The Triple Crown trail makes stops in Kentucky, New York and Arkansas on Saturday, with Turfway Park hosting the day's richest Kentucky Derby prep in the \$500,000 GII Lane's End S. Headlining that 11-horse field is trainer Nick Zito's **Birdstone** (Grindstone). The bay colt ended his juvenile campaign with a win in the

GI Champagne S. and returned to take a Feb. 14
Gulfstream allowance by three lengths in his lone sophomore start to date. Silver Minister (Silver Deputy) has won four straight over the Turfway oval, most recently taking the John Battaglia Memorial S. Feb. 28. Also in the field is That's An Outrage (Quiet American), who was third

behind Lion Heart and St Averil in the GI Hollywood Futurity last December. In his sophomore debut, the bay was seventh behind the latter in the Jan. 17 GII Santa Catalina S. Aqueduct's GIII Gotham S. marks the stakes debut of the highly regarded **Eddington** (Unbri-

dled). With blinkers added, the Mark Hennig trainee was an open-lengths winner of back-to-back Gulfstream Park outings at 1 1/16 miles. **Deputy Storm** (Forestry) will be stretching out to the Gotham's one-mile distance after getting caught late when setting the pace in the seven-furlong GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream.

JOCKEY CHAMPIONSHIP SCHEDULED FOR

OCTOBER The Jockey Championship will have an international flare when it returns to Lone Star Park for its eighth renewal Oct. 28. Nine of the world's top riders will be invited to the first International Championship, held two days before the Breeders' Cup. "The move from the traditional June date and the inclusion of foreign riding greats will only add to the tremendous amount of excitement during Breeders' Cup week," said Lone Star Park President Corey Johnsen. The ninejockey lineup will compete in three races, each worth a minimum of \$50,000. An additional \$70,000 in prize money--including the \$11,000 first prize--will be up for grabs. Jockeys will be chosen by a panel and will receive an invitation in early October. First preference will be given to jockeys who have won Breeders' Cup races.



Platinum Heights (Storm Cat), a \$2.8-million purchase at the 2002 Keeneland July sale, makes the second start of her career in today's third race at Gulfstream Park. The three-year-old filly, owned by Eugene and Laura Melnyk and trained by Todd Pletcher, debuted with a 2 3/4-length win racing seven furlongs at Gulfstream Feb. 6. The third race today is a one-mile-and-70-yard allowance contest which has attracted a field of six. Jerry Bailey has the mount on Platinum Heights, who is 9-5 on the morning line.



A winner of two of his five juvenile starts, most recently at Angers last October, Kurm secured his first stakes success here with a determined front-running performance. A MATE FOR ALL SEASONS

After breaking the 32-year hoodoo by matching L'Escargot's 1971 feat of retaining steeplechasing's Blue Riband last year, Best Mate (Ire) (Un Desperado (Fr)) emulated steeplechasing icon Arkle's 38-year record of winning three consecutive GI Tote Cheltenham Gold Cups with a battling display on the final day of Britain's National Hunt festival. Last year's hero traveled smoothly throughout under regular partner Jim Culloty, but had to fight harder than ever before to secure victory ahead of Sir Rembrandt (Ire) (Mandalus {Ire}) and last year's third Harbour Pilot (Ire) (Be My Native). Culloty adopted his customary patient tactics and reserved the 8-11 favourite off First Gold (Fr) (Shafoun {Fr})'s modest pace in a midfield fifth until asking his mount for further momentum with three fences to traverse. Best Mate's supporters had some cause for concern as he was squeezed for room approaching the home turn, but an extravagant leap at the penultimate obstacle took him to the front. Kerry native Culloty was hard at work as soon as Best Mate negotiated the last, and the partnership was all out up the punishing final hill to hold the renewed effort of Sir Rembrandt by a half length. Trained by Henrietta Knight, the nine-year-old gelding is a best-priced 5-2 to make it four in a row next year. Earlier in the day, Iris's Gift (GB) (Gunner B {GB}) reversed the placings of last year's G1 Bonusprint Stayers' Hurdle with Baracouda (Fr) (Alesso) to secure the £140,000 24-furlong event with a battling performance.



AUSTRALASIA



ZIRNA RETIRED Westbury Stud's and Karaka Group's Zirna (NZ) (Deputy Governor--Riverly Lass {NZ}, by Gleam Machine) has been retired from racing and will be bred to leading young sire Encosta de Lago (Aus), according to a release from Westbury Stud. Winner of the G1 NZB Te Aroha Breeders S. last year, the bay became a star in Singapore, winning the Raffles Cup and the Singapore Gold Cup. Her connections sent her to Dubai to target next weekend's G1 Dubai Duty Free, but the five-year-old came up short in two starts at Nad al Sheba. She was beaten 1 1/4 lengths when sixth in the Listed Al Rashidiya S. Feb. 21, then missed by 1 1/2 lengths when fifth in the Melbourne Trophy Mar. 11. "She doesn't owe us anything," said Westbury CEO Russell Warwick. "And there is no point in running her if she can't win. Now she will head to England to quarantine for 60 days before going to Australia, where she will visit Encosta de Lago in the spring." Zirna was named 2003-04 Singapore Horse of the Year and also earned the title of Stayer of the Year in that country.

SKY SWITCHES OFF Sydney's Autumn Racing carnival steps up a gear at Rosehill on Saturday with the A\$600,000 G1 Coolmore Classic, but an ongoing dispute between principal clubs and the TAB-owned Sky Channel has resulted in Sky refusing to broadcast the races. The Sydney Turf Club and Australian Jockey Club have been negotiating with Sky for a revamped contract, with Sky initially threatening a blackout a fortnight ago before agreeing to continue negotiations, although the old contract expired Mar. 4. The STC conducts meetings at Rosehill and Canterbury, while the AJC hosts racing at Randwick and Warwick Farm. STC chief executive Michael Kenny said the race clubs had offered their signal free of charge to TAB while negotiations continued. "At the end of the day, the racing clubs are not-for-profit organisations with a duty to protect their intellectual property and enable racing to grow," said Kenny. "TAB's duty is to make profits for its shareholders." AJC chief executive Tony King said the TAB had baulked at signing an agreement Thursday with some board members unhappy with terms, and the two clubs would now set up their own racing channel within six to eight weeks. TAB chief Warren Wilson said negotiations had been "a charade."
