SMITH. AZERI REUNITE IN APPLE BLOSSOM

After much speculation, jockey Mike Smith and 2002 Horse of the Year Azeri (Jade Hunter) will join forces once again for Saturday's GI Apple Blossom H. at Oaklawn Park, according to Daily Racing Form. Smith, who rode the champion in all 16 lifetime starts, was originally slated to ride Derby leading candidate Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) in the Santa Anita Derby, which will be contested the same afternoon as the Apple Blossom. However, Lion Heart's connections decided to send their charge to the Apr. 10 GI Toyota Blue Grass S., leaving Smith free for the assignment on Azeri. For her first start of the year and for trainer D. Wayne Lukas, the chestnut six-year-old is likely to face Island Fashion, Wild Spirit (Chi), Keys to the Heart and Golden Sonata. BBC SECURE BIG MEETS

HARNESSING THE INNER TROTTER By Bill Finley

When Dr. Franklin Cummings, one of British Columbia's most noted psychiatrists, closed his practice in 1998 to pursue his first love, training harness horses, he never imagined he could combine his two specialties. That was until a friend and a rival trainer asked him to help with a talented but high-strung standard-bred who kept breaking stride. After a few dozen hypnotic treatments, the trotter never broke stride again and won two straight editions of the \$15,000 Samuel Riley Trot at Fraser Downs in Surrey, British Columbia. Cummings could be on to something that could revolutionize the training of both Standardbreds and Thoroughbreds.

Cummings, who had dabbled in horse ownership since the late '60s, soon found that he was more fascinated by the legend of Nevele Pride than the legend of Sigmund Freud. He closed his practice and took out a trainer's license. Using conventional training methods, he struggled during his first four years, winning just nine races from 137 total starts. Still, fellow trainer Anthony Jessie thought enough of the good doctor that he asked him to see what he could do with a basketcase he was training named Lewis's Turn.

"I really had no idea what to do," Cummings recalled. "The horse was completely unglued; he was just manic. Anthony had said he thought the colt had suffered from some sort of traumatic experience when he was a yearling at the farm, but no one there would ever tell him what had happened.

"He'd be fine in the barn, but once he got out on the racetrack, he just lost it. We think he had some sort of terrible training accident. I told the trainer there wasn't anything I could do, but he was desperate. He'd consulted with several veterinarians and nothing had helped."

Cummings figured he'd rely on his psychiatric background.

"The horse reminded me of some of my patients, people who suffered post-traumatic stress disorder," he said. "What worked for them was therapy, which won't work with a horse. Neither can you give them medication. You can't have a horse testing positive for Zoloft.

"I tried the only thing that was left--hypnosis."

Hypnotizing a willing patient is a lot easier than hypnotizing a horse who has no idea what is going on, but Cummings made it work. And it didn't matter to him that as soon as word got out that Lewis's Turn was in therapy Cummings' rival trainers nicknamed him "Dr Weird."

"As banal as it may sound, I used the same method you see in old movies," he said. "First, I'd make sure the barn was completely quiet except for very soft background music and then I'd slowly wave a watch back and forth in front of my patient. If you can get them to follow the watch, you've got them. It doesn't work with every horse, but it is effective with a lot of them."

The answer, he said, was getting the horse to train while still under an hypnotic state. Lewis's Turn trained every day for two straight months while hypnotized. He was is such a calm state he was apparently able to put his past trauma out of his mind. In time, he became so comfortable on the track that whatever had been troubling him was no longer an issue. In his first start after his therapy, he won a \$2,500 claimer by six lengths, establishing a new lifetime mark of 2:02 1/5.

Cummings was so fascinated by his success that he decided to do more experimenting. He treated another fractious horse for a rival trainer and had similar results. Then he went to work on horses that behaved normally. Several of them improved as well. Now, every horse in his barn is hypnotized at some point.

"You have to remember these are high-strung athletes and that can be a problem," he said. "It's better if they are in a calm state when they are racing, so that they don't break stride or expend too much energy early.

"Think of it as the human athlete being 'in the zone.' I was able to get many horses to be totally at peace with themselves and everything just flowed from there."

Now, Dr. Weird is Dr. Wonderful. Despite a small stable numbering just 12 horses, he was the third-leading trainer at Fraser Downs last year, thanks to a winning rate of 43 percent. He also won the 2003 running of the track's showcase race, the \$25,000 Nickawampus Leroy Pace, achieving a lifelong dream.

He has gained acceptance in harness racing circles and will now try to do the same with Thoroughbreds. Word of Cumming's success has spread to nearby Hastings Park, Vancouver's Thoroughbred track, and Cummings has been hired by two trainers there to work with their horses. Hastings opens Apr. 17; two of Cummings' patients are slated to run during the first week of the meet.

"As the Thoroughbred is even more difficult to manage than the Standardbred, I believe I am going to achieve remarkable results," he said. "I've been working with one filly, Sara's Cookie, that was so excitable they couldn't even get her to gallop, but she is the picture of calm now and training like a star. She worked just the other morning, five furlongs in :58 flat, and never turned a hair.

"That's incredible...as incredible as the fact that a lot of people reading this have believed every word and are just now realizing they have been nailed yet again by a *TDN* April Fool's prank."
