Working lights-out in recent weeks off the brief respite, the crowd's second choice jumped out to an early lead and set measured fractions while **Gators N Bears** (Stormy Atlantic) and Badge of Silver tracked intently. Well Fancied never let them get any closer than the length advantage he had established early and won his first graded stakes with something left. 

When Smoke Glacken covered his first mares at Gainesway in 1998, he was still basking in the glory of having been voted champion sprinter of 1997, yet his fee was a comparatively modest \$10,000.

The relative cheapness of his fee was no doubt a reflection of his none-too-fashionable pedigree, which had seen him sell for \$34,000 as a weanling and \$65,000 as a two-year-old. It also no doubt reflected the fact that the phrase "champion sprinter" hasn't exactly been synonymous with stallion success in the States in recent decades. While the likes of Tom Fool, Bold Ruler, Intentionally and Dr. Fager were all named champion sprinter during the 1950s or '60s, successful stallions have been the exception rather than the rule among the Eclipse-winning sprinters. Significantly, the ones which have tended to make the grade, such as Gulch and Cherokee Run, conformed to the pattern of their illustrious predecessors in that they, too, stayed at least a mile and an eighth.

Perhaps his fee also reflected the fact that he had become one of the few horses to take this particular Eclipse Award without having won the Breeders' Cup Sprint. In fact, the Breeders' Cup had not been on his agenda, because he would have needed supplementing for the race, but he never made it to the King's Bishop or the Vosburgh either, having been forced into premature retirement by chips in a knee.

Smoke Glacken still had solid claims to the championship, even though his campaign had ended as early as July 19. His only defeats in eight starts as a three-year-old had come on the two occasions he ventured as far as a mile and a sixteenth, when second to Touch Gold in the GII Lexington S. and third in the GIII Louisiana Derby.

His 14-race career established that he was in his element over six furlongs--a distance which yielded five wins from five starts--but he wasn't merely a speedball, as he showed with victories in the GI Hopeful S. and GIII Riva Ridge S. over seven furlongs and a win in the GIII Southwest S. over a mile.

That eight-length victory in the Southwest S. prompted some comments from his connections which were quickly disproved on the track, but which are interesting now that Smoke Glacken's admirable son Read The Footnotes is developing into a possible Kentucky Derby contender.

"Distance will be no problem for this horse," was the verdict of the winning rider, Craig Perret. Smoke Glacken's handler, Henry Carroll, also felt that a mile wasn't the colt's limit.

"My gut feeling is this horse doesn't look like a sprinter," was Carroll's reaction. "He looks like a horse that will stay. He's a big, long-striding colt. He's got a tremendous reach."

There were reasons for thinking that they might be right. Although Smoke Glacken's sire, Two Punch, had been treated like a six-furlong specialist during a short career, Two Punch is a son of the Kentucky Oaks winner Heavenly Cause. Then there was the fact that Smoke Glacken's broodmare sire, Magesterial, had been a Group 2 winner over a mile and a half in Ireland.

Fortunately for Read The Footnotes' growing band of admirers, there is more stamina to be found in the bottom half of his pedigree. His dam, Baydon Belle, raced at up to a mile and a half in Britain without showing much ability, unlike her half-brother Airport (by Lear Fan), who was stakes class at up to a mile and a quarter.

Baydon Belle's sire, Al Nasr, who excelled at around a mile and a quarter in France, is probably best known as the sire of Nasr El Arab, whose wins included the San Juan Capistrano H..

It is encouraging, too, that Read The Footnotes' second dam, Vague Prospect, is by Vaguely Noble, a powerful influence for stamina. Two very good winners out of Vaguely Noble mares were by Al Nasr's sire Lyphard, with Dahar winning the San Luis Rey S. and San Juan Capistrano H. and Sabin the Yellow Ribbon S., plus graded stakes over 11 and 12 furlongs.

Vague Prospect was a three-parts sister to Royal and Regal, winner of the Florida Derby--the likely next step on Read The Footnote's agenda. As Read The Footnotes' fourth dam, the celebrated Native Street, won the Kentucky Oaks, there is no shortage of class in his pedigree. All in all, it isn't so surprising that he was able to win the GII Remsen S. over a mile and an eighth at two and, judging by the way he finished in the Fountain of Youth on Saturday, he may well last a mile and a quarter.

Of course, there would be nothing new about a Kentucky Derby winner by a high-class sprinter, as Smoke Glacken's grandsire, Mr. Prospector, was responsible for Fusaichi Pegasus, and Mr. Prospector's son Gulch supplied Thunder Gulch. I still need a little convincing, though, in view of Smoke Glacken's stock having an average maximum winning distance of 7.01 furlongs.

What isn't in doubt is Smoke Glacken's ability as a sire. With 176 named foals in his first three crops, he has sired 108 winners, including 12 stakes winners. With that admirable filly Smok'n Frolic (who has a Grade III win over a mile and an eighth to her credit) among them, Smoke Glacken has earned the recent \$10,000 rise in his fee, from \$15,000 last year to \$25,000 for the upcoming breeding season. With better mares coming his way, he could well build on the solid foundations he's laid down.

#### Red-Hot Violette Readies Man From Wicklow:

Trainer Rick Violette, Jr. hopes his stellar Gulfstream meet continues when he saddles Man From Wicklow (Turkoman) in Sunday's GI Gulfstream Breeders' Cup H. Violette enjoyed a banner day Saturday, conditioning Read the Footnotes off a three-month break to a deadgame head victory over Second of June in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Earlier on the card, his lightly raced three-year-old Swingforthefences couldn't have been more impressive, rallying past a blockade of horses to win an entry-level allowance test. Seven-year-old Man From Wicklow, looking to defend his title in Sunday's 11-furlong contest, failed to fire off a nine-month layoff when last in the Sunshine Millions Turf. "I was very disappointed with the Sunshine Millions race," said Violette. "In hindsight, he probably never should have been in a race at a mile and an eighth. The fractions were sprint times and he just doesn't have that kind of high cruising speed." But Violette is confident his charge can reverse his fortunes Sunday, and was encouraged by the veteran's easy mile breeze in 1:43 over the dirt track at Palm Meadows Training Center last Saturday. "We feel he's training great, and he should be ready for a big race on Sunday."




