CASTLEDALE SHOCKS SANTA ANITA DERBY

Making his second start on the main track, the 30-1 Castledale (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) overcame Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.) in the final strides to land the \$750,000 GI Santa Anita Derby yesterday afternoon. The bay had drifted in slightly during the stretch run, causing Rock Hard Ten to move towards the rail, which in turn forced Imperialism (Langfuhr) to take up. After looking at the replay for several minutes, the stewards disqualified

Rock Hard Ten to third, moving Imperialism in to second, but kept Castledale as the winner. "I would hate to be in the stewards' shoes to make decisions like this," said winning rider Jose Valdivia Jr., who picked up the mount the day of the draw. "When the money's on the line, the riders are going to be more aggressive than usual, especially in a race of this magnitude." *Cont. p2*

CASTLES IN THE SKY Castledale (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) became the second Irish-bred in the last five years to capture the GI Santa Anita Derby, following the success of The Deputy (Ire) in 2000. A €100,000 GOFORB yearling, the neatly made bay broke his maiden at Gowran Park in his fourth start Aug. 13, and concluded his Irish campaign by crossing the line first in the Listed Blenheim S. at The Curragh Sept. 14. He was disqualified to second that day in favor of Colossus (Ire), but his trainer David Wachman noted the colt's fondness for firm ground, and Castledale found himself headed to the birthplace of both parents. He captured the GIII Generous S. over the Hollywood lawn in his U.S. bow Nov. 29, but didn't run again until the GII San Rafael S. Mar. 6, when he came up empty in his first dirt try and was a well-beaten sixth. Trainer Jeff Mullins, who won last year's Santa Anita Derby with Buddy Gil, breezed the colt once on grass and once on dirt before opting for another go. "We breezed him back on the grass and even though he worked good, he looked terrible," said the conditioner. "We worked him on the dirt [6f, 1:11 4/5] and there was no comparison, so that's why we took the chance.

Castledale bided his time in sixth as Lucky Pulpit (Pulpit) and Quintons Gold Rush (Wild Rush) disputed things up front. Jose Valdivia, instructed to "ride him like a turf horse," swung his colt widest of all into the stretch, following the massive Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.). Despite losing his whip in midstretch, Valdivia maintained Castledale's momentum and the duo was able to get by their towering rival. "We'll let the horse come out of the race and we'll make a decision [on the Kentucky Derby," Mullins added. "Nothing's etched in stone right now." As for Rock Hard Ten, the big colt acquitted himself well in just his third career start. "This was the first time he had competition and he fought and fought all the way," said rider David Flores. "He feels like a quality horse and he's going to get better." Favored St Averil (Saint Ballado) never got involved, finishing sixth.

Madcap Escapade continued her meteoric rise to the head of the sophomore filly class, leading every step of the way en route to her first Grade I victory. Bred to be quick top and bottom, the bay filly flaunted her speed to score her maiden by 10 lengths on the second day of the Gulfstream meet Jan. 4 and celebrated Valentine's Day with a 11 3/4-length triumph in the Old Hat S. Trainer Frank Brothers decided to give his charge one more test around one bend in the GII Stonerside Forward Gal S. on Florida Derby Day Mar. 13 and she responded with a 4 3/4-length tally. This spot was selected for her two-turn debut. Alertly into stride, the Keeneland September graduate rated kindly in the two path before being asked to quicken up on the far turn. Madcap Escapade responded, increased her lead turning for home and was all out to withstand a late run from Ashado. "It couldn't have gone any better," commented winning jockey Rene Douglas. Many questioned the wisdom of keeping three-time Eclipse winner Azeri in training at six, but the chestnut mare proved she still belongs among the elite with this convincing score. After capping her 2002 Horse of the Year campaign with a stirring triumph in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, the Allen Paulson homebred kept on rolling in 2003, clicking off consecutive victories in the Apr. 5 GI Apple Blossom H., May 24 GI Milady Breeders' Cup H., June 21 GI Vanity H. and Aug. 10 GII Clement L. Hirsch H. But the superstar had her winning streak snapped at 11 as she finished a lackluster third as the 1-10 chalk in the Sept. 28 GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. Azeri missed the 2003 Breeders' Cup with a tendon injury and it seemed her amazing career would end on a losing note, but after sending the mare to the farm, owner Michael Paulson decided to give her the chance to erase the memory of the Lady's Secret. Denied the role of the favorite for only the second time in her career, the 2-1 chance went right to the front and was never really threatened, holding crowd's choice Wild Spirit at bay in the final furlong. "I am not a bettor, but when I saw that 2-1, if I'd had a runner, you could have got all I had on me," trainer D. Wayne Lukas said. As for what's next, he added, "She leaves Monday for Churchill. There's a good race on Oaks Day [GII Louisville Breeders' Cup H.], another on Derby Day [GI Humana Distaff H.]." Pollard's Vision closed out his juvenile campaign with a third-place finish in the six-furlong Huntington S. Nov. 16, then resurfaced at Gulfstream with a second-place effort in an allowance Jan. 7. Stretched out in distance for the first time in his next start, he notched a 1 1/16 mile, off-the-turf allowance at Gulfstream Feb. 8. The dark bay colt stepped up to graded competition

most recently and ran a solid third behind Wimbledon in the GII Louisiana Derby Mar. 7. Sent off as the crowd's choice this time, he showed good early speed, set fractions of :23 4/5 and :47 4/5 and strode out to a decisive victory. "He's such a game little horse," Todd Pletcher's assistant Ginny DePasquale said. "He tries every time. I was never worried when Song of the Sword came at him. He can sense the horses running at him--whether he can see them or not, we don't know. He's been maturing with every race. He was obviously very green when he broke his maiden, but he really came around the last couple of months. We could be heading to Kentucky for the Derby. We'll have to wait and see." Song of the Sword, winner of a \$100,000 optional claimer victor at Aqueduct Mar. 5, suffered his first career defeat while finishing second. Last time out, Saint Liam went after Peace Rules as they raced down the stretch in the Feb. 29 GII New Orleans H. and got his head in front for a couple of strides, only to be beaten on the wire as the gallant chestnut battled back along the rail. Looking to turn the tables yesterday, Saint Liam broke

sharply and went right to the lead, carrying his archrival wide around the first turn and down the backstretch as he dashed through suicidal fractions of :45.46 and 1:09.62. The pace took its toll on the frontrunner, but Peace Rules, who had been on his flank from the start, showed his class once again, driving to the front at the head of the lane and drawing clear late to win handily. It was the third Grade I success for the hard-knocking colt, who took the GI Toyota Blue Grass and GI Haskell Invitational H. at three. He disappointed when 13th as the 3-1 favorite in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Mile and again at even-money in the Jan. 24 Sunshine Millions Classic, but is back on top of his game now. "My horse is gutty and I think he is improving," trainer Bobby Frankel said.

Winless since taking an allowance test on the grass at Aqueduct 11 months ago, Jackpot was off at double-digit odds in his stakes debut, but belied the tote board yesterday. The chestnut had shown an affinity for the Gulfstream main track last year, breaking his maiden in February

and adding an allowance score in March. Fourth on the lawn at Calder in his 2003 finale, the Cynthia Phipps homebred came back to finish an even fourth in an off-the-turf event at Gulfstream Feb. 7 and improved to be second going a mile and a sixteenth on the main track three weeks later. Stretching out to a mile and a quarter for the first time as the second-longest shot in this field, Jackpot settled just off the pace set by The Lady's Groom, then angled three wide as they raced around the far turn, took over at midstretch and held Newfoundland safe to post the upset. Seattle Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo {Arg}), the 7-10 chalk, pressed the early fractions before fading badly to be sixth and last.

The two-year-old also smashed the race record clocking of 1:08.60 for the 1200 metres in a dazzling catch-me-if-you-can performance at Rosehill yesterday.

Humble Beginnings...

The gelding, a A\$90,000 purchase for trainer Gai Waterhouse, emulated his sire Danzero, who won the Golden Slipper in 1994, and gave Waterhouse and jockey Chris Munce their second Slipper trophies. "Gai

would be the first one to say this hasn't been her best year, but when the big races come along you don't want to be on anything else but her horses," said Munce. "This is the best twoyear-old I have ridden--he is very tough." As for how the Slipper set up, the rider said, "To be honest, I went into the race with an open mind. I would have been AAP Photo happy to be running second, third or fourth, but he is blessed

with natural speed and I wasn't going to hold him up." Dance Hero had to work hard early to take the lead, but Munce paced him well mid-race and he capably fended off all challengers in the run to the post. He had led from start to finish to win the Magic Millions in January, then enjoyed a let-up before going out to win the G3 Three Skyline S. going 1200 meters at Canterbury Mar. 13. Looking ahead, Waterhouse said, "We're going to have a go at the Triple Crown. He looks the sort of horse who could run in the next couple of races. He is the supreme athlete. He has just got the most wonderful cruising speed, which you saw in the Magic Millions." Dance Hero goes again next Saturday in the G1 Sires Produce S. at Randwick. Heavily backed favourite Alinghi was luckless, struggling out wide all the way and finding it impossible to catch the top two.



Returning to the site of his impressive third-place finish in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Classic, Dynever made short work of his six rivals at Santa Anita yesterday. The four-year-old had not been out since his World Thoroughbred Championship per-

formance, but had been training steadily at Payson Park, working a bullet five furlongs Mar. 22, and had shown he could put in a big effort off the layoff last year, coming off a two-month break to earn a 114 Beyer Speed Figure for his second-place finish in the Aug. 9 West Virginia Derby. The four-year-old could get more distance next time--he's likely to point for the May 14 GI Pimlico Special.

According to a Darley release, In the Wings has sired 11-percent stakes winners from foals. "He'd always been a special favorite of the Darley team," Osborne continued. "He was homebred, he was a tremendously talented racehorse, and he's been a remarkable stallion. Through his son Singspiel and grandson Moon Ballad, he's founded a dynasty of Darley stallions, so we'll be able to enjoy his influence for many years to come."
