RAZYANA, DAM OF DANEHILL, DIES

Razyana (His Majesty--Spring Adieu, by Buckpasser), the dam of leading sire Danehill, died over the weekend at Juddmonte Farms in Kentucky. The 23-year-old mare suffered complications after foaling a Distant View colt. The colt is doing fine. Out of a half sister to Northern Dancer, Razyana failed to win in three starts on the racetrack, but was bred to Danzig in her first season at stud, producing Danehill. Named Europe's champion three-year-old sprinter in 1989, Danehill went on to be a leading sire in both the Northern and Southern Hemispheres. He died last May at 17. From nine starters, Razyana is the dam of eight winners, including graded stakes winners Eagle Eyed (Danzig), Shibboleth (Danzig) and Harpia (Danzig). She has a Distant View three-yearold filly named Far Shores and a Danzig two-year-old filly named Razzle currently in training with Andre Fabre.

SINGSPIEL SHOWS TOP TEN FORM

It's always been a bit open to question just how strong the 'crop' of sires is whose first foals were four-year-olds in 2003. Only three sires whose first foals were born in 1999 were among the top 50 Northern Hemisphere sires with 150+ year-starters, based on APEX A Runner indices through the end of 2003: Texas-based <u>Valid Expectations</u> (3.00, #23); Breeders' Cup Classic winner Alphabet Soup (2.93, #24); and Smoke Glacken (2.54, #46), sire of millionaire Smok'n Frolic and last weekend's GII Fountain of Youth winner, Read the Footnotes. In all, only eight sires with 150+ year-starters had A Runner indices of 2.00+. But three others with between 100-150 year-starters also had indices of 2.00+, including Alamshar's sire Key of Luck, and the runaway best sire of this group, Singspiel.

A top-class racehorse on grass and dirt, by Sadler's Wells' top European son In The Wings and a half brother to the high-class racehorse and sire Rahy, Singspiel's A Runner Index of 3.63 is good enough to rank him among the world Top 10. In fact, he would be equal ninth, tied with Unbridled's Song, and ahead of older European contemporaries Machiavellian (3.57), his own sire In The Wings (3.56), and top German sire Monsun (3.56), if he'd had enough runners. Sinspiel has nine A Runners from 124 year-starters, not even half as many as Valid Expectations (250), Alphabet Soup (256), and Smoke Glacken (256). But you can bet he'll cross the 150-year-starter threshold this year-maybe he has already--and if he sustains these numbers, he'll qualify for the World Top 10 for real. Considering his age ratings have improved dramatically each year (two-year-olds--1.20; three-year-olds--3.00; four-year-olds--5.08), Singspiel's future looks very bright indeed. He could even have a lot to say about the survival of the Sadler's Wells branch of Northern Dancer as a sire line.

Pulpit was the great white hope of this crop, and Langfuhr is the horse who's blown him and everybody else away on the earnings charts, yet neither figures among this group's top five (100 + year-starters) in terms of A Runner index. Pulpit, A.P. Indy's first top son to have runners, has eight A Runners from 180 year-starters, for a plenty respectable 2.22 A rating, which ranks him seventh. He's quite consistent across the board, with a 2.22 B rating, 1.81 C rating, and combined 2.01 ABC rating, with 29 ABC runners. Langfuhr has 11 A Runners, but actually leads this group with 311 year-starters, so his 1.77 A Runner Index actually ranks him just 16th among this group in that category. He has sired two very good horses in Imperial Gesture, from his first crop, and last year's Canadian Triple Crown winner Wando in his second--though Wando was rather handed his hat when he ventured down south, and Langfuhr's B Runner Index of 0.80 suggests it can be 'chicken or feathers,' as far as he's concerned. But his 1.69 C Index also indicates that is more his true level, so likely his B Runner figure will fill in this year. That's what you'd expect, anyway.

Valid Expectations was a Harry Mangurian/ Mockingbird Farm development, following a tried-andtrue formula which worked several times before, but, like previous Mockingbird graduate End Sweep, he might have turned out even better than they expected. Ambassador Farish snapped up Valid Expectations and stablemate Open Forum (18th with 1.47 A Index, but also 2.10 B and 2.00 for two-year-olds), and they're the kingpins at Lane's End Texas. So they should be: Valid Expectation's first Florida crop included 10 individual A Runners. Though he had only one earner of as much as \$208,000 last year, he had another nine who earned over \$100,000 each, and leads the sire group with 50 total ABC Runners. Alphabet Soup has very similar numbers to Valid Expectations, but a vastly different age profile. He has only an 0.82 two-year-old ABC Index, but is 2.57 for three-year-olds so far, and 2.51 for four-year-olds. Considering one of these stands for \$12,500 in Texas and the other for \$10,000 in Kentucky, you'd have to say they both look awfully cheap buys in the context of some of their contemporaries.

After Singspiel, the next six third-crop sires on A Runner index were all American, including, besides those already mentioned, the obscure but clearly useful Tejano Run (2.80), and Peace Rules's sire Jules (2.26). Four European stallions complete the list of 11 with 2.00 + APEX A Ratings and 100 + year-starters: Desert King and Alhaarth are tied for eighth (2.07), and Royal Applause and Key of Luck are tied for 10th (2.00). Again, the numbers are similar, and different. Though not included in these figures (because they occurred in the Southern Hemisphere), Desert King's feat of siring the Ascot Gold Cup and Melbourne Cup winners in the same year is mind-boggling. *Cont. p. 4*

Any purist worth his or her salt who is moaning about the decline of staying sires should go and get Desert King back from Japan--especially considering some of those who have been repatriated. But his desultory 0.19 B Index isn't so encouraging.

No fewer than 13 of these sires have two-year-old indexes of 2.00 +, headed by Key of Luck (3.59), Anabaa's 3/4-brother who was a sharp sire of two-year-olds even before Alamshar developed into Europe's (and the Aga Khan's) second-best middle-distance three-year-old of 2003. And I'm looking for a big 2004 for Royal Applause, who sired five new A Runners in 2003--all two-year-olds. That kind of statistic is almost always the sign of bigger things around the corner.

Correction...Last week's Bill Oppenheim column misstated Pivotal's current stud fee. Mr. Oppenheim feels the stallion's 2004 fee is a great value at £40,000.

In fact, Gradepoint, who realized that sum in the OBS 2003 Two-Year-Old in Training Sale, was the least expensive of the 38 yearlings and juveniles sold by his sire that year (although exactly how much of him was sold isn't quite clear as his breeder is recorded as W. S. Farish & H. Greg Goodman, and he is now owned by Farish and Mount Brilliant Stable LLC). He'd actually slipped through for even less at the 2002 Keeneland September Sales, RNAing for only \$25,000. *Cont. p. 5*

However, as we've seen with a multitude of high-priced auction horses, the sales ring is one thing and the racetrack is another, and Gradepoint is certainly proving his worth where it counts. After finishing third on his debut last year, Gradepoint has gone three-forthree. He opened his 2004 account with a win in a Fair Grounds allowance race and on Sunday he returned to defeated the accomplished Mr. Jester for the GIII Risen Star S. Clearly a progressive colt and one whose pedigree says that he'll get better the further he races, Gradepoint now looks a horse to keep a close eye on with a view to the Classics.

Of course, Gradepoint's sire A.P. Indy was the Leading Sire for 2003, and he's started this year as if he intends to hold on to that title. Currently leading all U.S. stallions by 2004 earnings, he's already sired four stakes winners this year, with Gradepoint being joined by undefeated A. P. Adventure--winner last weekend of the GI Las Virgenes S.--and the GIII Whirlaway H. victor Olmodavor as a graded scorer.

Although Gradepoint is Kentucky-bred, the distaff side of his pedigree is of distinctly Florida origins. In fact, the family was developed by the doyen of Florida breeders, Fred Hooper, from as as far back as Gradepoint's fifth dam Patricia P., a foal of 1941. For Hooper, Patricia P. produced three stakes winners, including two by his Kentucky Derby winner Hoop Jr. Patricia P.'s 11th and final foal was Pretty Pat, a daughter of another Kentucky Derby winner Swaps. Pretty Pat won only one race, but bred to another of Hooper's sires, Crozier, produced the tough gelding, Selecting, a stakes winner on the West Coast at three, four, five and seven.

Selecting's sister Queen Pat didn't show the class of her brother, but did win three times. At stud, she became the dam of three stakes winners, the best of which was Classic Value, the granddam of Gradepoint. A daughter of the brilliant two-year-old Copelan and inbred 4x5x4 to Hooper's sprint champion Olympia, Classic Value captured four stakes events, including the GIII Churchill Downs Budweiser Breeders' Cup H. and GIII Las Flores Breeders' Cup H. Mares from the Queen Pat family and by Copelan or his sire Tri Jet, have done particularly well when bred to Roberto-line stallions, this formula producing Roman Envoy, a graded stakes winner of over \$700,000; stakes winner Diplomat's Reward (both by Hooper's Roman Diplomat); and graded stakes winners Political Attack and Zillah the Hun (both by Hawk Attack).

Gradepoint's dam Class Kris followed the same pattern but with superior individuals, combining the multiple graded stakes winner Classic Value with Kris S., a much better Roberto-line stallion than either Roman Diplomat or Hawk Attack. The mating, which seemed so promising in theory, proved out in reality as the Kris S.--Classic Value filly, racing as Class Kris, won 10 races and \$582,129, including the GII Black Helen H., GIII Nijana S., GIII Buckram Oak H., GIII Boiling Springs H. and GIII Suwanee River H.

If there was a strong pedigree precedent for the mating which created Class Kris, one can't say the same for Gradepoint. The cross of Seattle Slew-line stallions over Roberto-line mares has been one which has seriously underperformed up to this point. In fact, we can find only three previous unrestricted stakes winners bred on the pattern, the best of which are graded stakes scorers Fleet Lady (by Avenue of Flags) and Parade Queen (by A.P. Indy). The reverse cross hasn't been much more prolific, producing only four stakes winners, the best of which is two-time Japanese Horse of the Year Symboli Kris S. Oddly enough, he is by Kris S. out of a Florida-bred mare by a son of Seattle Slew, and his dam is by a son of Tri Jet, so he owns a background which is very similar to Gradepoint.

When racing class and courage is augmented by good looks and a regal pedigree, a potent mix for any young sire exists. **BLACK MINNALOUSHE** offers commercial breeders a real chance of hitting the big time. 99

\$4.4-Million Purchase Shah Jehan Euthanized:

Multiple graded stakes placed Shah Jehan (Mr. Prospector--Voodoo Lily, by Baldski), who sold for \$4.4 million as a Keeneland September yearling in 2000, was euthanized in December after suffering from laminitis, according to Thoroughbred Times. Scheduled to begin stud duties this season, the son of graded stakes winner Voodoo Lily injured his leg when kicking the stall gate at trainer D. Wayne Lukas's barn at Santa Anita. Infection set in soon after and the bay developed laminitis. "All indications were that he was going to be all right, but when he foundered we had to put him down," owner James Helzer told Thoroughbred Times. "It was just one of those unfortunate incidents. He was a magnificent-looking animal. He just never put it all together, but we were excited to get him back to Texas. He would have had a good book his first season, that's for sure." Purchased as a yearling by Irish veterinarian Demi O'Byrne, Shah Jehan was stakes placed in Ireland at two before being purchased privately by Helzer. Under the tutelage of D. Wayne Lukas, he was the runner-up in both the GIII Withers S. and the GIII Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. His career record stands at 30-4-6-0 with earnings of \$238,222.
