SILVER WAGON SIDELINED

GI Hopeful S. winner **Silver Wagon** (Wagon Limit) has been sidelined by chips in both knees and will undergo surgery, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. The injuries

were discovered after the Buckram Oak colorbearer breezed five furlongs at Calder Race Course Monday in 1:02.60. "The verdict is that he needs surgery in both knees," Buckram Oak racing manager Mohammed Moubarak told the *Times*. "It's a shame; he was on his way." Silver Wagon, on the board in all six of his starts to date, was a 7 1/2length maiden winner at Saratoga last August and returned to win the Hopeful by four lengths over Chapel Royal. This season, the gray chased Second of June home in the GIII Holy Bull S. before finishing third

behind Read the Footnotes and Second of June in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Feb. 14. Moubarak said that Silver Wagon could return to the races in six months.

NEWMARKET CUTS GUINEAS PURSES

Officials at Newmarket racecourse have cut the total purse for both the G1 1000 and 2000 Guineas. The move, which represents a reduction of 6.6 percent to £300,000 for each Classic, is a direct consequence of the terminated Attheraces deal. "It's a very frustrating situation and one which we hope will be resolved with a new media rights deal very soon," Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser told Racing Post. "At £300,000 each, they will still be the richest races of their kind in Europe, ahead of the French and Irish Guineas and the St James's Palace S. and Coronation S. at Royal Ascot." The poker website Ultimatebet.com has stepped in to sponsor the premier mile races.

STORM FLAG FLYING RETURNS VICTORIOUS

Storm Flag Flying (Storm Cat), champion two-year-old filly of 2002, returned to the races yesterday at Gulfstream and came away with her first victory since taking that year's GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in the day's eighth race, a one mile and 70 yard optional

JOHN RUSSELL DIES John Russell, trainer of champion three-year-old filly of 1972 Susan's Girl, died Wednesday night at his home in Del Mar, California, after a long battle with cancer. He was 67. The son of



English trainer James Russell, John won more than 100 stakes races at tracks from Paris to Hong Kong to the U.S. He retired in 1995 and became a freelance writer for various Thoroughbred magazines. He published a novel. "Dark Horses," and served as Susan's Girl Santa Anita photo chairman of the Advisory Board to the California Equine Retire-

ment Foundation from 1999 to 2001. "He was a great man, a great horseman and a great friend," said trainer Eoin Harty, who worked with Russell for eight years. "He was a great mentor, as well." Susan's Girl, raced by breeder Fred Hooper, won the Kentucky Oaks, Acorn S. and Beldame as a three-year-old and won the Santa Margarita H. as a four-year-old. She was inducted into the Racing Hall of Fame in 1976. Russell is survived by his wife, Diane, and two children, Jonathan and Tristan. Funeral services are pending.

Happy Giggle was a three-time stakes winner as a two-year-old, including a victory in the G2 VRC Maribyrnong Plate S. The record price edged last year's topper, a Danehill colt who sold for A\$250,000. Meanwhile, the sale aggregate shattered all previous records, surging over 75 percent to A\$14.1 million, which officials attributed to an improvement of stock and a larger catalog. The average price for the select sessions also rose over 15 percent to just shy of A\$40,000. The buyback rate dropped from 26 percent in 2003 to 19 percent this year. "The sale has been a resounding success," Magic Millions Adelaide Manager Grant Burns declared. "A number of records were broken and for the gross to jump some 75 percent was amazing."
