GB PATTERN INCREASED BY 11

Britain will stage a record number of group races in 2004, according to figures released by the British Horseracing Board yesterday. The total of Group 1, 2 and 3 contests staged on the flat this year is to be 134, up 11 from last year. The changes, sanctioned by the European Pattern Committee, reflect a shift in the committee's willingness to upgrade races. Up until 2002, Britain was restricted, along with other European countries, to having just one race upgraded each year. Britain's representatives argued successfully that this restriction was unfair given the number of group races staged in Britain each year, and the maximum increase was lifted to 10 percent of the previous total. In 2003, 52 percent of the horses named in the International Classifications for flat horses were trained in Britain. "The changes that were agreed to in 2002 were designed to ensure that British racing has a more representative number of group races," said BHB communications manager Alan Delmonte. "A three-year program was begun in 2003 to increase the number of British group races to reflect the quality of our horses. In the past, Britain was disadvantaged compared to other countries, but this is now being redressed. The group-race programme is gradually fitting more accurately the requirements of British-trained horses." The number of Group 1 races has increased to 31 following the already-announced promotions of the former G2 Falmouth S. and G2 Sun Chariot S. The number of Group 2 races has been boosted by five to 40 and the number of Group 3 races is up four to 63.

if his speedy colt had progressed over the winter, trainer Rick Violette said, "I think he's done what's necessary, but you really won't know until he's started once or twice. He's always been a very willing work horse, so you can't tell that way. We'll see if he measures up when he runs against the top horses." Violette is already looking past Saturday's race to the Mar. 13 GI Florida Derby for Read the Footnotes, "It's a Grade I, million dollars," the trainer explained. "Where you show up in that race

will dictate where you go from there. You don't want to overtrain and have the Fountain of Youth be the best race of the spring for him."

Trainer Bill Cesare is hoping his bargain two-year-old purchase Second of June (Louis Quatorze) continues his assault on the sophomore division in the Fountain of Youth, but the former NFL player is just planning on enjoying Saturday's race. "There may not be another race," Cesare said. "Why look for something a month or two away? I'd like to win the Fountain of Youth. There's no guarantee that we'll win it, but I'm not concerned with after Saturday." Second of June's last four works have all been at one mile, most recently completing that distance in 1:41.3 at Calder. Of that unusual pattern, Cesare commented, "If you're going to run that far, you should work that far. I used to play football and you get ready to play four quarters, not three."

Cesare paid \$7,500 for Second of June at last year's OBS January sale. "The price is the price. I wish I could have got him for less money," he said of the GIII Holy Bull winner.

Graded stakes winner Mr. Jester (Silver Deputy) has added some luster to Sunday's GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds after the defection of up-and-comer Tapit (Pulpit) last week. The Steve Wren-trained colt was awarded the victory in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. last September after Pomeroy was disqualified, but achieved his most rewarding victory--financially, at least--in the \$1-million Delta Jackpot S. Dec. 5. The dark bay is unraced since that effort. Yesterday, he put forth his final tune-up for the Risen Star with a fivefurlong breeze in 1:01 4/5 at Oaklawn Park, Wren's winter base. "It was a good move," said the conditioner. "He galloped out [six furlongs] in :15 and change. He's trained real good. Everything has been on key." Mr. Jester is slated to ship to Fair Grounds today and will get acquainted with the New Orleans track with a gallop on Thursday. Other probables for the Risen Star include: Shiloh Bound (Cat's Career), Proper Prado (El Prado {Ire}), Spellbinder (Tale of the Cat), There Goes Rocket (Valid Expectations), Oneverycoolcat (Tale of the Cat), and Assault Commander (Deputy Commander).

Hollywood Story Ships In for Silverbulletday

Hollywood Story (Wild Rush) broke her maiden with style, winning by a convincing 2 3/4-length margin in the Dec. 21 GI Hollywood Starlet in her most recent effort, and will look to begin her sophomore season the right way when she ships in to Fair Grounds to contest Saturday's GIII Silverbulletday S. The dark bay, trained by John Shirreffs, is expected to arrive later this week. The ever-busy America America (Mister Baileys {GB}), who will be making her 20th start over her 15th different track, is also expected for the Silverbulletday.

Sometimes the alchemy which creates a great horse is elusive. The mare Geisha was sent to the court of Polynesian because she was a bad traveler. Since Polynesian stood at Gallagher Farm in Kentucky, which was just across Russell Cave Road from Dan Scott's farm, where Geisha was boarded, this allowed Geisha to be walked across. The result of this mating of convenience was Native Dancer, the "Grey Ghost of Sagamore," a winner of 21 of 22 starts and subsequently a breedshaping stallion. The mating was repeated another five times, but it proved to be far from a template for success, as only one of the subsequent foals--a brother to Native Dancer--was able to win at any level. *Cont. p. 6*

Sheikh Mohammed has a lot of brainchildren, and one of his best is turning out to be racing in the UAE during the northern winter. Maybe it's amplified by being starved of Gulfstream and Santa Anita (NTRA, are you working on this?), but this year's new UAE Racing Carnival looks to me like a serious winner. There have been three days (well, nights there) of racing so far, and they've been carried by the British satellite racing channel, Attheraces. There is a scattering of European trainers, no Americans of course until the Dubai World Cup weekend--but what we are seeing is very interesting: good-class 'Asian'-type racing, of quite a high standard, and with a strong showing from South Africa in particular.


Of the 16 Thoroughbred races televised by Attheraces and reported by Racing Post, nine were what are called 'rated stakes,' a.k.a. Limited Handicaps. Seven of the nine were for horses rated 90-105, which is presumably the same scale of Official Ratings used in Britain and throughout Europe. This is a pretty fair standard of horse, if you think about it, and the standard for the rest of the races is quite high, too: one maiden, three conditions races (roughly equivalent to allowance races in the States), one Listed, and two Group 3s. What my reading of the form suggests so far is that this is a kind of race-meeting which is ideal for international transmission as a gambling medium (even though, ironically, they don't have gambling at the races in the UAE): not too many races, and of a really decent standard. The world's very top horses and sires--those are still concentrated in Europe and North America. But below true Group 1 company, the form suggests there's a level playing field. Good 90-105 horses can come from a lot of places, and they're meeting up for good money in Dubai. Good idea.

A very few facts and figures: eight of the 16 races run so far have been won by UAE trainers, plus Kuwaiti trainer Rashid Bouresly has won two; that's all right, most of the horses are of course trained in the UAE. A Macau-trained horse won one, and last Saturday European trainers John Oxx and David Loder notched up wins. But the South Africans, who won big last year with Victory Moon and Ipi Tombe, are really in there firing: they've had three wins from 13 starts, with another six runners placing second, third, or fourth. Trainer Mike deKock had a double on the Carnival's opening night, and has had six in the first four from seven starters. Many of the best horses in South Africa are being targeted for this meeting, and they're getting results; plus, it's showcasing South Africa's best stallions. The Danzig horse National Assembly, a perennial Top Five sire in South Africa, has already had three sprint starters at the meet, including the impressive Listed winner National Currency; top South African sires Fort Wood (by Sadler's Wells), Western Winter (last season's champion, by Gone West), Al Mufti (former champion, by Roberto) and Elliodor (by Lyphard) have all had horses win or place in just three nights' racing. But the meet's biggest race so far, the G3 UAE 2000 Guineas, was won by the Argentinian-bred Little Jim, from a Southern Hemisphere crop by the now-California based Roar. Little Jim gave the Northern three-year-olds nine pounds, but won well for Sheikh Mohammed's son, Sheikh Rashid; I believe that was Sheikh Rashid's third Carnival win. Interesting stuff.

Three Draw Off...

The 'crop' of sires whose first foals were born in 1998, and were five-year-olds in 2003, has always looked a strong one; through the end of last year, this crop supplied three of the current World Top 20, based on APEX A Runner indices: Pivotal (3.83, world number seven); Unbridled's Song (3.63, world number nine); and Smart Strike (3.44, tied for 18th). Mind you, these are horses with four crops of racing age and maybe 300 year-starters, whereas more established sires will have two-to-three times as many runners over a seven-year period. *Cont. p. 4*

This means these relatively 'younger' sires' numbers can drop off faster (though this crop's 1-2-3 were also 1-2-3, in the same order, at the same time last year); but even if you allow for them to be inflated a bit by early successes, they still come up as pretty big numbers. Unbridled's Song is priced like he's a World Top 10 sire, but it has to be said that Pivotal, at £25,000, still looks cheap (even though you've long since not been able to get to him for this year)--and a season to

Smart Strike reportedly traded at \$25,000 NG at Stallion Access the other night. Given that he is currently the World Number One in B Runner Index (3.44, Grand Slam second at 3.25), and the World Number Three (behind only Danzig and A.P. Indy) for ABC Runner Index (2.77), as well as being in the World Top 20 with a 3.44 A Runner index, that doesn't look expensive either. Surely with these horses it should only be a question of whether you can get to them, not whether you should. *Cont. p. 5*

Last year at this juncture, Forest Wildcat looked this group's number four, but Anabaa had eight individual A Runners in 2003 and has moved into fourth spot, now with an A Runner index of 2.56; Forest Wildcat had just three A Runners last year, but still maintains A-B indices close to 2.00, and is the group's number three, behind Smart Strike and Unbridled's Song, with 53 ABC Runners to date. All things considered, Anabaa and Forest Wildcat probably round out this sire group's top five so far.

But there are plenty others of interest, including horses like Grindstone and the Seeking the Gold sons Mutakddim and Petionville still in Kentucky, while several of those banished from the Bluegrass--notably Roar, Lit de Justice, and Cobra King in California, and Afternoon Deelites and Ide in Louisiana--who look well spotted in their new residences. European Darley sires Mark of Esteem (2.31 A Index) and Halling (2.76 B Index, in the UAE this year) have plenty to recommend them, as do the likes of Maria's Mon (mares will have improved dramatically in 2002 after first crop included Monarchos). Hennessy (oddly, 14 of his 15 Northern Hemisphere A Runners so far are colts, Harmony Lodge being the only exception), and Honour and Glory--another whose mares will have improved dramatically, in his case beginning with this year's two-year-olds after he was Leading Freshman Sire in 2000.

Joss Collins...

It comes as a profoundly sad and shocking thing, especially to members of our generation and our seniors, that our contemporary Joss Collins has been so suddenly taken from among us. In a moment when the profession of bloodstock agent has come under scrutiny in some quarters, Joss was an example of how it can be done. He was tireless, he was good-humored, he was the consummate professional. Two moments for me stand out, as they do for many--the two times he was carried out of the Keeneland pavilion, after buying Nureyev (1978, my first trip to Lexington) and Seattle Dancer (1985). But also this: in the whole history of horse racing, breeding and sales, there cannot have been anyone who saw more horses at auction sales than Joss Collins. I'll bet he saw somewhere around 200,000 horses at sales in his career, so it must be fair to say that what Joss Collins hadn't seen could not possibly be worth seeing. Perhaps another project for England's newly discovered Federation of Bloodstock Agents, besides preparing for their impending accession to the ranks of licensees, could be to devise a fitting memorial to maybe the hardest-working guy in the history of the horse business. The answer to the question, what happens to all those hundreds of mares and foals you never hear of again after they're bred to these stallions? Quite a few of them seem to be in all these February Mixed Sales-one day at Tattersalls' last week, two days at Fasig Kentucky the beginning of this week, and four days' at Goffs, finishing tomorrow. The third-highest price on opening day Monday was €22,000 for a five-year-old gelding by Arctic Lord...think that might have been a jumping prospect. So this is a truly mixed sale.

The three sisters to Native Dancer didn't exactly prove dynasty founders either. In fact, only one was able to produce a stakes winner of any kind and, as far as I can find, until last year, only one graded stakes winner had appeared in direct female descent from Native Dancer's sisters. Rather ironically, this particular individual--the GII La Canada S. heroine Dianes Halotraces to Ancient Prophecy, a daughter of Dark Star, the horse who in the 1953 Kentucky Derby narrowly delivered the only defeat of Native Dancer's career.

Ancient Prophecy is out of Mysterious East, who was perhaps the greatest underachiever of all of Native Dancer's siblings. Unplaced in eight outings at the track, Mysterious East produced only three minor winners from nine living foals. Ancient Prophecy did not initially appear to be much more promising than her dam. Placed just twice in 14 starts, she produced six winners, including the minor stakes placed horses Zulu Prophecy and Castinette.

It is with Castinette, however, that the family began its revival, and in fact one might argue that the female line was in a sense the architect of its own salvation. A look at the pedigree of Castinette's sire Captain Courageous shows that he is out of a daughter of the great foundation mare Grey Flight. In turn, Grey Flight was a granddaughter of the mare La Chica, who also appears as granddam of Geisha, the dam of Native Dancer. The pedigree of Captain Courageous also contains Discovery, the sire of Geisha, and John P. Grier, the broodmare sire of Geisha, so Castinette has duplications of all four grandparents of Geisha.

Bred to the unraced Northern Dancer horse Staff Writer, Castinette produced the Bay Meadows Oaks winner Soft Copy, a mare who had Native Dancer and his sister Mysterious East 4x3 along with three crosses of La Chica. It was another daughter of Castinette, Olay Monique (by Drouilly, one of the few sons of Mill Reef to ever stand in the U.S.), who became responsible for the Sunny's Halo filly Dianes Halo, who we have mentioned above as the first graded stakes winner to descend from one of the sisters to Native Dancer. Now further luster has been added to this branch of the family by Domestic Dispute, who is out of Dianes Halo's half sister, the GIII Bay Meadows Oaks runner-up Majestical Moment (by Magesterial). A member of the third crop sired by Unbridled's Song, Domestic Dispute has been a graded stakes performer at two, three and four. At two he broke his maiden on his second start and subsequently added seconds in the GI Hollywood Futurity and Sunny Slope S. Early in his three-year-old season Domestic Dispute shaped like a classic candidate, winning the GII Santa Catalina S. in his first start. Although he then finished off the board in two more classic trials, he did earn his way into the Derby with a third in the GII Lexington S. Tenth, beaten 9 1/2 lengths, in the classic, Domestic Dispute ran three more times at three without making the first three. He began this year with a fourth to During in the GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup H., a race in which he suffered a tough trip. In Saturday's GII Strub S., Domestic Dispute reversed that result despite another less than straightforward passage, getting free of trouble less than a furlong from home, then running on gamely to catch During in the final strides.

In tail male-line, Domestic Dispute is six generations removed from Native Dancer, and he has Native Dancer and his sister Mysterious East 6x5x5. What's more, his dam not only has Native Dancer/Mysterious East 4x4, but she is also 5x5 to Grey Flight (who we noted as being from the immediate family of Native Dancer). Given the female line's time in the doldrums, one would have to think that all this reinforcement might have something to do with Domestic Dispute's ability. It will also be very interesting to see what effect it has on his performance at stud.

Classic GI Winner by the red hot sire of sires

DERBY/OAKS FUTURE WAGERS SET TO OPEN

The year's first opportunity to put money on your Derby or Oaks pick presents itself tomorrow as Pool One for both the Kentucky Derby and the Kentucky Oaks future wagers opens Thursday at noon, EST. The pools will each be open for four days and will close at 6:30 p.m. on Sunday. Churchill Downs' oddsmaker Mike Battaglia has made the mutuel field the morningline favorite in the Derby future wager at 4-1 odds. Eurosilver, who returned to win a Gulfstream allowance race last Wednesday, was installed the second favorite as a 6-1 chance. Wertheimer Farm's Halfbridled was made the co-favorite by Battaglia for the Oaks future wager, sharing odds of 5-1 with the mutuel field. Halfbridled was also represented in the Derby field as the 10-1 third choice. "The Kentucky Derby picture is always very wide open at this time of the year, but the early picture for Derby 130 appears cloudier than usual," said Battaglia. Pool Two is set for Mar. 11-14, while Pool Three, representing the final future wagers, will run from Apr. 1-4. See page two for complete odds.

Top Local Sprinter Dies Following Delta Stakes:

Trainer Troy Young's Toby's Success (Forty Won), who set a track record for 5 1/2 furlongs at Fair Grounds last month, collapsed and died immediately following his third-place performance in the Louisiana Premier Night Sprint at Delta Downs Saturday. An autopsy was not requested and the cause of death remains undetermined. "[Jockey] Gerard [Melancon] said that he let out a big, old grunt at the top of the stretch and quit running," explained Young. "He said the grunts got worse and he knew something was wrong. He got off on the turn and [Toby's Success] fell." Toby's Success had set a clear pace in the race before faltering on the turn for home. The four-year-old Louisiana-bred was making just his fourth career start Saturday. In his previous race, he zipped 5 1/2 furlongs in 1:03 1/5 over the main track in a statebred allowance race at Fair Grounds, a course record. "He was the fastest horse I ever had," said Young. "It was unbelievable what this horse could do for his size. He was so quick on his feet for a long-striding horse. He was a freak."

FANTASTIC LIGHT COLT TOPS GOFFS TUESDAY

A yearling colt from the first crop of champion Fantastic Light (Rahy) brought a bid of €130,000 from an unnamed buyer to top Tuesday's session of the Goffs February Mixed Sale. Selling as lot 390, the chestnut was consigned by Tipper House Stud. He is the fourth foal from the Miswaki mare Miss Queen, a daughter of multiple stakes winner Empress Jackie (Mount Hagen (Fr)) and a half sister to G3 Princess Margaret S. heroine Tajannub (Dixieland Band). But the price for the Fantastic Light colt was an anomaly yesterday, as only one other offering reached €50,000--a Night Shift yearling--and just three others broke the €30,000 barrier, leading to a downward shift in numbers across the board. In all, 129 of the 203 lots offered sold for an aggregate €912,600. The average was €7,074 and the median was €4,000. For complete results, go to www.goffs.com.
