PEACE PREVAILS IN BATTLE OF NEW ORLEANS

"If he's in front turning for home, they'll pay hell getting by him." That's how trainer Bobby Frankel described **Peace Rules** (Jules) during his three-year-old campaign, and those words were never more true than

during the stretch run of yester-day's GII New Orleans H. at the Fair Grounds. On the lead soon after the start, Peace Rules was joined by **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) as they raced past the quarter pole. The gallant chest-nut lost the advantage briefly at midstretch, but pinned his ears and battled back to win it by a

head in a gut-wrenching effort. The two combatants were shoulder to shoulder in the final furlong and there was contact, but, after an inquiry and an objection from Saint Liam's jockey Edgar Prado (who happens to be the former rider of Peace Rules), the stewards ruled it incidental and let the original order of finish stand.

A Fruitful Campaign...

Peace Rules put together a four-stakes winning streak last season. After ending his juvenile campaign with victories in the GIII Generous S. and the Hill Rise S. on the grass, he switched to the main track and bested Funny Cide (Distorted Humor) by 3 1/4 lengths in the GII Louisiana Derby. He made it four in a row in the GI Blue Grass S., then held on gamely to be third in the GI Kentucky Derby. Freshened after running fourth in the GI Preakness, he went wire-to-wire to win the GI Haskell Invitational H. and was second to Ten Most Wanted (Deputy Commander) in the GI Travers, but faded after cutting out the early fractions in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Mile and finished 12th as the 3-1 choice. His return in the Jan. 24 Sunshine Millions Classic was equally disappointing. Sent off the evenmoney favorite, he ran evenly and finished fourth, 8 1/2 lengths behind Southern Image. But the real Peace Rules was back in action yesterday. He broke sharply and went right to the front, taking them along through splits of :23.60, :47.06 and 1:10.56. Saint Liam drove at him as they raced down the lane, but Peace Rules was not through yet and came again along the inside. The final time was just two ticks off the track and stakes record set by Phantom on Tour in 1998.

A Bayou Double...

Peace Rules is now a perfect two-for-two in Cajun country. He posted a 2 1/4-length score in the Louisiana Derby on his last trip to the Big Easy and became the second horse in history to add the New Orleans to his resume as well. Master Derby was the first, taking the 1975 Louisiana Derby and the 1976 New Orleans H. under a record highweight of 127 pounds.

No Laughing Matter...

Funny Cide raced just off the leaders early, but was no match down the stretch while holding on for third. Seattle Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), the slight 5-2 chalk, made up some ground on the final bend, but raced evenly late to be fourth. Second choice Ten Most Wanted was carried very wide around the first turn in a near replay of his GI Breeders' Cup Classic trip. He moved to the rail down the backstretch, but couldn't mount a rally and settled for fifth.

THE END OF AN ERA

By a strange little coincidence, it was exactly 25 years ago today--Mar. 1, 1979--that I arrived with the U-Haul and the family to take up residence in Lexington, Kentucky. My greatest inspiration to make the leap from the bush leagues to the majors was Pedigree Associates' Margaret C. (Sissy) Woolums, and her sidekick, Linda Conley. Linda died last year and, on Saturday, Sissy, aged 68, passed away in Lexington. You hear this a lot, but it truly is the end of an era.

When I joined the major leagues, it was still B.C.--Before Computers. Pedigree researchers in those days all began by compiling pedigrees, often using information mined from obscure reference books from all corners of the globe--most of which could be found at 909-911 N. Broadway. It's hard to believe now, but 25 years ago it could easily take you half a day to assemble a pedigree that can now be printed in half a minute. The big advantage now is that there are so many more things we can do with that half a day. The big advantage then was that you really understood what was involved in compiling a pedigree, and you knew where all the information came from.

Pedigree Associates was a great little pedigree shop-academy by day, salon by night. For Sissy was the Professor of Pedigrees, and her friends and contacts literally spanned the globe. I remember when those two Irish kids--Michael Hernon, now of Gainesway, and Geoffrey Russell, now Keeneland Sales Director--first showed up. They were typical of the kind of internationally minded types who found their way to Pedigree Associates. There was always somebody interesting floating about, often attracted by the wealth of research material available to burrow through, and challenging topics were regularly batted about by managers, workers and hangers-on alike, especially as the afternoons wore on.

Of all the many people who have infuenced my career, I think I must pay homage first and foremost to Sis Woolums. I've been fortunate to have had many influential mentors, but Sis was the most influential of them all, I think for two reasons: she understood completely the importance of integrity in research--know that the information you have is reliable, and know what you're missing; and, equally as important, she had a total international understanding of the game.

It was the League of Nations around there, and it improved every one of us who came in contact with it.

But, sadly, the actual work that drove the place became...well, obsolete. Once pedigrees could be produced by computers, we humans could be employed doing other things. There was no work to keep the Academy going, and eventually people drifted in their separate directions. The Jockey Club tried to find a slot for Sissy, and she worked there until a couple of years ago, but that is a corporate environment, not an academy. It wasn't really her, though, to their credit, they did at least try and find a place for this woman who was truly one of the pioneers of modern pedigree research.

Those of us who were lucky enough to be around Pedigree Associates in its heyday know that was who Sissy was--the Matriarch of 909-911 N. Broadway, the Full Professor of Pedigrees, the Convenor of this particular League of Nations. Those who pass through an Academy and gain the knowledge understand there is also an obligation to Pass It On. I hope I have done that, and will continue to. I think Sis was proud to claim me as one of her proteges, and I am certainly proud beyond words to recognize her as my mentor. Bon voyage, old friend...and thanks again.

He is pointing for the Mar. 14 GIII Tampa Bay Derby.

Trainer Nick Zito worked four of his Triple Crown candidates at Palm Meadows Saturday. GII Lane's End Futurity winner **Eurosilver** (Unbridled's Song), who captured a Feb. 4 allowance in his 2004 debut, went five furlongs in 1:01 4/5. Stablemate **Birdstone** (Grindstone), winner of the GI Champagne S. at two, went the same distance in 1:01, while GISP **EI Prado Rob** (EI Prado {Ire}) was clocked in 1:02 and MGSP **Ghost Mountain** (Silver Ghost) went in 1:03.
