He's been away for a while, but it didn't take very long for Klaravich Stables' **Read the Footnotes** (Smoke Glacken) to return to the headlines. Despite a 2 1/2-month layoff and faced with the unenviable task of hooking GIII Holy Bull S. winner **Second of June** (Louis Quatorze), the handsome bay colt outgamed his rival for a narrow success in yesterday's GII Fountain of Youth S. at Gulfstream Park. It was his first start since taking the GII Remsen S. in

CHAMP MISSING, VIRGENES STILL STRONG

While champion Halfbridled relaxes in her stall this afternoon, a field of nine sophomore fillies will go to work in the GI Las Virgenes S. at Santa Anita, the main local prep for the GI Santa Anita Oaks in four weeks, a race which will attract the divisional leader. **A.P. Adventure** (A.P. Indy), the undefeated winner of the GIII Santa Ysabel S. Jan. 4, could take another step towards making the Oaks a showdown of the undefeateds. Trained by Wally Dollase for Bob and Beverly Lewis, the Triple Crown nominee debuted with a five-length maiden score over a mile five days after Halfbridled's victory in the Juvenile Fillies prior to her 3 1/2-length victory over Salty Romance and **Wildwood Flower** (Langfuhr) in the Santa

Ysabel. "She's working great and couldn't be better," Dollase commented. "At this point, I think she's pretty special." The lone Grade I winner in the field is **Hollywood Story** (Wild Rush), who broke her maiden in style, defeating **Rahy Dolly** (Rahy) and others in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 21. Returning to action this afternoon is **Class Above** (Quiet American), who turned in one of the more visually impressive performances by a two-year-old filly last season in taking the Kentucky Cup Juvenile Fillies by 16 lengths. She makes her first appearance since finishing seventh as a 4-1 chance in the BC Juvenile Fillies.

Precocity...

An April 15 foal, **Read the Footnotes** was consigned to last year's Fasig-Tipton May sale by Niall Brennan, and turned in a sparkling pre-sale drill of :33 1/5 for three furlongs. With that obvious hint of his ability in hand, the New York-bred colt was knocked down for a sales-topping \$320,000 to Seth Klarman's Klaravich Stables and made an immediate return on that investment, winning a state-bred maiden by 9 1/4 lengths at Saratoga Aug. 17. The 2 1/2-length winner of an open first-level allowance at Belmont Sept. 7, Read the Footnotes turned in his lone poor effort to date, finishing sixth of seven to Birdstone in the GI Champagne S. Oct. 4. But he righted the ship in a hurry, taking the GIII Nashua S. over Aqueduct's one-turn mile Nov. 2 prior to his Remsen success.

Picking Up Where He Left Off...

Sent off the second choice to the in-form **Second of June**, Read the Footnotes showed good early speed and was guided to the three path to race just outside the favorite around the clubhouse turn and up the backstretch. The duo began to separate from the pack and had the race to themselves for the final three furlongs, with Read the Footnotes just getting the better of a thrilling duel. "It was a very hard race and he showed he's the real-deal horse,"

Violette commented. "It was the first time Jerry had to get into him, so I wasn't sure what to expect. He did a lot of things very good today. He settled, attacked when Jerry was ready and won a long battle off a layoff." The top two are likely to rematch in the GI Florida Derby Mar. 13. Supplemented to the race for A\$41,500, Reset overcame a lost tooth prior to the start and his relative inexperience to maintain his unblemished record. The A\$190,000 Inglis Easter graduate had made each of his three previous starts at this track and was sent off the favorite over G1 Victoria Derby winner Elvstroem (Aus) (Danehill). The bay colt, trying Group 1 level for the first time, became fractious after loading, causing Elvstroem, to become agitated and both were subjected to pre-race veterinary inspection. Once the gates flew back, Reset took up a prominent position stalking the pace from midpack, responded when set down for the final 300 meters and held on from Starcraft, winner in his most recent start of this track's G3 Debonair S. With temperatures approaching the 40-degree (Celsius) mark in Melbourne, Elvstroem could do no better than fifth and was pulled up in distress following the race, along with Bushido (Aus) (Desert Sun {GB}), who led early before dropping back to finish eighth of 10.

Limehouse could be another star in the making for his sire, who is off to yet another smashing start this season. The chestnut colt got his freshman campaign off on a high note, with three consecutive victories, including back-to-back scores in the Three Chimneys Juvenile S. and the GIII Bashford Manor S. Third to Cuvee in the sloppy GII Saratoga Special S. Aug. 13, he returned on 17 days' rest to be a tiring fifth to Silver Wagon in the GI Hopeful S. and made a favorable impression in his two-turn debut, finishing a solid third behind Eurosilver in the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity at Keeneland Oct. 4. Unraced since, the Dogwood colorbearer was sent off the third choice in the wagering. Breaking from the one hole with the scratch of Silver Rapt (Eltish), Limehouse skimmed the rail while chasing stablemate Deputy Storm through fractions of :21.68 and :43.73. Full of run into the stretch, he was eased out by John Velazquez to catch Deputy Storm with a sixteenth to run and pulled clear. "This horse is super game," commented winning trainer Todd Pletcher. "I was a little concerned when the one horse scratched because you never want to be on the rail going seven-eighths, but I told John not to be concerned, because this horse has done everything. He showed a lot of courage down the lane."

For Cat Fighter, timing was everything. Just weeks before she is scheduled to sell along with most of the horses from The Thoroughbred Corporation at the Barretts March sale, the four-year-old filly dug down deep to earn a valuable first graded stakes victory in the La Canada S. On the board in five of her previous six starts, the \$700,000 yearling purchase was fourth in her lone start at two before graduating at second asking sprinting at Hollywood last May. Second in her two-turn bow in Inglewood June 12, the dark bay was sidelined and returned with a second at Hollywood Nov. 20, scored a 5 1/2-length victory going two turns at that track Dec. 5 and was most recently a good third to Victory Encounter (Victory Speech) in the GII El Encino S. Jan. 18. Narrowly in front through fractions of :22.99 and :46.79, Cat Fighter looked to be in deep water on the turn when she was passed by Fencelineneighbor and had a length to find on that rival with a furlong to run. But, living up to her name, she counterpunched gamely from the rail and found the line first. "She keeps trying. She never gives up," said winning rider Alex Solis. "She's a very game little filly. Down the stretch, it seemed like the other filly was going to win easy, and all of a sudden [my filly] came back. She never gave up."

Bear Fan made for a happy homecoming for jockey Ryan Fogelsonger, edging clear late for her first graded stakes victory. The Cal-bred won the first four starts of her career before finishing second in the GIII Desert Stormer H. last June 7. Sidelined off a fourth in the July 13 GII A Gleam H., she returned to finish a neck second to the talented Ema Bovary in a Hollywood optional claimer Nov. 29 and was last seen when a troubled dead-heat third in the Sunshine Millions Filly/Mare Sprint Jan. 24. Tracking the early pace from a four-wide position, Bear Fan was patiently handled, went up after the lead at the three-eighths marker, took a clear lead into the stretch and held sway late for the victory. Maryland-bred Gazillion ran on gamely to earn her first graded-stakes black type. "They told me not to move on her," Fogelsonger said after the race. "When you're ready to go, she'll probably take you there first. I didn't nudge her until we were turning for home and then she took off. I knew they weren't going to catch her." Shadow Cast finished second in her first try at route racing, a Fair Grounds allowance going a mile Jan. 4, then added blinkers and came home a 2 1/2-length winner in an off-the-turf affair at a mile and a sixteenth Jan. 18. The second choice in her stakes debut, the chestnut homebred was content to rate off moderate early splits. She angled outside for the stretch drive and fought her way past the leaders in the dying strides to post a narrow score. "She was comfortable down the backside," explained winning jockey Robby Albarado. "I felt like I had horse every point of the race. Today she developed as the best one." Winning trainer Neil Howard won this event 12 years ago, when it was called the Davona Dale S., with a filly named Prospector Delite. She would go on to fame as a broodmare, having produced 2003 Horse of the Year Mineshaft. "It unfolded perfectly," the conditioner commented. "She broke in stride and wasn't too far back, which I was a little concerned about in the slop. She ran well and she closed well." The obvious class of the field, G1 Hong Kong Mile hero **Lucky Owners** got the best of Thursday's post position draw and breaks from the rail in his first start of 2004. The four-year-old colt comes into today's effort having won five out of his last six dating back to June, capped by his half-length victory over an accomplished group in the International Mile in his last start Dec. 14. "Obviously he was going to be hard to beat anyways, but drawing barrier one is a huge help," jockey Felix Coetsee told *South China Morning Post*. "He'll be in exactly the right place all the way." **Tiber**, trained in Europe for Highclere Thoroughbred Racing by John Gosden, took a 17-runner Goodwood handicap Aug. 1 and has progressed nicely in two starts in Hong Kong. Second in a Class 1 event over 1400 meters Dec. 14, the Ir£250,000 Goffs Orby purchase registered a 3 1/4-length victory over this distance Jan. 18. He sits on a domestic rating of 110, just two pounds less than **The Duke**.

Mr. Jester ships in from Hot Springs to launch his Triple Crown campaign. The dark bay, put up to the victory in the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile, was a good second in the Jean Laffitte Futurity Nov. 8 and makes his first appearance since defeating subsequent GIII Lecomte S. winner Fire Slam in the \$1-million Delta Jackpot Dec. 5. The dark bay colt figures to get better with distance, as he is a son of Future Pretense (Fappiano), second to Sky Beauty in both the GI CCA Oaks and GI Alabama S. in 1993. **Gradepoint** is perfect in two tries at today's distance and is in receipt of eight pounds from the choice. A homebred for William S. Farish and Greg Goodman, the dark bay is out of Class Kris (Kris S.), a five-time graded-stakes winner on the turf. **Polish Rifle**, second to Tapit in the GIII Laurel Futurity Nov. 15, was privately purchased off that effort, but must do better than his fifth-place performance in the Jan. 24 Lecomte.

Godolphin had nominated **Vespone (Ire)** (Llandaff {Ire}), **Naheef (Ire)** (Marju {Ire}) and **Sights on Gold (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) to the Apr. 3 G1 J&B Met S. at Kenilworth Racecourse. The horses would have had to be quarantined two weeks before their travel date with an arrival in South Africa no later than seven days prior to the race. They would then be required to remain in South Africa for a period of six days following the race. Racing has recently resumed in the Western Cape area of South Africa following an outbreak of equine flu, which left some horsepeople requesting a more stringent quarantine policy.

The Board believed it was in the interests of racing as a whole to approve RHT's request. Increasing the prestige and profile of the Vodafone Derby meeting even further is excellent for the sport. The existing G2 status of the Temple S., as an integral part of the European sprint Pattern, was considered very important by the Board. The BHB strongly encourages owners and trainers to support this long-established sprint at its new venue. It is important for the race that they do so." However, the decision to move the race has not gone down well in all quarters.
