HALL OF FAME NOMINATIONS ANNOUNCED

Trainer Shug McGaughey and Horse of the Year Skip Away, both entering their first year of eligibility, were among those nominated for the 2004 class of the National Museum of Racing's Hall of Fame, which announced its candidates yesterday. Over 140 members

of the racing media will vote on the Hall of Fame, with one winner from each category being announced Tuesday, May 25. McGaughey, who has conditioned eight champions for the Phipps Family stable and other owners in his 25-year career, is joined in the trainer category by John Veitch, whose charge Alydar dueled to immortality with Affirmed, and Nick Zito, the trainer of Kentucky Derby winners Strike the Gold and

Go For Gin. Skip Away, owned by Carolyn Hine and trained by her husband Sonny, was named in successive years champion three-year-old, champion older male and Horse of the Year. The gray retired with over \$9.6 million in earnings and 10 Grade I victories to his credit. Also in the male horse category is two-time Breeders' Cup Mile winner Lure--a McGaughey trainee--and champion grass horse Manila, winner of the 1986 Breeders' Cup Turf. The female horse category includes Flawlessly, named champion grass mare in both 1992 and 1993; New York Filly Triple Crown victress Mom's Command; and Sky Beauty, also a winner of the Filly Triple Crown. A quartet of top riders has been nominated in the jockey category, with Kent Desormeaux, Eddie Maple, Randy Romero and Jose Santos on the ballot. Winners will inducted into the Hall of Fame during a public ceremony at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Pavilion in Saratoga Springs, NY on Aug. 9.

Frankel Could Master Wood Again

Trainer Bobby Frankel's Empire Maker ensured chalk status in last year's Kentucky Derby with a victory over Funny Cide in the GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. With the Derby picture thrown

into further disarray with a weekend of longshot bombs and dismal performances by favorites, a strong showing in the 2004 renewal of the Wood, set for this Saturday, could mean favoritism for another Frankel runner, **Master David** (Grand Slam).

Frankel sent out the colt, winner of the Feb. 8 Sham S. at Santa Anita, to a five-furlong move in 1:00 3/5 at Hollywood Park yesterday. "He worked fine," said Frankel. "He's been training very well since the Sham." Though Master David is unraced since beating a strong Sham field, Frankel believes a return to Aqueduct, the track over which Master David ran second to Read the Footnotes in November's GII Remsen S., will benefit the chestnut. "I think the horse likes Aqueduct," the Hall of Famer said. "The main things for the Wood are for him not to leave his race on the track and to earn enough money to get into the Derby. I'm looking for a top-three finish." Master David is expected to ship this morning to New York.

Value Plus Takes on New York

Following a strong work Sunday, Aaron and Marie Jone's **Value Plus** (Unbridled's Song) will ship from Palm Meadows in Florida to New York this morning with the Wood Memorial in his sights. The strapping gray shared the bullet when he zipped five furlongs in :59 3/5, much to the approval of trainer Todd Pletcher, who added of distance concerns, "When you watch him train, he gives you the impression that he'll run all day. His dam's side doesn't scream mile and a quarter, but he looks a lot more like his sire, and I think he carries more of his sire line than his dam's line." *Cont. p2*

Bush Aims Cuba Toward Wood

Though the time doesn't jump off the page, the breeze of Cam Allard's **Cuba** (Not for Love) at Belmont Sunday morning was better than it might appear. The colt got the five-furlong distance in 1:01 2/5, but earned the bullet over a sluggish track that yielded an average time of 1:04 for the same distance. "The track was quite deep [Sunday]," explained trainer Tom Bush. "I was very comfortable with how he worked. He was blowing quite a bit after the work." The move convinced Bush to try the bay in Saturday's GI Wood Memorial at Aqueduct. Cuba graduated by 5 3/4 lengths in his route debut at the Big A Feb. 28, then ran second by a half length in an entry-level allowance race Mar. 12. Both races were at nine furlongs. Cuba has been equipped with blinkers for his last few works, and Bush will keep them on his charge for the Wood. "I've always felt that he might need blinkers," he said. "His last two works have been in blinkers now and they've both been bullets. He seems to be more responsive."

Lion Heart Feeling Frisky in Work

Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's **Lion Heart** (Tale of the Cat), gearing up for a tilt in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland, let the fur fly as he sped through five furlongs in :58 2/5, the co-fastest of 63 works at the distance at Santa Anita Monday morning. Also moving five panels was GII San Felipe S. winner **Preachinattthebar** (Silver Charm), who got the distance in :59 1/5, the seventh fastest of 63. The Bob Baffert trainee is likewise expected for the Blue Grass. Baffert runner **Odds On** (Silver Charm) breezed a stamina-building seven furlongs in 1:25 3/5, two ticks slower than stablemate and Belmont S. hero Sarava. No race has been picked out for Odds On, an allowance winner who ran sixth in the San Felipe.

When it came to looks, Nijinsky Star wasn't going to win any prizes. At 16.3 hands, she was one of those very big, plain and angular mares that Nijinsky occasionally sired. And she couldn't claim to have been a good performer either, having been covered for the first time as an unraced three-year-old in 1983. What she did have, though, was a highly unusual pedigree combining two Triple Crown winners.

Her sire remains the only horse since 1935 to win the Triple Crown in England, where the three colts' classics--ranging from the 2000 Guineas over a mile in the spring to the St Leger over an extra six and a half furlongs in the fall--demand a virtually impossible blend of speed, stamina, agility and durability. Nijinsky Star's dam, Chris Evert, was also a Triple Crown winner, of the NYRA Fillies variety. While the New York sequence has been far less difficult to achieve than the English Triple Crown, it still demanded a high degree of versatility when Chris Evert won it in 1974, with the Acorn S. being over a mile and the CCA Oaks over a mile and a half. The sequence also demanded plenty of toughness, with the three races coming in the space of 42 days. Between them, Nijinsky and Chris Evert raced 28 times, for 21 wins, four seconds and two thirds.

I nearly described Nijinsky Star's pedigree as unique, but four of Chris Evert's five living foals (all fillies) were either by Nijinsky or Secretariat, another Triple Crown legend. One of her Secretariat fillies, Six Crowns, produced the Grade I winner Classic Crown to Mr. Prospector and the champion juvenile Chief's Crown to Danzig. Nijinsky Star didn't enjoy broodmare success on that level, but the signs are that, in the long term, she is going to play a bigger role than Six Crowns in extending the success of this remarkable female line. Nijinsky Star produced only seven named foals, but five of them were fillies, of whom four--Hometown Queen, Revasser, Viviana and Willstar--have produced at least one stakes winner.

Last weekend added to the family's impressive results, with the GII Illinois Derby going to Pollard's Vision, a colt out of a daughter of Hometown Queen, and the GIII Las Cienegas H. to Etoile Montante, a very talented filly out of Willstar.

An interesting link between these two graded winners and Sightseek, one of the Grade I winners produced by Willstar's sister Viviana, is that all three were sired by strong, chestnut sons of Mr. Prospector which stand around the 15.3-hands mark. While Sightseek is by Distant View, Etoile Montante is by [Miswaki](#) and Pollard's Vision is by Carson City. As Distant View and Miswaki never won beyond a mile and Carson City never won beyond seven furlongs, they have all provided speed to balance the staying elements in Nijinsky Star's pedigree. All three stallions are also a handy size for descendants of a big, plain mare standing nearly 17 hands.

The other attraction of these matings is that they combine Mr. Prospector with Nijinsky. There were nine stakes winners among the 62 foals that Mr. Prospector sired from daughters of Nijinsky and several of his sons, notably [Woodman](#), [Seeking the Gold](#), Distant View, Forty Niner and Miswaki, have also sired high-class performers from Nijinsky mares. *Caulfield cont. 4*

Pollard's Vision showed at Hawthorne that he stays a mile and an eighth very well and he may now be heading for the Kentucky Derby. But will he last the extra distance? To be honest, I am a little surprised that he stays nine furlongs as well as he does. Carson City's stakes wins as a three-year-old were both gained over six furlongs and he has made his name as a very effective sire principally through such speedy performers as State City, City Zip, Carson Hollow, Pearl City, Good and Tough, Lord Carson and Five Star Day.

By my reckoning, Pollard's Vision is the 22nd graded winner by Carson City and is only the second, following Ormsby, to have won over a distance as long as a mile and an eighth. None of the other 21 has so far won over a mile and a quarter at graded level, even though the likes of Herbager, Relaunch, Hawaii, Vanlandingham, Secretariat, [Kris S.](#) and Halo appear among their broodmare sires.

Is there anything in the bottom half of Pollard's Vision's pedigree to make him an exception to this rule? He follows Don't Tell The Kids, winner of the six-furlong Sapling S. as a juvenile, as his sire's second graded winner out of a [Dixieland Band](#) mare. His dam Etats Unis is a sister to the tough and talented Bowman's Band, who is very well suited by a mile and an eighth.

If Pollard's Vision proves to have the stamina for a mile and a quarter, he will owe it to his second dam Hometown Queen. Most Europeans would have considered the idea of sending the strapping Nijinsky Star to the very sizeable Pleasant Colony to be asking for trouble. I have no idea how big Hometown Queen is, but she proved to be a very good racemare--good enough to finish second in the Kentucky Oaks and to be runner-up to Personal Ensign in the Hempstead H. Once again, she didn't establish that she stayed beyond nine furlongs, but she should have stayed well, given the chance.

Of course, a potential lack of stamina isn't the only obstacle that Pollard's Vision will have to overcome should he line up for the Kentucky Derby. He also has no sight in his right eye, which could be a handicap in the rough and tumble of the Run for the Roses. Horses are adaptable creatures, though, as an English gelding called Belper showed. Although he was blind in his left eye, this gelding specialised in racing on left-handed tracks, scoring six times over Brighton's difficult, undulating course.

The flashy chestnut, now a four-year-old, was among the best in her division last year with a win in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks and a good second to eventual three-year-old filly champ Bird Town in the GI Acorn S. But it was her performance in the GI

Test S. at Saratoga, run at the Madison distance of seven furlongs, that proved her most memorable effort, as she blasted through a hole at the top of the lane and sprinted clear by 4 1/2 lengths, stopping the clock in a sparkling 1:20 4/5. Trainer Steve Asmussen picked a tough race for Lady Tak's comeback: GISW **Harmony Lodge** (Hennessy), MGSW **Yell** (A.P. Indy), MGSW **Buffythecenterfold** (Capote), GSW **Ema Bovary (Chi)** (Edgy Diplomat) and MSP **Virgin Voyage** (Deputy Commander) are slated to compete.

AHC to Update National Economic Study:

The American Horse Council has initiated efforts to update the National Economic Impact Study of the Horse Industry in the United States. Compiled by Barents Group of Washington, D.C., the study also documented the size of the horse industry in 11 states. According to the report, the horse industry in all its segments--racing, showing, recreation and working horses--had a \$112 billion effect on the U.S. economy last year, involved more than 7 million Americans and 6.9 million horses and supported 1.4 million full-time jobs. "The National Economic Study has been extremely helpful to the industry's efforts in Congress and state legislatures," said AHC President Jay Hickey. "When you meet with elected officials, one of the first things they want to know is the economic importance of the industry. The study has enabled the industry to speak with authority about our true economic importance to the agricultural, gaming, sporting and recreational activities of the country. These figures have also been very important in documenting the size and diversity of the various segments of the industry to the press and media." The original National Study was accomplished with the economic support and participation of many organizations and individuals in the horse industry that contributed the funds necessary for its completion. "To get the update of the Study started, the American Quarter Horse Association and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association have already pledged their support," noted Hickey. "We anticipate that organizations and individuals that funded the first study will once again provide the economic support necessary to complete the update, along with others now that they have seen the value of the study on many levels."

“DARK HORSE” REPORT

The word was out before Fort Dignity made his debut in a seven-furlong Yarmouth conditions race in early August and he did not disappoint. Despite a tardy start, it was always a question of how far Kieren Fallon wanted to extend the imposing colt and he was not asked a serious question to comfortably beat a past winner. Described by his jockey as having “a big future,” the decision of Britton House to buy back the son of G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and G1 Irish Oaks runner-up Kitza at the 2002 Keeneland July Sale (at \$475,000) may yet bear fruit. Fort Dignity is by Seeking the Gold, the sire of Dubai Millennium (GB), who also made his first racecourse start at Yarmouth’s seaside track.

SUSSEX (GB) (c, 3, [Danehill-Oh So Sharp](#) {GB}, by Kris {GB})

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum bred the magnificent Oh So Sharp, who completed the fillies’ Triple Crown of G1 1000 Guineas, G1 Epsom Oaks and G1 St Leger in 1985. She has produced G1 Prix Saint-Alary winner Rosefinch and the group-placed Savoie Vivre (GB), but Sussex may prove the belated best. He belied his paddock appearance and unfavorable draw to be beaten only a head when runner-up in a Newmarket maiden in August and can only improve with time. Danehill adds crucial speed to the family mix and he could prove the dark horse among Godolphin’s Epsom contingent.

Silk Fan was not asked to tackle such company but she faced hard tasks when second to subsequent G1 Fillies’ Mile scorer Red Bloom (GB) in a Newmarket maiden in August, and when beating the well-touted pair Nuzooa and Poise (Ire) in a Salisbury maiden and Newbury conditions event the following month. She clearly has the speed of her relations but Unfuwain’s influence may see her stay further than a mile in time.
