BAFFERT OUTLINES STABLE PLANS

Wimbledon (Wild Rush), winner of the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 7, will remain in California for the Apr. 3 GI Santa Anita Derby, while Sunday's GII San Felipe S. hero Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm) will be shipped to Kentucky for Keeneland's GI Blue Grass S. Apr. 10, trainer Bob Baffert confirmed Wednesday. "I'll ship 'Preach,' said Baffert. "I think he'll like it. That will give me the opportunity to ride [Javier] Santiago on both horses." Of the 26-year-old Puerto Rican rider, who has been causing quite a stir since his stateside arrival in February, Baffert said, "He's my secret weapon," he explained. "He's very knowledgeable. He knows his horse and he rides his own horse." Wimbledon, with Dana Barnes in the irons, worked four furlongs on Santa Anita's fast main track in :48 Wednesday morning. Imperialism (Langfuhr) and Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat), first and second in the GII San Rafael S. Mar. 6, continued their preparation Wednesday for an expected rematch in the GI Santa Anita Derby Apr. 3. The former, owned by Steve Taub and trained by Kristin Mulhall, worked four panels at Hollywood Park in :47.60, while the Michael Tabor and Derrick Smithowned Lion Heart completed the same distance at Santa Anita in :48.60. "He's training good," Patrick Biancone said of Lion Heart. "We're happy with him." Also possible for the Kentucky Derby prep, Lucky Pulpit (Pulpit), who ran eighth in the San Rafael, breezed five furlongs at Santa Anita in 1:00.20.

Redskin Warrior Drills at Aqueduct

Redskin Warrior (Indian Charlie), five-length winner of the Feb. 21 Best Turn S. last time out, tuned up for Saturday's GIII Gotham S. with a half mile in :47 1/5 at the Big A yesterday. Jockey Richie Migliore, who last Saturday piloted Friends Lake to victory in the GI Florida Derby, then returned to New York to guide Smoke'n Frolic to win Sunday's GIII Next Move H., was aboard for the breeze. The three-year-old stretches out to eight furlongs for the first time Saturday, but Migliore is not worried about the added distance. "He's getting the idea that, when he gets to his right lead [in the stretch], he wants to really finish," he said. "It's like a game to him...when you open your hands, he takes off." Trainer Jen Pedersen had originally planned to send the colt around two turns after the Best Turn, but Migliore believes the one-turn mile of the Gotham is the right way to go. "[Redskin Warrior] is still inexperienced and, in a two-turn race, there's always maneuvering going on. With a horse that has that much speed, when you move around and shift, you can kind of set them off. In a one-turn mile, I can break and sit real still and quiet and go straight...until he settles into his rhythm, then I can angle in or go out or do whatever I have to do. It will be another learning step."

Action This Day on the Mend

Two-year-old champion **Action This Day** (Kris S.), who was found to have a cut on his right hind leg following an uninspired seventh-place finish in his latest start in the GII San Felipe S. Mar. 14 at Santa Anita, is reportedly doing well, but will remain on the sidelines for a few more days. "It's stitched and seems to be doing fine," said trainer Richard Mandella. "He'll stay on the Kentucky Derby trail, but may not be able to run in the [GI] Santa Anita Derby [Apr. 3]." In an attempt to give his star pupil more time to prepare, Mandella indicated that the colt may make his next start in the GI Blue Grass S. at Keeneland or Aqueduct's GI Wood Memorial, both scheduled for Apr. 10.

And Still on the Fence

Minister Eric (Old Trieste), third in his 2004 debut in an \$80,000 optional claimer at Santa Anita, came out of the race well, but trainer Richard Mandella is undecided as to the colt's next move. "The Santa Anita Derby is a possibility, but it depends on how he does," explained Mandella....Also leaning toward the ninefurlong Santa Anita prep with his GII San Felipe S. runner-up St Averil (Saint Ballado), trainer Rafael Becerra commented, "He came out of [Sunday's] race good, but I don't know what I am going to do yet. I'll take a blood test [today] and go from there. It's just to make sure everything is OK because it would be 20 days back to the Santa Anita Derby. I should know by this weekend."...According to trainer Wally Dollase, GI Santa Anita Oaks third A.P. Adventure (A.P. Indy) came out of that race in fine fashion and will be equipped with blinkers for her next start in either the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland Apr. 3 or the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs Apr. 30.

EVIL ELAINE EUTHANIZED Evil Elaine (Medieval Man--Distinctive Elaine, by Distinctive), the dam of 1997 Horse of the Year Favorite Trick, was euthanized Mar. 15 due to complications from laminitis. The 20year-old mare foaled an Unbridled's Song filly Feb. 5, but suffered ruptured suspensories in both hind legs shortly thereafter and was taken to Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington, Kentucky. She underwent a double arthrodesis--immobilization of the joints--but remained at the hospital until her death. Evil Elaine was owned by the Summer Wind Farm of Frank and Laura Jane Lyon and their daughter Karen Bailey. "She was just pure class," said Bailey. "She was our favorite mare." Her newborn filly was placed on a nurse mare. "We decided to do that right away because [Evil Elaine] had been down in her pasterns [for some time]," Bailey explained. "[The foal] is a beautiful, healthy, strong filly." A stakes winner of \$119,729, Evil Elaine produced stakes winner Cold N Calculating (It's Freezing) in 1992 and dropped a Phone Trick colt in 1995. Named Favorite Trick, the neatly made youngster went through an unbeaten two-year-old campaign capped by a victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and was named Horse of the Year. Summer Wind purchased Evil Elaine shortly before her son's Breeders' Cup win. She also produced the Grade I-placed Medievil Hero (Sea Hero) and the Grade III-placed Tricky Elaine (Grindstone). Her 2002 foal, an Unbridled filly, sold for \$2.4 million to Demi O'Byrne at Keeneland September. Evil Elaine was buried at Summer Wind Farm near Georgetown, Kentucky.

CELLARS SHIRAZ RETIRED Graded stakes winner Cellars Shiraz (Kissin Kris--Cellar's Best, by Band Practice) has been retired from racing and will be bred to Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm at Three Chimneys in Midway, Kentucky. AZERTYUIOP JUST CHAMPION

Yesterday's £250,000 GI Queen Mother Champion Chase at Cheltenham in Gloucestershire was billed as a head-to-head match between young pretender Azertyuiop (Fr) (Baby Turk {Ire}) and reigning champion Moscow Flyer (Ire) (Moscow Society), the cream of Europe's two-mile chasers. But the latter's untimely departure midway through the eagerly awaited contest paved the way for 15-8 second choice Azertyuiop to streak to an impressive nine-length success over Flagship Uberalles (Ire) (Accordion {Ire}), who had won the race in 2002 and was third in 2000. Settled off the pace over the early obstacles, alongside 5-6 favourite Moscow Flyer, the eventual winner eased to the fore midway through the two-mile championship. He was not seriously threatened once in front and utilised a powerful surge off the final bend to ease to a highly impressive success from toiling rivals Flagship Uberalles and Tiutchev (GB) (Soviet Star). Moscow Flyer unseated his rider four fences out, spoiling the showdown. Britain's premier national hunt festival concludes today with steeplechasing's Blue Riband, the 10-runner £350,000 GI Tote Cheltenham Gold Cup, where defending champion Best Mate (Ire) (Un Desperado {Fr}) bids to emulate Ireland's steeplechasing icon Arkle by recording a third consecutive win in jumps racing's showpiece event.
