#### A DOGAWN SOLID BUENA VISTA

This afternoon's GII Buena Vista H. shapes up as a good battle between four-year-old fillies Katdogawn (GB) (Bahhare) and Maiden Tower (GB) (Groom Dancer), each making their first starts off winter vacations.

Diminutive Katogawn, a 10,000 guineas two-year-old purchase, put together a solid sophomore campaign, highlighted by a sparkling victory in Del Mar's GII San Clemente H. Aug. 2. Seventh in the GI Del Mar Oaks at the Seaside three weeks later, the bay was a rallying second in the Skirball H. at Hollywood Nov. 23 and got back in the win column with a nose success over Personal Legend (Awesome Again) in the GII Dahlia H. across town Dec. 20. The latter returns

to the turf following her runner-up finish in the GII EI Encino S. Jan. 18. Maiden Tower, the 118-pound highweight in the field, never finished out of the top two in her seven starts overseas while under the care of trainer Henri-Alex Pantall, including victories in the G3 Prix la Grotte and the G2 Prix de Sandringham. The dark bay was given a summer vacation before being transferred to the U.S., where she was nosed out of the victory by Film Maker in the GI Queen Elizabeth II Cup at Keeneland in October. A homebred for Sheikh Mohammed, she makes her first appearance since finishing a troubled seventh in the Nov. 30 GI Matriarch S. over this trip at Hollywood.

## WITH ANTICIPATION INJURED With Anticipation

(Relaunch), who would have been one of the favorites for tomorrow's GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H., has been withdrawn from consideration for the race after aggravating an injury suffered last summer while preparing for the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. The nine-year-old gelding, who returned from a five-month absence to be third to Del Mar Show in a Feb. 5 allowance prep at Gulfstream, breezed a solid five furlongs 1:00 3/5 in company Thursday morning, but was noticeably uncomfortable in his stall later in the day. "I think that work aggravated his old injury," trainer Jonathan Sheppard told Daily Racing Form, referring to a torn tendon in the ankle of his left foreleg. As for future plans, Sheppard told the Form, "I'm guessing we'll call it a day, but I won't make anything official until I've spoken with Mr. [George] Strawbridge." With Anticipation, a son of 1986 Breeders' Cup Distaff runner-up Fran's Valentine, races for Strawbridge's Augustin Stables. Should he be retired, With Anticipation would conclude his career with a record of 48-15-9-8 and earnings of \$2,660,543.

## DARLEY FLYING START--PART II by Andy Belfiore and Lucas Marquardt

For Tan Kah Soon, the Flying Start program was more than an educational opportunity; it was an introduction to a new hemisphere. Soon grew up in Malaysia and assisted at his father's training center there, and attended sales in Australia and Malaysia. Having obtained a degree in e-commerce from Murdoch University in Western Australia, Soon was hoping to expand his horizons in racing and found just what he was looking for in Flying Start.

Still, the adjustment to entirely new environs might have proved daunting to many, but upon arrival in the British Isles last August, his first time out of the Australasia, Soon had few problems finding his stride.

"I had lived away from home before, so it wasn't so different," says Soon. "I fell in quite quickly."

Soon was struck by the differences between the Thoroughbred industries in his homeland and England, Ireland and, later, the United States, especially the scope of the breeding facilities.

"The breeding industry is quite different back in Malaysia," states Soon. "Land is scarce there, so you don't see the big paddocks, the sprawling land. Because of this, the breeding industry is much smaller. Still in its infancy, you might say. Most of the owners buy their horses from New Zealand and Australia."

Formerly intent on following in his father's footsteps as a trainer in Malaysia, Soon has welcomed the variety of opportunities that continue to unfold as Flying Start progresses.

"I'm certainly keeping my options open," says Soon. "I'm open to changes. I'm learning more about the breeding industry. We'll be immersed in breeding here in Kentucky for the next few months and then in Australia, and I think I'll only become more interested."

Being from the first class of the Flying Start program, it is to be expected that not everything would run smoothly.

Soon says that there is good communication between staff and students, however, to make sure that everyone is getting the maximum benefit from the course.

"We're definitely the guinea pigs," explains Soon. "The learning, in many ways, is a two-way street. But everyone is focused on trying to make things continually better."

Another student who has been introduced to a whole new perspective on the business is Andriy Ostapchuk. The Ukrainian had limited experience with Thoroughbreds when he moved to Ireland in 2001 looking for work in the industry. He landed a job at Sheikh Mohammed's Ragusa Stud.

"There's not too much going on in racing in the Ukraine," admits Andriy. "There is one track, but it is not big. I moved to Ireland hoping to get a job at Sheikh Mohammed's stud, one of the best in the country. Later, I heard about the Flying Start program, and thought it sounded very interesting."

Like Tan Kah Soon, Andriy was struck by the differences between studs in different countries.

"In Ireland and England, everything is smaller," he remarks. "In Kentucky, everything is big. It takes 10 or 20 minutes just to get from stud to stud. Even the racing is different, with the year-round racing in the States."

The group was able to recently visit Keeneland and Churchill, two tracks that retain their beauty even in the winter months, and Thursday attended lectures at the University of Louisville.

"I can't wait until the Kentucky Derby," says Andriy. "I'd love to be able to see some of those horses."

On future endeavors, Andriy remains noncommittal.

"I haven't quite figured out what I want to do afterwards," he says. "It's difficult to judge what kinds of opportunities will be available when the program ends. But I'm optimistic that there will be many opportunities."

One of the benefits of the program, laughs Andriy, is learning what you don't want to do.

"We went to farrier school a few weeks back, and that is really hard work, being under a horse for seven hours a day," reveals the Ukranian. "No, you want to be in management."

## On Brink of Retirement, Rize Lands In New Barn:

Yesterday was supposed to mark the final racetrack appearance of 2000 GIII Iselin H. winner Rize (Theatrical {Ire}), but his career will continue after the eightyear-old was claimed by trainer Scott Lake for \$32,000 out of a 1 1/2-length victory at Gulfstream Park. Originally trained by Frank Gomez, Rize was purchased by the Runnin Horse Farm of Les Steinger from his owner and breeder Allen Paulson as part of a package deal in late 1999 and went on to win the Iselin by nine lengths the following summer. The winner of the Creme Fraiche H. in November 2001, dark bay raced just three times in early 2002, but was retired from racing and was sent to a farm in Ocala. He began to show signs last summer that he was sound enough to return to the track and that he did, with three victories from five starts over the last 2 1/2 months. Rize earned well in excess of \$600,000 for Runnin Horse Farm and won 10 of his 33 starts. For Steinger, the parting was bittersweet. "It's a part of the game, but you get real close to these horses. He was one of my favorites," he said yesterday. "He's a little long in the tooth and when you get to that age, you're not without your physical problems, but he was classy enough to overcome them." Rize's new owner is the Gumpster Stable LLC.

#### **Delmonico Cat Retired:**

Delmonico Cat (Storm Cat--Glass Ceiling, by Pirate's Bounty), winner of this year's GIII Honey Fox H. at Gulfstream Park, has been retired from racing. A homebred for Mr. & Mrs. Marty Wygod, the dark bay filly was trained throughout her career by Bill Mott and earned her first black type with a narrow victory in the Possibly Perfect S. at Arlington Park last summer. The winner of the Flawlessly S. at the Chicago oval two starts hence, she was sixth to close the season in the GIII Cardinal H. at Churchill before earning her important graded victory in the Honey Fox on opening day of the Gulfstream meet. She ended her career with an 11th-place effort in the Feb. 10 Endeavour S. at Tampa. She retires to the breeding shed with a record of 15-6-5-2 and earnings of \$273,804. According to Martin Wygod, she is likely to be bred this year to Gone West.

CLANGALANG INJURED, RETIRED The G1 AJC Australian Derby hero Clangalang (Aus) (Clang {Aus}--Little Recruit {NZ}, by Staff Sergeant {GB}) has been retired after sustaining suspensory injuries in his forelegs, according to AAP Racing. Stud plans have not been determined for the four-year-old. "He is equal to the best horses I have trained," conditioner Gerald Ryan told AAP Racing. Clangalang returned sore from a gallop Tuesday and was sent to Randwick Equine Hospital for examination. "He has got a lesion on his near-side suspensory up high and a lesion on his off-side suspensory," Ryan continued. "It was either retire him or give him twelve months in the paddock, so we thought it was in his best interests to go to stud." Following his victory in the Australian Derby, Clangalang was ruled out of the G1 Caulfield Cup with a suspected suspensory problem, but returned to land the G1 Epsom H. "He won the Derby, but I think the Epsom was his best win because he was virtually first-up after an injury to his off-front joint and still won," Ryan added. "When you have done so much work with a horse, looked after them, travelled with them, you grow to like them and form a bond with them, especially when you get one who puts as much into his racing as he did. Not many can do what he's done."
