WRITERS UP

A LITTLE BIT OF HISTORY REPEATING? by Jessica Martini

Stop me if you've heard this one before. A solid young European performer is purchased by an Irishman training in America and brought to the U.S., where his name starts popping up in rich three-year-old races across the country. Trainer Niall O'Callaghan, who followed that pattern with recent graded stakes winners Keats and Wiseman's Ferry, hopes the story repeats itself with his newest acquisition, Old Deuteronomy.

His emphasis on finding three-year-olds to race in the United States may be recent, but O'Callaghan, who has been training on his own since 1990, has conditioned numerous other U.S. stakes winners who began their careers in Europe.

"We had good luck buying horses at reasonable prices back in the '90s that we bought in Europe," O'Callaghan said of such horses as Miss Caerleona, Volochine and Inkatha. "They were turf horses. But recently, I've been trying, if I can, to get a three-year-old."

Of the change, he explained, "I feel like it's a prime year--it's the primest year that horse has. While most European horses have more prize money to run for here when they are five, six or seven, the three-year-old scene, I think is the most economically viable. There are a lot of spots in different categories. Every state has a derby and maybe even a prep for it. And, while very few of them are easy to win, there may not be as much depth in some of them and you can get second or third. If you keep picking up a check in all those places, a horse can earn a good bit of money real quick without necessarily being a top horse."

As an early example, O'Callaghan points to American Chance, who won the GII Jersey Derby for him in 1992.

"We stretched American Chance out in the Jersey Derby when it was \$300,000," the trainer said. "He was second in the Illinois Derby at \$500,000. That season he also equaled the track record in the [GIII] Lafayette at Keeneland going short. It's true that he was a better horse a little shorter, yet he had the ability to go a mile and an eighth and therefore ran for twice the prize money. Wiseman's Ferry and Keats were similar."

Keats and Wiseman's Ferry both began their racing careers in Europe with Aidan O'Brien, but went on to graded success for O'Callaghan in the U.S.

"What you expect and hope is that, at least they've got a two-year-old year under them and they're kind of set in their growth and their mind," O'Callaghan explained. "And they've been running, so you assume they're sound."

During his juvenile campaign in Europe, Keats was fourth in the 2000 G3 Norfolk S. He ended his two-year-old season with a third-place effort in the GIII Iroquois S. at Churchill Downs in his first start on the dirt. As a three-year-old, he went on to win the GII Lexington S., ran in the Kentucky Derby and ultimately finished his career with earnings of \$462,854.

Wiseman's Ferry was second behind champion Johannesburg in the 2001 G3 Anglesey S. and was fourth in the G1 Phoenix. Racing for O'Callaghan as a three-year-old, the chestnut won the GIII Lone Star Derby, the GIII West Virginia Derby and defeated subsequent Belmont S. winner Sarava to win a Keeneland allowance. He was second in the GII Ohio Derby and made a classic appearance in the Belmont. He ended his career with earnings of \$825,117.

"You're hoping that they've already shown some ability and that they might also be able to convert over to the dirt," O'Callaghan said of the quest to find a good European horse who will make a consistent U.S. performer. "You hope that they'll show the same ability on the dirt that they've shown on the turf. That might put you in a league where you can go to other places and run in races."

Old Deuteronomy could be another to fit the profile. Racing for O'Brien last year, the son of Storm Cat out of the Seeking the Gold mare Jewel in the Crown was second behind the highly regarded One Cool Cat in the G1 Phoenix. He was purchased by O'Callaghan for a new partnership and has been working at Payson Park since late January.

O'Callaghan hopes Old Deuteronomy will make a successful transition to the dirt, beginning with an allowance race sometime in mid-March.

"I try to buy them nowadays to hope they can run on the dirt," O'Callaghan admitted. "There are plenty of turf races, but there are a lot of tracks in the Midwest that have bigger dirt three-year-old races." Old Deuteronomy, like Keats and Wiseman's Ferry before him, may soon be on a tour of those Midwestern derbys and derby preps, but there is a fall back. "If he can't run on the dirt, if his form is not as good, then you hope to have the turf angle." If memories are anything to go by, this should be some show.
