Winner of the Dec. 27 GI La Brea S. and the Jan. 25 GI Santa Monica H. at seven furlongs, the four-year-old showed she could handle a route of ground last season, taking the 1 1/16-mile GIII Delaware Oaks by 6 1/2 lengths and adding a six-length romp in the 10-furlong GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. "This distance is much better for her," trainer Marcelo Polanco said. "Going seven-eighths,

she has to force herself a lot more. At a mile and a sixteenth, she can take a little breather. She will be a lot more dangerous going long." As the 121-pound highweight, Island Fashion gives from one to nine pounds to her six Santa Maria rivals. Adoration (Honor Grades), who upset the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff field at 40-1, gets in at 120 after finishing second to Star Parade (Arg) (Parade Marshal), 114, in the Dec. 7 GII Bayakoa H. The two make their 2004 debuts. Making her seasonal and her U.S. bow is **Preeminence (Jpn)** (Afleet). The seven-year-old mare, with 13 wins from 49 career starts, has amassed a total of \$5,037,956 in purses while racing on the lucrative Japanese circuit. She beat the boys in the Nov. 20 G2-Jpn Urawa Kinen two starts back and comes off a second-place finish in the Dec. 23 G2-Jpn Nagoya Grand Prix.

rel Park. The four-year-old colt, listed at 4-5 on the morning line, took his first three starts by a combined 26 lengths, including a 10-length triumph in last year's GIII Risen Star S. at Fair Grounds. But he suffered a displaced palate and finished sixth in the GII Louisiana Derby,

then fractured his cannon bone while getting ready for the GI Blue Grass S. "He is just an impressive horse," trainer Ronny Werner said. "Nothing he does really surprises me." But Leo Nechamkin, who owns and trains Gators N Bears (Stormy Atlantic), is hoping the favorite falters. "Badge of Silver will go out to the front and, if he does, hopefully we will be one of the horses waiting for him to back up a little...if he actually does," he said. Gators N Bears was third against top company in his last two starts at three, finishing 1 3/4 lengths behind A Huevo in the Nov. 15 GI DeFrancis Dash and four lengths in back of Shake You Down in the Dec. 21 GIII Gravesend H. He started 2004 with a half-length tally in the Jan. 24 Hoover S., but looks for his first win at seven furlongs.

"I think he's more of a distance horse," he said. "He wants further than a mile, really. The 2000 meters in the Derby is just what he needs now." The G1 Hong Kong Derby is set for Mar. 21.
