he sold as a yearling at Goffs in 1975 and he went on to capture the G2 Waterford Crystal Mile, the G3 Blue Riband Trial and the G3 Desmond S. for trainer Vincent O'Brien. Be My Guest began his stud career at Coolmore in

1978 and sired classic winners Assert (Ire) and On the House (Fr) from his first crop. The champion sire of 1982, he is also the sire of Group/Grade I winners Free Guest (GB), Luth Enchantee (Fr), Double Bed (Fr), Go and Go (Ire), Pelder (Ire), Pentire (GB) and Valentine Waltz (Ire). "Be My Guest played a key role in the establishment of Coolmore as a major force in the European stallion business," said Coolmore manager Christy Grassick. "An instant success at stud, he was champion first-season sire in 1981 and champion sire in Europe in 1982--when his first crop were only three. That first crop included Irish and French Derby winner Assert, as well as Irish 1000 Guineas winner On the House, and following their early success, he has never looked back. Numerous champions over a variety of distances have followed, among them Dermot Weld's Belmont S. winner Go and Go and King George winner Pentire. He is also, of course, broodmare sire of our own Rock of Gibraltar (Ire), for whom we have great hopes." In addition to Rock of Gibraltar, Be My Guest is the broodmare sire of Group/Grade I winners Shamshir (GB) (Kris {GB}), Principality (Aus) (Victory Prince {Aus}), Stateway (SAf) (Free State {Ire}), Tomba (GB) (Efisio {GB}), Bachir (Ire) (Desert Style {Ire}), John's Call (Lord at War {Arg}) and Holding Court (GB) (Hernando {Fr}).

"It was an excellent work, although there was a little miscommunication with the way it turned out," trainer Jonathan Sheppard said. "He was supposed to break off two or three lengths behind a pair of horses and catch them at the wire, but they got away from him a little bit more and he didn't quite catch them. He did catch them galloping out, however, and the time was very good. It's as good as the other times he's had recently, so I'm very, very happy with it." The gray gelding made his 2004 debut in a Gulfstream allowance test Feb. 5, finishing third. "He's very satisfactory and doing well," Sheppard said. "Whether he's still up to [the Grade I] level, we'll have to find out Sunday." The Pennsylvania-bred With Anticipation has won 15 of 48 starts, including five Grade I races and has earned \$2,660,543.

The New Jersey Racing Commission Wednesday approved an agreement that could pave the way for as many as 15 off-track betting facilities in the state. The plan still has to get the OK from the state attorney general, and local approval will be needed for each of the individual OTB sites. Greenwood Racing, currently the only licensed OTB operator in New Jersey, hopes to have four facilities up and running within a year, all in the southern half of the state. NTRA Players' Panel Makes Recommendations:

The National Thoroughbred Racing Association's Players' Panel, headed by author and handicapper James Quinn, yesterday unveiled a position paper that outlined a number of recommendations to the industry. The Panel studied eight areas of concern, including the integrity of pari-mutuel pools, take-out rates, taxation, uniform medication and testing policies and customer service. Among their recommendations was the deregulation of take-out rates, giving the tracks the authority to establish and adjust the rates under the oversight of the racing boards and state commissions; an increase in the federal withholding threshold on racetrack winnings from the current level of \$5,000 to \$25,000; a decrease for federal withholding on winning bets from bets paying off at 300-1 to those that pay off at 750-1; and a short delay in post time when there is a horse scratched at the gate, to give bettors time to cancel or change their wagers.
