LET THE GOOD TIMES ROLL

Today's \$600,000 GII Louisiana Derby has drawn a competitive 11-horse field, including the winners of Fair Grounds' earlier three-year-old features: **Gradepoint** (A.P. Indy), winner of the GIII Risen Star S. Feb. 15; and **Fire Slam** (Grand Slam), hero of the GIII Lecomte S.

Jan. 24. Fire Slam won the Lecomte despite a deep quarter crack in his left hind, but has been training well with a patch. "He kicked the wall a week before the Lecomte," explained



trainer David Carroll. "Initially we did not think

IMAGE OF A WINNER He may not have faced prerace favorite Pleasantly Perfect, who was scratched Friday with a fever, but Southern Image has left no doubt that he is one of the most talented members of his generation. Third in the GII San Vicente S. last February, the dark bay didn't start again until Del Mar, winning a two-turn allowance, then was sidelined again until Santa Anita's winter meet. He returned to win the GI Malibu S. Dec. 26, then added a tally in the \$1-million Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 24, with Peace Rules fourth. Never farther than a length from the lead while skimming the rail, the even-money chalk came up on the inside to take command in the far turn and headed for home with a clear lead. Island Fashion tried to chase him down, but the favorite had plenty left in reserve. "He's a big-hearted horse and he's all about running," said winning rider Victor Espinoza.

Finishing in Fine Fashion...

Looking to become the first of her sex to take the Big 'Cap, Island Fashion (Petionville) was sent off the 6-1 co-third choice by the bettors. The dynamic gray filly was stretching out after posting back-to-back wins at seven furlongs in the GI La Brea S. Dec. 27 and the GI Santa Monica H. Jan. 25, but had proved she could handle 10 furlongs with her dominating six-length score in the GI Alabama S. last August. Traveling in the middle of the pack in her first try against males, she inched closer as Southern Image assumed command at the quarter pole. Island Fashion went after the crowd's choice down the lane and never quit trying, but just couldn't get to him while easily second best. "She ran a very impressive race," jockey Kent Desormeaux said. "I'm very proud of her. Coming home, I thought I had them. Unfortunately, the winner held me at bay, but ... I think she's the best filly in the world." Added a beaming trainer Marcelo Polanco, "Outside of not winning, the race went pretty much the way I thought. She ran great." Will the girl get another chance against boys in the future? "Yeah," said Polanco, who has been training for nine years, but had never run a filly vs. colts before. "I'm not afraid of anybody... I have so much faith in her."

A FINE CAST OF UNDERSTUDIES The last two winners of the Kentucky Derby, Funny Cide and War Emblem, each made an appearance at Fair Grounds prior to earning their roses. Could it be three years in a row? A number of promising youngsters are shipping in for the \$600,000 contest, including a couple of Californians, Borrego (El Prado (Ire)) and Wimbledon (Wild Rush). Borrego captured his first start on the main track, a Santa Anita allowance Dec. 27, before running a bang-up second to Master David in the Sham S. Feb. 8. He got the better of champion Action This Day in that race and merits a solid look here. Trainer Bob Baffert had saddled Wimbledon to three straight runnerup finishes as the favorite before the grey colt broke through with an eight-length triumph Feb. 8 at Santa Anita. Todd Pletcher has brought over two colts from Florida, Pollard's Vision (Carson City) and Shaniko (A.P. Indy). But the biggest dark horse just might be Shadowland (Distant View), who comes in from Oaklawn. The chestnut was a solid second to Fire Slam in the Lecomte and has pleased his Team Valor connections ahead of this race. "Shadowland has been training great," said Team Valor president Barry Irwin. "We believe he has a shot, especially with Pat [Day] aboard. His last race was good."

It's official. Imperialism has left behind his moderate Florida form and become a new horse in California. posting his second straight upset in a graded stakes while handing the highly touted Lion Heart his first career defeat in the process. The grey colt began his career at Calder racing for a tag several times, including a \$25,000 maiden victory last July. He ran third in the Foolish Pleasure S. over that course last September, then showed improvement when racing on the turf finishing second in the Mecke S. Nov. 29 before concluding his Florida stint with a fifth to Kitten's Joy in the GIII Tropical Park Derby on New Year's Day. Switched back to the dirt for his West Coast debut in the seven-furlong GII San Vicente S., he pulled off the 14-1 upset last out Feb. 7. Overlooked again in this spot, the gray colt trailed the field through a hot opening half contested by Lion Heart and Hosco (Honour and Glory). He edged closer down the backstretch, raced five wide into the stretch and rallied gamely to post his second consecutive victory. "We were pretty far back," quipped winning rider Victor Espinoza. "I think we came from somewhere on Huntington Street." Lion Heart, making his first start since his GI Hollywood Futurity victory, will get another crack at Imperialism in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3. Triple Crown nominee Ashado kicked off her threeyear-old campaign in style, winning by daylight despite hopping over tracks in deep stretch. The dark bay had started her career auspiciously last summer with a three-race winning streak capped by the GI Spinaway S. She came up short in her next two outings, running third in the GI Frizette S .-- to Society Selection and Victory U. S. A.--and second to champion Halfbridled in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but rebounded to conclude 2003 with a valiant victory in the GII Demoiselle S. Nov. 29. Trainer Todd Pletcher brought her along slowly at Palm Meadows over the winter, but Ashado signaled her readiness to return with two straight bullet works, and was heavily favored to get her picture taken. Jockey Cornelio Velasquez tucked her into a ground-saving position after breaking from the rail, and Ashado settled into third as Quick Temper (A.P. Indy) led through reasonable fractions. Taken to the outside heading into the far turn, the favorite ranged up to take the lead and took command at the top of the stretch. She hopped a bit as she crossed tire marks from the starting gate, switching leads back and forth, but none of her rivals could threaten. "We had the obvious concerns with her travelling to a track she hadn't run over, but she showed up with her 'A' game today," said Pletcher. "It was very impressive...she'll run once more, either in the Fantasy [GII, 4-9] or the Ashland [GI, 4-3], before the Kentucky Oaks [GI, 4-30]. We're very pleased."

Beaten a head when second in the G3 Solario S. at Sandown in his European finale in August of 2002, Sweet Return took some time reaching an American winner's circle. The chestnut picked up his first U.S. victory in his fifth try, taking a division of the Oceanside S. at Del Mar July 23. He finished fifth in the Aug. 16 GIII La Jolla H. next time, but came back to be third in the Sept. 6 GII Del Mar Derby and second by a head in the Oct. 4 GII Oak Tree Derby. The Red Oak colorbearer capped his 2003 campaign with a halflength tally in the Nov. 30 GI Hollywood Derby and made it two in a row in the Jan. 19 GII San Marcos H. Shortening up off those two 10-furlong affairs, Sweet Return settled in seventh through the opening six furlongs, but swung wide for the drive and motored to the front at the eighth pole before holding off the late charge of Singletary for the score. Last Song came out on the short end of a blanket finish last time in the GII Davona Dale S., but she turned the tables on Society Selection with this determined effort. The Buckram Oak colorbearer had failed to menace in her first two career starts, both sprints, but missed by a nose in her route debut at Keeneland in October and graduated next out at Churchill Nov. 9. Trainer Carl Nafzger opted to wait for Gulfstream for her next start

and Last Song returned in style, romping by 8 3/4 lengths in a two-turn allowance Jan. 19. She stepped up in class for the Feb. 7 GII Davona Dale S. and came up a half-length short when fourth while bottled between rivals. Society Selection, a neck in front of her that day, went postward as the 1-2 chalk and set out front here. Last Song came up to the favorite's hip after a half in :47 3/5 and moved up to head her at the top of the stretch. After putting away Society Selection, Last Song strode out smoothly to gain her first stakes victory. "The difference between last time and today was experience and the outside post," said Nafzger. "In her last trip she was in tight and [jockey Edgar] Prado never got a chance to ride her." So what's next for Last Song? "The Ashland [GI, Keeneland, 4-3] is the plan right now," said Nafzger. "I think she's an Oaks filly. That's the main objective."

Exceed and Excel officially punched his ticket for the \$2-million G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen in three weeks with a dominating run on the front end. The one-length winner of the G1 Dubai Cup at Caulfield Sept. 21, the bay colt was a troubled sixth in the G1 Caulfield Guineas Oct. 11 before getting a break. He made a successful return to the races in his latest, winning the Feb. 14 G2 Sovereign S. and was well-backed to make it two in a row.

Almost immediately in front, Exceed and Excel widened his lead to three lengths past the Flemington clocktower then held off a late run from Titanic Jack for the win. "What can I say? I never in my wildest dreams thought I would win two big races at Flemington," said winning owner Nick Moraitis, whose Might and Power (NZ) won the Melbourne Cup at the track. The winner could head to races in Europe following the Golden Shaheen, similar to those contested last year by Choisir (Aus).
