Christophe Soumillon has begun 2004 where he left off in 2003, delivering Vangelis to maintain his record in French group races this season at a healthy 100 percent. Buoyed by his successes in the G3 Prix Exbury and G3 Prix Edmond Blanc, the Belgian maestro settled the grey in mid-division off the honest early tempo set by Weightless (GB) (In the Wings {GB}). Asked for his effort inside the final quarter, Vangelis opened up to grab the lead at the eighth pole before turning down the game rally of Execute and Thierry Jarnet. With his four-year-old campaign highlighted by a defeat of Labirinto in the G3 Grand Prix de Vichy in July, Vangelis hinted that big prizes in the States were within his grasp when running a troubled seventh in the GI Arlington Million in August. He may go for the Million again this summer, according to his owner Hubert Guy. "[TrainerAlain de Royer-Dupre] and Soumillon have done great jobs with this horse," commented the bloodstock agent, famed for purchasing eventual GI Breeders' Cup Mile hero Silic (Fr). "He could maybe go for the G1 Prix Ganay back here [May 2], but will probably go back to the Arlington Million, in which he was unlucky last year. It is too early to say whether he will end up in the States or not."

Monsieur Bond took a while to build on his fast-finishing sixth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket last May, but eventually found his metier at seven furlongs when winning the Listed Fortune S. at Epsom in September. After finishing runner-up in the G3 Supreme S. at Goodwood later that month, the chestnut failed to land a blow when dropped back to six furlongs, finishing fifth in the G3 Prix de Seine-et-Oise at Maisons-Laffitte in October. He suffered a luckless trip when coming from behind to be fifth in the Listed Cammidge Trophy at Doncaster on his return Mar. 27, and as a result was more prominently placed by Fergal Lynch throughout the opening exchanges of this contest. But Blue Grass hopeful That's an Outrage (Quiet American), fourth in the Lane's End, had the bullet for five furlongs yesterday, going the distance in :59 3/5. He galloped out threequarters in 1:13. "He worked super," trainer Mike Puhich said. "This horse is doing so well right now it's scary." Jockey Mark Guidry will have the call Saturday.



Santa Anita Derby Wrap-up

The colts that finished second, third, fourth and fifth in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby are all hoping to head to Churchill Downs for the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby, but the connections of winner, Castledale (Ire) (Peintre Celebre), were non-committal yesterday. "We'll know more in a couple of days," trainer Jeff Mullins said. "We have no definite plans at the moment." But Kristin Mulhall, whose Imperialism (Langfuhr) was moved from third into second in the race, is making travel plans. "We'll go forward with him," she said. Trainer Jason Orman would like to send Rock Hard Ten (Kris S.), placed third for drifting in during the stretch run, but the three-year-old may not have the earnings to get a spot in the gate on the first Saturday in May. "If we have enough money, we'll consider going," Orman said. "The disqualification might really effect us there, so we'll see. We'll probably go and train him [at Churchill and see how he trains over the track. I'll talk to the owners today and find out more." Quinton's Gold Rush (Wild Rush), fourth in the nine-furlong event, will now be pointed for the Apr. 17 GII Coolmore Lexington S. at Keeneland. Trainer Steve Asmussen will take over from Mike Mitchell. "We'll try the Lexington and see how he runs there," Mitchell said. '[Co-owner Satish Sanan] wants to win the Kentucky Derby more than any other race, so if the horse is OK, even though [the Derby] is only two weeks [after the Lexington], that would be the plan." As for having to hand his charge over to a new conditioner, Mitchell said, "I have no problem with that. I'm based at Hollywood and Steve is in Kentucky, so I understand. We're all in this together and want to do what's best for the horse." GII Louisiana Derby winner Wimbledon (Wild Rush), fifth Saturday, is also Louisville bound. "He was too close to the pace and got a little tired," trainer Bob Baffert said. "But he's all right. We'll go on."

Tapit Works for Wood

Winchell Thoroughbreds' Tapit (Pulpit) breezed on the notoriously slow training track at his home base at Tapeta Farm in North East, Maryland, Saturday, going a mile in 1:47 2/5. He is slated to make his next start in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. The grey colt was scheduled to make his three-year-old debut in the GIII Risen Star S. in February, but missed nearly three weeks of training due to sore shins and was forced to pass the Feb. 15 event. He was shipped to Gulfstream Park for the Mar. 13 GI Florida Derby instead, but could do no better than sixth.

UNIFORM DRUG RULES APPROVED They failed to forge an agreement that would have merged the two organizations, but directors of the North American Pari-Mutuel Regulators Association and the Association of Racing Commissioners International voted unanimously Saturday to approve guidelines for a national uniform drug policy. The policy was developed by the Racing Medication and Testing Consortium, which is governed by a board of directors from 26 racing organizations, including the American Association of Equine Practitioners, Breeders' Cup Ltd., the Jockey's Guild, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association, The Jockey Club and the Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association. The RMTC will now work to get the drug rules implemented in all racing jurisdictions in the U.S. Under the new guidelines, the only medication that can be legally administered on race day will be furosemide (Lasix). It will no longer be necessary for trainers to show evidence that a horse has bled before getting on a Lasix list, however, they need only state that racing on the medication would be in the horse's "best interest." There will also be legal thresholds for three other medications--phenylbutazone, flunixin and ketoprofen-but they cannot be given within 24 hours of a race. It had been hoped that the RCI and the NAPRA might be combined into a single organization during their joint conference, held Apr. 1-3 in New Orleans, but the two sides could not come to an agreement before the conference ended. "It looks like we're back to ground zero," RCI Chairman Frank Zanzuccki told The Blood-Horse.
