The mare's second foal, who was born Feb. 4, is currently at Eaton Farms. Excellent Meeting previously produced a Storm Cat colt named Cougar Cat, in whom Moran sold a two-thirds interest to Susan Magnier and Michael Tabor last year. A winner of eight of 20 lifetime starts, including the GI Oak Leaf and GI Hollywood Starlet at two and the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Las Virgenes S. during her sophomore season, Excellent Meeting retired with \$1,402,396 in earnings.



DANCING KEY DEAD Dancing Key (Nijinsky II--Key Partner, by Key to the Mint), the dam of two Japanese champions, died Mar. 30 at Shadai Farm in Hokkaido from complications after delivering a filly by Agnes Tachyon (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), the Japan Association for International Horse Racing is reporting. The 21-yearold mare died of a ruptured uterine artery. Dancing Key was purchased, in foal to Relaunch, by the Yoshida family's Shadai Farm for \$400,000 at the 1989 Keeneland November sale. Her first foal on a Japanese cover was Air Dublin (Jpn) (Tony Bin {Ire}), a multiple group winner in Japan and earner of \$3,401,386. She went on to produce Dance Partner (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), Japan's champion three-year-old filly of 1995 and champion older mare of 1996 and group-placed in France. Dance Partner's year younger full brother, Dance in the Dark (Jpn) (Sunday Silence), was named champion three-year-old of 1996. Dancing Key's current three-year-old, the filly Dance in the Mood (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) will try to remain undefeated in four starts as the likely favorite in Sunday's G1 Oka Sho (Japanese 1000 Guineas). Dancing Key's Agnes Tachyon filly is with a nurse mare and is doing well. "We have some good mares here, but so far this was the best ever," Shadai President Teruya Yoshida said of Dancing Key. "It's not going to be easy to replace her."



Eddington Tries to Put Best Foot Forward

Trainer Mark Hennig took a chance entering GI Wood Memorial candidate Eddington (Unbridled) in the oneturn, one-mile GIII Gotham S., but wanted to teach the massive, long-striding colt to close into a swift pace and pass rivals through the stretch. As the Gotham unfolded, Eddington broke a step slowly, then was knocked sideways about 50 yards into the race. He recovered to make a good middle move, but failed to switch leads through the lane and had to settle for a non-threatening third. Hennig, however, wasn't dismayed by the outcome. "Had he broken sharp [and been closer to the pace], we might have not gotten done what we were hoping to, so in hindsight, maybe that didn't hurt us so bad. It certainly didn't hurt him physically," said Hennig. "We did it for educational reasons, and hopefully he'll move forward off of that." Of Eddington's refusal to switch leads in the Gotham, Hennig added, "Certainly it's a concern. We've been working with him in the mornings. On Sunday, he switched leads right on the money [working five furlongs in 1:03 4/5 at Belmont]. So maybe he'll be able to handle things Saturday."

Borrego Ready for Arkansas Derby

Trainer Beau Greely, who was in town to saddle Keys to the Heart to a fifth-place finish in Saturday's GI Apple Blossom S., was on hand to watch **Borrego** (EI Prado {Ire}) work five furlongs in 1:01 1/5 at Oaklawn Monday morning in preparation for Saturday's GII Arkansas Derby. The modest work tied for the sixth-fastest of 11 at the distance, but Greely explained yesterday that he wasn't looking for a lights-out effort. "He's a fit horse," he said, "but he's not a real fancy work horse, and all we wanted to do was stretch his legs. I told his regular rider to go out there and do it in 1:01, and that's exactly what he went, so we were delighted with the work."

Greely identified the unbeaten **Smarty Jones** (Elusive Quality) as the most obvious danger in the Arkansas Derby, adding that he hoped Borrego would be able to lay off that swift rival. "I think there's going to be a little speed in there, and that's what I've got to hope for. At the end of the day, we're going out there to win the race. It's a million dollars and it's a huge prep, but I wouldn't want to put him up front with Smarty Jones and have nothing left for the next race. We'll try to get him as easy a race as we can while still performing well."

Confident Biancone Sends Lion Heart to Bluegrass

Patrick Biancone watched as his Kentucky Derby hopeful Lion Heart (Tale of the Cat) fired a five-furlong bullet in :58 2/5 at Santa Anita Monday, a move that instilled a certain degree of confidence in the Frenchman, who sends out the colt as the likely favorite in Saturday's GI Toyota Blue Grass S. at Keeneland. "He enters this race in perfect order and he's going to be ready for Saturday," said Biancone. Lion Heart, winner of the GI Hollywood Futurity last December, finished a valiant second to Imperialism in his seasonal debut, the Mar. 6 GII San Rafael S. "I feel my horse needed one more week to recover from the hard race that he got in his first start this year. He was a little bit tired after the San Rafael, but now he has completely recovered and we are very happy with him." Meanwhile, Lion Heart's stablemate **Pomeroy** (Boundary), who ran a bang-up second in the GIII Gotham S., is doing well and is slated to make his next start in the Apr. 17 GII Coolmore Lexington at Keeneland. The bay worked at Santa Anita yesterday, breezing six furlongs in 1:14 3/5.

DESPERATELY SEEKING...A DERBY FAVORITE

They are not exactly inspiring overwhelming confidence, this crop of Kentucky Derby contenders, are they? After another weekend of upsets and otherwise inconclusive results, everybody's hoping something inspiring, or at least convincing, will emerge from this weekend's trio of final major nine-furlong Derby preps. Let's hope so. It's not looking a vintage crop at this stage.

It's interesting that the three best Beyer numbers run this year in Classic preps have all been run by colts by three Mr. Prospector-line sires with big question marks about their likelihood of siring a Derby winner. First, Read the Footnotes ran that monster 113--which would win most Kentucky Derbys--in the GII Fountain of Youth, but then he bounced to the moon in the GI Florida Derby. His sire, Smoke Glacken (by Mr. Prospector's son Two Punch) was a champion sprinter and has made a really good start at stud, but you'd have to wonder about distance limitations with him. Mind you, he hasn't proven that he's unlikely to do it, whereas the other two have.

Smarty Jones, who ran a 106 winning the Rebel, is by <u>Gone West</u>'s son <u>Elusive Quality</u> out of a Smile mare. Elusive Quality has made a very good start at stud, but they do look like milers at most, and the Smile is unlikely to add distance capability. Even if he outclasses the GII Arkansas Derby field this weekend at nine furlongs, that double-tough next one in three weeks' time is still up in the air.

Now, I am terrified of underrating the GII Illinois Derby form. Since they switched the date to the first Saturday in April, it's a proper Kentucky Derby prep instead of the consolation race for horses not quite good enough for the Derby or Preakness, when it was run in early May. Two years ago, War Emblem won the race in its last year at Sportsman's and last year Ten Most Wanted won it, in its first year at Hawthorne. So it's a proper Derby prep and Pollard's Vision ran a 107 winning it the other day. But he is by <u>Carson City</u>, who barely gets nine-furlong winners, as Andrew Caulfield was discussing yesterday. How likely is it that he'll get the extra one--though, in answer to his question about Hometown Queen, she was a proper Pleasant Colony mare, so Pollard's Vision does have two real legitimate staying influences there in Pleasant Colony and Nijinsky II. So you couldn't rule it out, but again ... is it likely Smoke Glacken, Elusive Quality, or Carson City is going to sire a Kentucky Derby winner? You couldn't be that confident, could you?

Smarty Jones will be favorite for the Arkansas Derby, and the pedigrees of the favorites for the GI Wood Memorial and the GI Toyota Blue Grass don't exactly scream 10 furlongs, either.

Master David is likely to be the Wood favorite. His sire Grand Slam is off to a seriously good start, and, like Smoke Glacken (first five-year-olds this year) and Elusive Quality (first four-year-olds this year), siring the Derby winner would obviously add another whole dimension to their good starts. Grand Slam's first crop is four, so Master David (and Limehouse) are from his second crop of three-year-olds. The same is true of Lion Heart, by last year's champion juvenile sire Tale of the Cat. Tale of the Cat is by Storm Cat, of course, not a Mr. Prospector-line horse, but he's equally questionable to sire a Derby winner. As Keeneland's two-turn races traditionally favor speed horses, and maybe speed pedigrees, that could be the right spot for Lion Heart. It could also be the right spot for Action This Day, because you don't have to win the Blue Grass, you can run well in it and lose, and still win the Kentucky Derby. You'd still like to see him break 100 on the Beyer scale before you really waded in, though.

It would be a fitting testimonial to the late, great <u>Kris S.</u> if either Action This Day or Rock Hard Ten could follow his Epsom Derby winner Kris Kin last year with the Kentucky Derby winner this year, and at least in his case, you don't have the stamina doubts.

A good Kris S. is more likely than not to stay 10 furlongs, though, as noted, Action This Day needs to run fast enough this weekend, and Rock Hard Ten doesn't look seasoned enough to take his chance. That doesn't mean they won't decide to run him, though, in what is obviously a very open year--if he gets in.

It's hard to know what to make of Castledale--he'd never shown Grade I form, even remotely, before winning Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby, and of course Peintre Celebre wouldn't have been your automatic choice to predict as the sire of a dirt Grade I winner. But there are two things in his favor as the potential sire of a Kentucky Derby winner--he himself was an absolutely top-class horse and murdered his field the year he won the Arc; and his own sire, Nureyev, always had good 'dirt' figures. Even though Castledale's 103 in winning the Santa Anita Derby doesn't send you running for the windows, he did win the race, it looked a decent field, and he's certainly entitled to take his chance and shouldn't be dismissed. You could see him going off 10-1 in Kentucky, and that might not be the worst bet in the race. Santa Anita Derby third (promoted to second) Imperialism would catapult his sire Langfuhr to stardom if he won the race, and he has certainly got the seasoning from three good races at Santa Anita, for two wins and a second, in his favor. You wouldn't discount him, either.

It's beginning to shape up like a monster Superfecta payoff, isn't it?

The one sire you would say is guaranteed to get the 10-furlong horse is <u>A.P. Indy</u>, and throw in that Friends Lake won the Florida Derby, and you're talking about a horse with a lot going for him. But he ran only a Beyer 92 when he won the Florida Derby and he isn't running in April. You've got to use him in the gimmicks (a good spot for anything by these staying sires), but it's not like there aren't question marks against his name, too.

Bob Baffert was quoted last fall as saying he could win this year's Derby with a colt from <u>Silver Charm</u>'s first crop, and, this week, it's still possible that he could. GII San Felipe winner Preachinatthebar joins Lion Heart and Action This Day in the Blue Grass, and he sends Consecrate to the Wood. Silver Charm got the trip, all right, so I'd include him along with Kris S., Peintre Celebre, and A.P. Indy as more likely to sire a good 10-furlong horse than some of these other sires. And there are still a few <u>Unbridled</u>s, Unbridled's Songs, and <u>Grindstone</u>s running this weekend, too, and considering both Unbridled and Grindstone won the Kentucky Derby, you wouldn't be ruling them out, either.

Well, I think we've narrowed it down to about 15. Maybe it will all look a lot clearer by Sunday.

It's not surprising to find Peintre Celebre being named as sire of a Classic candidate. However, one would expect that mention to come in the same sentence as venues such as "Epsom" or "Chantilly" rather than "Santa Anita" or "Kentucky." Obviously no one has told that to Castledale and his connections, as the ex-Irish colt upset leading GI Kentucky Derby candidates Imperialism, Rock Hard Ten, Wimbledon and St Averil in Saturday's GI Santa Anita Derby.

Castledale won just one of seven starts in Ireland at two, taking a maiden at Gowran Park on his fourth start. He did cross the line first in the Blenheim S. at The Curragh, a short head to the good of Colossus, but lost the race to that one in the stewards' room. Sent to the U.S., Castledale won his debut, concluding his two-year-old season by taking the GIII Generous S. on the turf at Hollywood Park. He tried dirt for the first time in the GII San Rafael S. Mar. 6, but could do no better than sixth. Despite the defeat and his turf pedigree, Castledale's works still suggested that he might be better on the dirt, so he was given another chance in the GI Santa Anita Derby.

FOALING NEWS:

TIM'S LADY, 18, Oh Say--Dot in Spot (Alternative) Foal born Mar. 5, a filly by Maria's Mon. Mare will not be bred back in 2004. Owned by Jane M Schosberg. Boarded at Pine Lane Farm, NY. Accomplishments: SP. Dam of Mellow Roll (Distinctive Pro), MSW & GSP, \$555,775. While Castledale's pedigree might not say dirt, it certainly does say Derby. His sire Peintre Celebre was an exceptional racehorse who won five of seven starts, including the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby), G1 Grand Prix de Paris and G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. Peintre Celebre has made a tremendous start to his stud career: his first crop included the G1 Deutsches Derby victor Dai Jin; Super Celebre, winner of the G2 Prix Noailles and runner-up in the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club; and Vallee Enchantee, a dual group winner in France and heroine of the G1 Hong Kong Vase. Castledale is a member of his second crop, which also includes Pearl of Love, winner of the Chesham S. in England, the G2 Futurity S. in Ireland and the G1 Gran Criterium in Italy.

The Derby theme continues with Castledale's dam Louju. She was unraced, but is a daughter of Silver Hawk, who finished second in the G1 Irish Derby and third in the G1 English Derby. A half sister to the minor stakes winner At Full Feather and to the dam of Australian Group 1 winner Keeper, Louju is out of the stakes winning and Grade-I placed Secretarial Queen. Secretarial Queen is a daughter of Triple Crown winner Secretariat, and three of Castledale's four grandparents won Derbys--Secretariat and Northern Dancer in the U.S. and Roberto in England--while the fourth, Alydar, was second in all three legs of the U.S. Triple Crown. Castledale's third dam Nicoma is a daughter of Nashua, who was upset by Swaps in the Kentucky Derby, but who took the Preakness and Belmont S. Derby connections continue all the way back to Castledale's fifth dam Chantress, a daughter of English Derby winner Hyperion and herself dam of Saggy, who not only defeated Triple Crown winner Citation in the Chesapeake Trial, but also sired a Kentucky Derby winner of his own in the shape of Carry Back.

Castledale follows Vallee Enchantee as Peintre Celebre's second group/graded winner out of a mare by a son of Roberto. The Nureyev/Roberto cross has also produced Group 1 winners Reams of Verse and Black Hawk. Peintre Celebre looks particularly likely to do well with mares by Roberto, as he is out of a mare by Alydar, a horse whose dam is bred on very similar lines to the dam of Roberto. Castledale is also linebred to Somethingroyal through her sons Sir Gaylord and Secretariat.



DONCASTER BREEZE-UP

Doncaster Bloodstock Sales Company's Breeze-Up auction gets underway today against the backdrop of record gains across the Atlantic. Hosting the first major European sale of its kind in 2004, Doncaster showcases what it terms as "Europe's leading Breeze-Up for winners." That is backed up by the statistic that it accounted for 67 percent of all two-year-old races won by such graduates last year. Despite being primarily about ready-to-run precocious winners, there has been a steady infusion of class since 1990 in line with significant increases in gross, average and median. Just 12 months ago, a Danzig colt doubled the previous salestopping record when purchased by the Shadai Corporation for 140,000 guineas. Class can come cheap, too, as proven last year by the subsequent Newsells Park Stud acquisition Kinnaird (Ire) (Dr Devious {Ire}). Sold for just 8,000 guineas, she became the latest bargain purchase from a DBS sale to belie her lowly tag when taking last year's G2 May Hill S. at the track over the road. Not surprisingly, this year's 250-strong catalogue answers the call for the progeny of first-season sires evident in the States so far in 2004. Those include Aljabr (Storm Cat), Almutawakel (GB) (Machiavellian), Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), Indian Lodge (Ire) (Grand Lodge), Lujain (Seeking the Gold), Montjeu (Ire) (Sadler's Wells), Namid (GB) (Indian Ridge {Ire}), Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}) and Xaar (GB) (Zafonic).

Among the eye-catchers is hip 6, Monk Fryston Bloodstock's filly by the Thoroughbred Corporation's G1 International S. winner Royal Anthem. She is a halfsister to five winners, including the Listed Prix Solitude winner Light Fresh Air. Pivotal (GB), some of whose best early progeny were sold by DBS, is responsible for hip 108, a half brother to the group winner The Whistling Teal (GB) from Mockershill Stables, the leading vendors of the 2003 sale.

"That is highlighted by the fact that we have a leading fancy for this year's 1000 Guineas in Kinnaird. Although there is not a particular stand-out among this year's catalogue such as the Danzig of last year, there are a good half dozen very nice pedigrees, that on paper are as good as each other." "The question now is whether we can get the seven or eight pounds out of him that I think he would need to win the Guineas." Newmarket's Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser yesterday reported the ground "in great shape" ahead of next week's three-day Craven meetina.

HQ EMERGES STRONG FROM ATR DEATH

While most of Britain's racecourses face an immediate future of lost coverage and potentially back-breaking rebates, Newmarket yesterday announced record prize money for 2004. Revealing an increase of over £325,000 this year to a record £6,785,000, the track's officials also confirmed that each of the Guineas, July and Cambridgeshire meetings would carry over £1 million in total purse. Only the prize money for the two spring Classics has been marginally cut as a result of the termination of the attheraces media deal. "The Levy Board recently announced a £4-million injection to prize money across Britain's racecourses to help offset some of the effects of the at the races deal collapse," Newmarket's Clerk of the Course Michael Prosser commented yesterday. "I'm hoping that with our share of this, together with the increased sponsorship that we know we have, plus hopefully strong ticket sales for our upcoming meetings, then we might be able to keep any further reductions during the season to a minimum. Enhancing our race programme, increasing our prize money and making our major races as competitive as possible with those at other European racecourses are right at the top of our list of key objectives and I think we are more than achieving them at the moment." Newmarket also announced record sponsorship for 2004, covering nearly 75 percent of the total run at its two courses.
