Godolphin claimed the last two runnings of the \$6 million event--winning with Street Cry (Ire) in 2002 and

Moon Ballad (Ire) last year--but Americans, looking to win the globe's richest race for the first time since Captain Steve's heroics in 2001, hold the hot hand for this year's edition of the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad Al Sheba today. Luckily, they've brought a pair of silver bullets in

the form of Medaglia d'Oro (El Prado {Ire}) and Pleasantly Perfect (Pleasant Colony). The former has been first or second in 10 consective starts and was kept in

training with the World Cup in mind. He wrapped up his four-year-old season with a second-place finish to Pleasantly Perfect in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, then started this term with a facile 4 3/4-length trouncing of the GI Donn H. field Feb. 7. With a decided lack of pace in the race,

Jerry Bailey will likely try to take Medaglia d'Oro wireto-wire. "Bobby Frankel has been here before [third with Public Purse in 2000 and sixth with Aptitude in 2001] and Jerry has won it four times [Cigar, Singspiel] (Ire), Captain Steve and Street Cry], so we've got a great team," owner Edmund Gann said. "We wouldn't be here if we didn't think we had a chance." Pleasantly Perfect's career turned the corner last year. He won the Oct. 4 GII Goodwood BC H. coming off a seven-month absence, then came flying late to win the Classic three weeks later. His easy win in the Jan. 31 GII San Antonio H.--where he showed a new dimension while rating just off the pacesetters--cemented his reputation as a top-flight horse, and the massive bay has looked the part since arriving in Dubai. Trainer Richard Mandella has his charge's World Cup trip already plotted. "I expect him to settle off the pace and make a run the last three furlongs," the Hall of Fame horseman said. "He's got some stamina--I just hope we don't leave it all at home."

Looking for the Upset...

The expatriated **Grand Hombre** (Grand Slam) was purchased by Godolphin after winning the GIII Pennsylvania Derby, but has been on the sidelines since a second in the Oct. 3 GIII Indiana Derby. "Grand Hombre has settled down well and we feel that he won't be disgraced, but, while we have ambitious plans for him in North America this summer, we might have to wait another year for a fifth World Cup," racing manager Simon Crisford said. **Admire Don (Jpn)** (Timber Country), a champion in Japan, is coming off a tough victory over Silent Deal in the Feb. 22 G1 February S. Horsefor-course players will have to love **Victory Moon (SAf)** (Al Mufti), the South African import who has won five of seven at Nad Al Sheba, including the Mar. 6 G2 Maktoum Challenge-Round 3.

Bucking the Trend...

The Dubai Sheema Classic has been run since 1998, but the U.S. has yet to win it. They have the chance to break that losing streak with **Hard Buck**. The Brazilian-

bred was a Group 1 winner in his native country at three and ended his homestand with a second in the G1 Estado do Rio de Janeiro last February. He was less-than-successful in his first trip to Dubai, finishing ninth in last year's G2 UAE Derby, but has blossomed since arriving in the States. The dark

bay started his U.S. campaign with a win in the Sept. 1 Tri State H. at Ellis Park, added a victory in the Kentucky Cup Mile 19 days later, then stepped up to make it three in a row in the Nov. 16 GIII River City H. at Churchill Downs. Hard Buck didn't handle a switch to the main track for the Jan. 31 GIII Canadian Turf H. at Gulfstream Park, but bounced back to take the Feb. 22 GI Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H. last time out. Jockey John Velazquez gets the call for the first time. Fair Mix earned his first Group 1 win in last year's Prix Ganay, then went to the sidelines for six months. The gray was off the board in three outings last fall, ending the year with a fifth in the Dec. 14 G1 Hong Kong Vase, but came out running in 2004, posting a twolength tally in the Mar. 6 G3 Dubai City of Gold S. over course and distance. Warrsan makes his Nad Al Sheba debut. The six-year-old has been held winless since capturing the G1 Coronation Cup at Epsom last June, but had Fair Mix behind him when third in the HK Vase, and trainer Clive Brittain believes that effort was not his best. "Forget Warrsan's last run," said the 71-year-old conditioner, who underwent hip surgery a year ago, but now rides out on three or four lots a day. "He lost 16 kilos on the journey over and we could never get the weight back on him. He ran no race, 14 kilos below his best, but since arriving in Dubai he has really thrived and he is now three kilos above his racing weight. Mick Kinane rides and you ignore him at your peril."

Americans have dominated this event over the last five runnings and are represented by five horses in the world's richest race for sprinters. Alke got the better of Breeders' Cup Sprint hero Cajun Beat in the 6 1/2-furlong GIII Deputy Minister H. at Gulfstream Park Feb. 7 and looks to remain perfect in five starts since joining the Todd Pletcher barn last fall. Cajun Beat sandwiched his 22-1 upset in the Breeders' Cup between victories in the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint in September and the GIII Mr. Prospector H. Jan. 3 before his defeat in the Deputy Minister, where he spotted the winner some 12 pounds. Back at even weights today, the dark bay gelding picks up the services of Jerry Bailey for the first time and cuts back to his favorite distance for this.

Defending Champ Is Up Against It...

Godolphin's State City beat U.S. rep Avanzado (Arg) by 3/4 of a length in last year's Shaheen, but, after running third to champion Aldebaran in the July 4 GII Tom Fool H. at Belmont Park, was fifth in the Aug. 10 A.G. Vanderbilt H. at Saratoga and has not been out since finishing fifth again in the Oct. 25 Sporting Plate H. "State City is a bit behind schedule and we have been unable to get a prep race into him," racing manager Simon Crisford said. "I fear he might find it too tough first time out against the Americans." But Japanese horses have performed well on the World Cup program in the past and one of its best sprinters, Meiner Select, takes his chance here. The chestnut has never been off the board in his 10 starts on the dirt and comes into this off a 3 1/2-length score in the G3 Garnet S. Jan. 11. The five-year-old should sit a stalking trip off a fast pace and could be a factor at a nice price.

Will it be Ladies' Day in the Duty Free once again? The last two renewals have been won by accomplished international distaffers Ipi Tombe (Zim) and Terre a Terre (Fr), and this year's running fields a pair of females capable of keeping the streak alive. Crimson Palace, a Group 1 winner in South Africa, was purchased out of her native country by Team Valor--like Ipi Tombe--and kicked off her Dubai campaign by breaking her predecessor's course record in a conditions race Jan. 29. The four-year-old was acquired by Godolphin following that win and stable jockey Frankie Dettori has the call. "It was not an easy choice [between her and Refuse to Bend]," said Dettori, "but Crimson Palace has been in great form during the Dubai International Racing Carnival, whereas Refuse to Bend might be better later in the season." The French-based Bright Sky, winner of the G1 Prix de Diane and G1 Prix de l'Opera at three, defeated Breeders' Cup Mile heroine Six Perfections (Fr) in the one-mile G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville last year, but came up short against males at the end of 2003. The tiny chestnut ran sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Turf and fourth in the G1 Hong Kong Cup. Getting a tilt at this event before heading to the breeding shed, Bright Sky missed by a short head to Sheema Classic hopeful Polish Summer (GB) in the Mar. 6 G3 Prix Exbury.

Megahertz, five-for-eight over the Santa Anita lawn, won the GI John C Mabee H. at Del Mar last summer, then ended the season with a fifth-place finish, beaten 3 1/2 lengths by champion Islington (GB), in the GI Breeders' Cup F/M Turf. A winner in the GII San Gorgonio H. over track and trip most recently Jan. 10, she will be awfully dangerous in this spot. Although she's winless in four attempts over this course, Katdogawn deserves a long look. Eurosilver's now-questionable status for the Kentucky Derby continues this season's woes for Zito, whose Birdstone (Grindstone) was a flat fifth as the favorite in the GII Lane's End S. last Saturday, while The Cliff's Edge (Gulch) has come up short in his two 2004 starts.

Minister Eric Runs Today

Diamond A Racing Corp.'s **Minister Eric** (Old Trieste) will run in today's sixth race at Santa Anita, a non-winners of one allowance going a mile and a sixteenth on the main track. The chestnut, runner-up in both the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile and the GII Del Mar Futurity at two, opened 2004 with a third in an allowance sprint down the hill Mar. 13, beaten 1 3/4 lengths. "That was not his thing," assistant trainer Becky Witzman told Daily Racing Form, "but he's done great since." Jockey Victor Espinoza takes over for Alex Solis, who is in Dubai to pilot fellow Richard Mandella trainee Pleasantly Perfect in the World Cup. Also in the eight-horse field is **Boomzeeboom** (Explosive Red), who jumped up to break his maiden by 8 1/2 lengths Mar. 6, earning a 106 Beyer Speed Figure.

Pomeroy (Boundary), second in the GIII Gotham S. last time out, and **Tricky Taboo** (Mazel Trick), runner-up in the GII Lane's End S., are both being pointed to the Apr. 17 GII Coolmore Lexington S.

EURO STARS TO SHUTTLE A trio of top European performers in 2003, now standing their first seasons at stud, will shuttle to the Southern Hemisphere this summer. Coolmore has announced that champions High Chaparral (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) and Hawk Wing (Woodman) will both head to their New South Wales property following the completion of the Northern Hemisphere season. The dual Derby hero High Chaparral was honored with a pair of Eclipse Awards while winning 10 of 13 starts, including two runnings of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf (once in a dead heat), Hawk Wing, a Group 1 winner at two, three and four, earned a Timeform 136 in the G1 Lockinge S. Across the Tasman, Ekraar (Red Ransom) will shuttle at the new Stoney Bridge Stallion Station outside of Karaka, New Zealand, according to Throughbred Times. The half brother to leading sire Hussonet was a solid international campaigner for Sheikh Hamdan, closing out his career with a victory in the G1 Gran Premio del Jockey Club. "We have spent two years searching for the right horse to launch our operation with and the criteria we supplied were extremely tight," Peter Jenkins, Stoney Bridge's bloodstock manager, told Thoroughbred Times. "He needed to be a Group 1 performer. We wanted a horse who could get up and star in group races at two, but could also improve and train on as an older horse, and have enough stamina to give him a chance of getting Classic types. Finally, he had to have bloodlines that were highly compatible with New Zealand mares. It was a huge ask, but Ekraar met all these criteria." Ekraar is currently at Italy's SAB Allevamento di Besnate.

BLACK-OUT INEVITABLE British punters and racing enthusiasts are set to face a prolonged "period of blank screens," according to a leading figure in broadcasting. Satellite Information Services (SIS) Director of Programmes George Irvine yesterday spoke of months instead of weeks until Britain regains satellite coverage of racing if, as expected, attheraces stops broadcasting from Monday midnight. "I don't see any progress and I think it's inevitable the present channel will go off the air on Monday night," Irvine told PA Sport. "Whatever happens, there will be a period of blank screens. One, two, three months, who knows, until it gets sorted out. Whichever way they jump, it's going to take a bit of time to set up [a racing channel] and get running." Officials at the Racecourse Association (RCA) remain committed to supply a signal through RaceTech to a new channel. "We are well equipped to supply pictures and commentary to any channels as we already do to attheraces or indeed to the betting shops," the RCA Chief Executive Stephen Atkin said yesterday. "We would like to see RaceTech be involved in a supply to a channel and I think we are optimistic about that in the long term."

SYNDICATE OWNER WARNED OFF

The Jockey Club broke new ground on Thursday by "warning off" syndicate director Miles Rodgers for two years as a result of his "laying" of his club's horses. After considering the evidence, the disciplinary panel found that the founder of the Platinum Racing Club had "either laid his horses to lose their respective races or had instructed others to do so on his behalf," therefore breaking Rule 247, which forbids owners, trainers and stable staff from laying their own horses to lose on betting exchanges. Those races concern two of the Club's horses at Redcar and Wolverhampton last season, both of whom drifted on the exchanges before finishing well beaten. Rodgers, whose disqualification from racing ends on Apr. 1, 2006, is set to appeal after describing the decision as a "travesty."
