive head trauma in a three-horse spill last Wednesday, died early Monday morning as a result of his injuries. He was 41. "Our deepest sympathy goes out to Mike's family at this difficult and painful time," said Turfway Park president Robert N. Elliston. "Mike's contagious enthusiasm and his drive for racing excellence will be sorely missed, but never forgotten by all of us at Turfway Park."

Rowland was injured during the seventh race when his mount, World Trade, fractured a foreleg and fell, throwing Rowland to the track. Two horses traveling behind World Trade were unable to avoid the accident, throwing their jockeys as well. Jessica Endres was treated at the scene; Mark Johnston suffered a broken collarbone. A native of Saratoga Springs, New York, Rowland captured his first win in 1979 on Tam's Princess at Delta Downs in Louisiana. He was a perennial leading rider at Ohio's Thistledown, securing 29 meet titles and walking away as the leading rider for the year seven times. Riding at Turfway for the current Winter/Spring Meet, he was two wins away from 4,000 career victories, a milestone reached by fewer than 45 jockeys. Rowland is survived by his wife, Tammy, and his daughters, Sara, 8, Faren, 15, and Randi, 20. Funeral arrangements are pending. A memorial service will be held at Turfway Park at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 11, in the Homestretch dining room. Turfway Park has established the Michael F. Rowland Fund at Fifth/Third Bank. Donations to the fund can be made at any Fifth/Third Bank location or may be sent to the Michael F. Rowland Fund, c/o Turfway Park, P.O. Box 8, Florence, Ky. 41022.

A RECORD DAY FOR ASMUSSEN Trainer Steve Asmussen set a North American record for number of wins in a single day when he sent out 10 winners at five different racetracks Saturday. The previous mark was held by J.C. Williams, who won eight races at Waterford Park in West Virginia on Feb. 24, 1979. Asmussen scored with three of four starters at both Oaklawn Park and Sunland Park Saturday. He also had two victories at Delta Downs and one each at Fair Grounds and Sam Houston. Through Sunday, Asmussen leads the nation in both races won, with 72, and money won, with \$1,357,030 in purses.

A FITTING TOPPER TO FASIG-TIPTON FINALE **Scoutingaround** (Deputy Minister), a daughter of Grade I winner Fit to Scout (Fit to Fight), brought a final bid of \$180,000 to top the second and final session of the Fasig-Tipton Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington yesterday. The unraced four-year-old filly, consigned by Hill 'n' Dale Sales Agency, agent for the estate of John Franks, was purchased by Gainesway Farm as a broodmare prospect. She is a half sister to GSP Back in Shape (Wild Again). There was one other six-figure lot during the finale, as **Dance for Thee** (Sword Dance {Ire}--Tea for Thee, by Taylor's Falls), a graded-stakes winner of \$614,704, was knocked down for \$100,000. The 10-year-old mare, in foal to Royal Anthem, was bought by Santa Escolastica from the Franks dispersal. CHRISTINE'S OUTLAW (c, 4, [Wild Again](#)--Marianna's Girl {GSW, \$202,538}, by Dewan) showed potential in graded-stakes company last year, running second by a nose in the June 14 GIII Leonard Richards S. at Delaware Park and by a head in the July 12 GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. at Monmouth Park, but finished off the board in his last three starts of the campaign and went to the shelf. Making his first appearance since a disappointing eighth-place finish in the Oct. 4 GIII Indiana Derby, the dark bay had blinkers off and was sent off the 3-1 third choice. He went to the front soon after the start, dashed through a half in :44.44 and six furlongs in 1:08.68 and drew off in the final furlong to win by six impressive lengths. Seek Gold (Touch Gold), an 86-1 outsider, closed for second. Aristocat (Tale of the Cat), making his first start since running eighth in the Apr. 12 GII Arkansas Derby, showed little as the 3-1 second choice, finishing ninth. The winner, a \$160,000 KESEEP yearling, is a 1/2 to Marastani (Shahrastani), GSW, \$499,276; Crimson Classic (Sky Classic), MSW & MGSP, \$559,338; and Foret Noire (Time For A Change), SW, \$118,163.
