WYNN DOT COMMA DEAD

Wynn Dot Comma (Struggler {GB}), winner of the Mar. 13 GIII Swale S. at Gulfstream Park, sustained compound fractures to both front ankles during a routine gallop at Calder Race Course Tuesday morning and was later euthanized. "He always had problems with his

feet, but never anything else, and he had been training better than ever recently," trainer Marty Wolfson told Daily Racing Form. "The track was a little deeper than usual at the time the injury occured. I guess he just took one misstep." Owned by Martin Cherry, the chestnut won four of five starts as a two-

year-old, including the six-furlong Birdonthewire S. at Calder last October. Two for three at Gulfstream Park this year, the colt won the GIII Spectacular Bid S. Jan. 10 before a fourth-place finish in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 14. Wynn Dot Comma closed out his career with a head victory in the Swale, defeating top Kentucky Derby prospect Eurosilver. "This is really devastating," Wolfson told the *DRF*. "It makes you not even want to go on when something like that happens. I've never had a horse break down like that on the racetrack in the morning. It's amazing how he could run a halfmile in 44 seconds during his races and be fine, and then break down during an easy gallop."

CONGAREE TO COMMONWEALTH BC

Trainer Bob Baffert has opted to send Congaree (Arazi) to the Apr. 10 GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup S. at Keeneland instead of his intial target, the GI Carter H. at Aqueduct on the same afternoon. Baffert cited his decision to send a string of horses to Keeneland for the upcoming spring meeting as a reason for the change in plans. Accompanying Congaree is GII San Felipe S. winner Preachinatthebar (Silver Charm), who will contest the GI Blue Grass S. on the Commonwealth card. Congaree finished fourth in the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita Jan. 31 in his only start this year.

Lucky Number Seven for Pleasantly Perfect

GI Breeders' Cup Classic hero Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony) will break from post seven in Saturday's \$6 million G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba. The post position draw for the 2000-meter event was held yesterday. "I hope seven is a lucky number," trainer Richard Mandella said. "The way the track is set up here, I don't think post position makes a lot of difference. I think racing luck plays a bigger role--I'm just looking for good racing luck." Edmund Gann, owner of Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}), was also satisfied with his draw. "I would have liked to have been in the middle, but he likes to get in position early and [jockey Jerry Bailey] will get him there." Added Jose Cuevas, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel, "It doesn't really matter because no one has the speed he has." Fellow U.S. rep **Domestic Dispute** (Unbridled's Song) will break from the rail. "Well, it's the shortest way around, isn't it?" trainer Paddy Gallagher said. "You'd like to be a little more outside, but you've got to take the luck of the draw and make the best of it. We've got a horse who looks like he has a chance."

CHICAGO MAGNATE REINEMAN DEAD AT 86

Chicago steel mogul Russell Reineman, who campaigned War Emblem and Wise Times, died of natural causes at his Chicago-area home Tuesday. The Chicago industrialist, who became the president of Crown Steel Corp. in 1955, expanded his Thoroughbred holdings over the ensuing five decades. A one-time part owner in Balmoral Park, Crete, Illinois, Reineman campaigned numerous racing stalwarts, including 1962 juvenile champion filly Smart Deb; Wise Times, winner of the GI Super Derby, GI Haskell Invitational H. and GI Travers S. in 1986; GI Super Derby winner Home At Last; and War Emblem. Reineman sold a 90 percent interest in War Emblem, the 2002 GII Illinois Derby winner, just days after that win. The colt went on to win the 2002 Kentucky Derby and Preakness S. en route to a threeyear-old championship.

GODOLPHIN TO STAY IN ENGLAND IN 2004 In a change of policy, Godolphin yesterday announced that the stable will have no runners based in North American this year. All 200 of the Godolphin runners, including 100 juveniles, will travel to Newmarket upon leaving Dubai and will be under the guidance of trainer Saeed bin Suroor. Suroor will send horses to the U.S. for selected stakes races, but they will return to England after running. But Sheikh Mohammed's Darley Stud will continue to send strings to trainer Eoin Harty on the West Coast and trainer Tom Albertrani in New York. With their two leading Triple Crown contenders, Ruler's Court (Doneraile Court) and Rosberg (A.P. Indy), sidelined by injury, Godolphin won't have any threeyear-olds for the Kentucky Derby or Preakness, but racing manager Simon Crisford said, "Hopefully we may have something for the Belmont S."

Gulfstream Park Director of Marketing David Rovine was let go by Magna Entertainment Corporation, the parent company of Gulfstream. Rovine had been with Gulfstream since June 1995. He was brought in by then-president Doug Donn to try and bolster sagging attendance at the South Florida track. It was under Rovine that the concert series, featuring rock and jazz groups, were offered on Saturdays and Sundays. Gulfstream president Scott Savin said the track was "consolidating and restructuring" the marketing department. "Mike Tanner is in charge of marketing," said Savin, who confirmed that the concert series would continue through the end of the meeting (April 25). He was unclear about plans for the concert series next year, saying, "We have to submit a budget during the summer." Tanner had been with Gulfstream's publicity department before he was made assistant to the president last year.

DONNY USHERS IN THE NEW SEASON

All eyes will be focused on Doncaster today as it kicks off its three-day Lincoln meeting, the traditional curtain-raiser of the British flat season on turf. Saturday's feature, the £100,000 Lincoln H. run over the straight mile, has been designated a "heritage handicap" for the first time by the British Horseracing Board. Today's action is centred around the Listed Doncaster Mile, which sees the return to British shores of the Mark Johnston-trained **Gateman (GB)** (Owington {GB}), who has been plying his trade at Nad Al Sheba during the carnival.

MISTER BAILEYS COLT TOPS DONCASTER SALE

Three-year-old **Parkview Love**, a son of Mister Baileys (GB) who won last year's Listed Woodcote S. in England, elicited a record bid of 60,000gns at yesterday's Doncaster Lincoln Handicap Sales. Selling as lot 67, the Kingsley House Stables consignee is out of the stakes-placed Skywalker mare Jerre Jo Glanville and has earned \$57,971, recording two victories in five starts. Purchased by an unnamed client of Mark Johnston, who had trained the colt at two, Parkview Love will return to Johnston's Kingsley House Stables. With 114 head selling this year, compared to 84 in 2003, the sales enjoyed a 74-percent rise in aggregate, from 257,350gns to 447,630gns. Average rose from 3,060gns to 3,926gns, an increase of 28 percent.

Martin Broughton, current chairman and chief executive of the British American Tobacco Company, has been unanimously elected by the British Horseracing Board as its next chairman. The 56-year-old was appointed as the successor for Peter Savill for a three-year term beginning July 1. He commented yesterday, "I am honored and excited to have been given the opportunity to lead racing, a sport which I have loved for nearly all of my life. In a period of unprecedented change, the last few years have seen racing make tremendous progress in many areas under Peter Savill's leadership and it is essential that the sport continues to flourish." Savill, who steps down at the end of June after a six-year spell, commented, "I am delighted that Martin has been chosen by the Board. He has a first-class commercial background and has impressed everyone with his impartial and incisive contribution to the Board as an Independent Director since 1999. I am in no doubt that he is the right man to lead racing and BHB in the future."

MCEVOY GETS GODOLPHIN CALL-UP

Godolphin yesterday revealed that they have appointed Melbourne's reigning champion jockey Kerrin McEvoy as second jockey, cementing their link with the 23-year-old rider. "Kerrin is a top-class jockey and he will be a great asset to our team," Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford said. "We will have more horses in Newmarket this summer, so we hope to provide Kerrin with plenty of opportunities." McEvoy added, "This is a fabulous opportunity for me. I am really looking forward to being involved in my first European racing season and to working with Godolphin. I haven't been to England, or anywhere in Europe, before. But I'm really looking forward to it--I'll be based there from the end of April. I am very grateful to Godolphin and to Sheikh Mohammed for giving me this chance." McEvoy, successful in the G1 Melbourne Cup on Brew (NZ) in 2000, rode for Godolphin when sixth on Beekeeper (GB) in the G1 Caulfield Cup in 2002 and has ridden in Dubai for the past two years.

ATTHERACES NEARS UK SHUTDOWN

Attheraces yesterday admitted there was "little chance" that it would be on air from midnight on Monday, when the current media rights deal terminates. In a statement concerning the progress of discussions with the British racecourses it currently covers, the consortium stated that "although negotiations with the 49 tracks continue, without new contracts in place on 30th March, attheraces will cease the broadcast of live UK horseracing." The channel's evening broadcast of U.S. racing will continue in a "cut-down version," while attheraces "intends to remain in negotiations with all parties to try and secure a new agreement even if the broadcast of UK racing ceases."

Godolphin revealed a strong hand for both the British spring Classics at their annual media open house at Al Quoz yesterday morning. Naming a trio of contenders for Newmarket's 2000 and 1000 Guineas, racing manager Simon Crisford commented, "Snow Ridge (Ire) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Bayeux (Red Ransom) and Byron (GB) (Green Desert) are the Guineas colts and maybe Punctilious (GB) (Danehill), Sundrop (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) and, obviously, Carry on Katie (Fasliyev) for the fillies' Classic, but not necessarily in that order." Carry on Katie, who took the G2 Lowther S. at York in August and G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket in October, was described as having had "a super winter" by Crisford, who added, "She is in fast work and is going very, very well at the moment. She will go straight to the 1000 Guineas without a trial or a prep race." While revealing that last year's G2 Royal Lodge S. winner Snow Ridge "took some time to adapt out here," Crisford reported him to be "going very well now," with a possible alternative to the mile Classic May 1 being the G2 Dante S. (at York May 12). The Godolphin team will leave Dubai at the end of April for Godolphin Stables in Newmarket.
