#### ISLAND FASHION TO FACE BOYS IN BIG 'CAP?

Citing a desire to keep his star fillies' options open, trainer Marcelo Polanco nominated Island Fashion (Petionville) to the GI Santa Anita H. at Santa Anita Park Mar. 6. "If she comes up good to the Santa Anita H. and we get good weight, we're going to think about

it," said Polanco. "I'd have to think that my filly would be tough." Island Fashion, winner of the GI La Brea S. and GI Santa Monica H. in her two latest starts, worked four furlongs in :47.40 Wednesday. "I got her in :47 2/5 and [she] galloped out [five furlongs] in a minute and two fifths," said

Polanco. Among the other likely candidates for the \$1-million event for older horses is Pleasantly Perfect, Southern Image, Buddy Gil, Sarava, Saint Buddy, Olmodavor, Toccet and Domestic Dispute. Polanco will also nominate the four-year-old filly to the GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn Park Apr. 3 and Santa Anita's GI Santa Margarita H. Mar. 14.

#### In other Big 'Cap News ...

The Richard Mandella-trained duo of GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony) and multiple graded stakes winner Olmodavor (A.P. Indy) worked in company Tuesday, going a mile in 1:37.20, while 2002 Belmont S. winner Sarava (Wild Again) drilled five panels in 1:00. Also on the Santa Anita work tab Tuesday: Saint Buddy (Saint Ballado) breezed six furlongs in 1:11.20; Toccet (Awesome Again), winner of the GI Champagne and GI Hollywood Futurity in 2002, covered the same distance in 1:14.40; GI Santa Anita Derby winner Buddy Gil (Eastern Echo) went seven furlongs in a bullet 1:25.20 and Domestic Dispute (Unbridled's Song), winner of the GIl Strub S. Feb. 7, negotiated four panels in :47.40. The move was the eighth fastest of 104 works at the distance.

#### Tapit Breezes at Laurel

Triple Crown hopeful **Tapit** (Pulpit), unraced since his victory in the GIII Laurel Futurity Nov. 15, worked seven furlongs in company yesterday at the Maryland track in 1:29 4/5. Leading jockey Ramon Dominguez was aboard for the move. After galloping one time up the stretch, the grey jogged back and broke off about three lengths behind his workmates at the seven-eighths pole. Well held by Dominguez behind fractions of :27 2/5 for the opening quarter mile and :53 for the half, Tapit was given his head turning into the stretch, split his co-workers approaching the eighth pole and was clocked the seven-eighths in 1:29 4/5, with his final furlong covered in :11 3/5. Owned by Winchell Thoroughbreds LLC and trained by Michael Dickinson, Tapit is perfect in two career starts with earnings of \$79,800.

#### Three-year-olds Swarm Santa Anita Work tab

With more rain imminent in Southern California, a total of 315 horses were out for morning work Wednesday at Santa Anita. Prepping for his second start of the season, Eclipse Award winning juvenile Action This Day (Kris S.) worked six furlongs in 1:13 3/5. "He went great, just full of himself," trainer Richard Mandella commented. "He's coming along great." The bay colt makes his next appearance in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 13. Mandella also sent Halfbridled (Unbridled) out for a five-furlong breeze Tuesday morning. The homebred covered the distance in :59 for the GI Santa Anita Oaks...Also on the Triple Crown trail, GI Hollywood Futurity hero Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) breezed three quarters of a mile in 1:12 4/5 with jockey Mike Smith in the saddle. He goes next in the GII San Rafael S. Mar. 6...Also on Wednesday's work tab: Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm), 5f in 1:01.20; Victory U.S.A (Victory Gallop), 5f in :59.80; St Averil (Saint Ballado), 7f in 1:27.40 and Minister Eric (Old Trieste), 4f in:49 (turf).

# ☆ FASIG-TIPTON WRAP UP ☆)

#### A Foundation Mare for the Ryans...

Late Tuesday evening, Ger Morrin, the stud manager of Cathal Ryan's Swordlestown Stud in Naas, Ireland, was watching the live feed of the Fasig-Tipton Calder sale over the Internet. And with good reason.

Four months ago, bloodstock agent Peter Doyle, representing the Ryan family, went to \$700,000 to acquire the six-year-old mare <u>Hidden Storm</u> (Storm Cat) at the Keeneland November sale, carrying a foal from what what will eventually become the final crop of Danehill. Tuesday night, at around 10:30 p.m. Irish time, the mare made headlines as the dam of the world record \$4.5-million juvenile at Calder.

"We're delighted that we have the dam and we hope the horse goes on to justify his price," said Morrin, who works for Cathal Ryan at Swordlestown Stud. Ryan, 44, is the son of Dr. Tony Ryan, owner of Castleton Lyons farm. Hidden Storm is boarded at that Lexington, Kentucky, nursery. "If he does, it will be great. It's a great start for the mare. He's obviously shown potential to make that sort of money at this stage," he added.

From an outstanding Lane's End family which includes Up The Flagpole and Horse of the Year Mineshaft, Hidden Storm, a half sister to MGSW Jazz Club, was purchased by Satish Sanan's Padua Stables for \$360,000 at the 1998 Keeneland September sale and was to be trained by D. Wayne Lukas. However, the bay never made it to the races and was bred in 2001 to reigning Kentucky Derby winner Fusaichi Pegasus. She was later sold at the Keeneland November sale, where she was purchased for \$450,000 carrying Tuesday's record setting colt in utero. That colt brought \$270,000 at last year's Fasig-Tipton Saratoga sale. Not mated in 2002, Hidden Storm was back in foal for 2003, this time to Danehill and was consigned to the November sale by Eaton Sales on behalf of an undisclosed client.

"She was a very good looking mare, very correct for a Storm Cat," Ryan explained. "She had very good knees for a Storm Cat. She's a big strong mare and had a great pedigree on top of the fact that she was in foal to Danehill."

Hidden Storm gave birth to a filly at Castleton Lyons on Jan. 12 and was bred back earlier this month to Ashford Stud's Grand Slam. So, what does the future hold for the mare?

"If she's a successful mare, we'll definitely hold on to her," Morrin said. "She's a foundation mare, hopefully. [The Fusaichi Pegasus] looks the real deal-- physically and the way that he breezed and all that. We just hope that he goes on and gives the mare a great start."

Morrin indicated that the Danehill filly's progress will be monitored before a decision is made on whether to keep her or sell her at auction.

#### A Home Run for Grand Slam Filly...

The demand for offspring by hot young sire Grand Slam continued at Tuesday's Fasig-Tipton Calder Sale, with a juvenile filly by the Coolmore stallion selling for \$600,000 to Stan Fulton's Fleetwood/NW Management, making her the third-highest priced filly at the auction. Going through the ring as hip 297, she was consigned by Equine Legacy Farm on behalf of a partnership consisting of Mike Paramore and Pat and Donna McLaughlin of Classic Oaks Farm. Though a \$42,000 Keeneland November yearling, the dark bay was acquired privately by the partnership in July of her yearling year. "We liked her conformation," said Paramore, "and Grand Slam wasn't as hot then." The McLaughlins also sold a homebred Golden Missile colt out of Chasseresse (Jade Hunter) for \$200,000 to Fusao Sekiguchi. Residents of Ocala, the McLaughlins acquired numerous yearlings last year and will be pinhooking several more this season at OBS and Keeneland April.

ing the death of his son, Einar Paul Robsham Jr., in the early 1980s. His first big score came when his homebred Pretty Discreet (Private Account) captured the GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. She went on to produce Pretty Wild (Wild Again), who was the runner-up in both the GI Hopeful S. and the GI Futurity S. at two in 2002. In 2003, Robsham's maroon and gold colors were carried by Grade I winner Trust N Luck (Montbrook) and Grade III winner Feline Story (Tale of the Cat). But in spite of his success, Robsham found pleasure in everyday racing. "Sometimes the smallest races are the most exciting," he said. "What I enjoy most is watching one of my horses come from behind and catching the leader at the last jump." According to Thoroughbred Times, memorial contributions in Robsham's name are being accepted by New Vocations Racehorse Adoption Program in Laura, Ohio.


