(Victory Gallop) took command with three sixteenths of a mile remaining and drew off to score by an impressive 8 1/4-lengths over Halfbridled, who rallied from last to finish second. "She probably ran to her potential today," said winning jockey Jerry

Bailey. "I don't think any race has been quite as good as this one. I hated to ask her that much today, but I was afraid [Halfbridled] would catch us." Looking forward to the GI Kentucky Oaks at Churchill Downs Apr. 30, Bailey added, "If she runs like she did today, it is not going to be a matter of distance." SANGSTER LOSES BATTLE WITH CANCER

The bloodstock world is in mourning at the news that pioneering owner-breeder Robert Sangster died in Lon-

don on Wednesday after a long battle with pancreatic cancer. He was 67 and is survived by his four sons Ben, Adam, Guy and Max. A funeral service is scheduled for Apr. 19 at St Pauls in Knightsbridge, London. "He died at home in late afternoon, early evening time yesterday," family spokesman Lord Bell told *PA Sport*. "He was surrounded by his family and he died very peacefully after a long

illness that started nine or 10 months ago." Sangster was the most successful British-based owner over the last three decades, leading the list in Britain five times between 1977 and 1984. He was successful twice in the G1 Espom Derby, with The Minstrel in 1977 and with Golden Fleece in 1982, and also owned dual G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe winner Alleged, Legendary trainer Vincent O'Brien, conditioner of most of Sangster's big-race winners, paid tribute to the owner. "We were deeply saddened to learn of Robert's death," said O'Brien. "He was a great friend, a wonderful owner and part of our family, young and old, for many years. I appreciated, more than I can ever say, Robert's trust and confidence that I, as trainer and partner, would do the best for him and the horses. We shared some great memories over the years with horses like The Minstrel, Alleged, El Gran Senor, Sadler's Wells and Golden Fleece and I cannot think of anybody with whom I would rather have shared them. Robert also provided our son David with his first classic success when Assert won both the French and Irish Derbys. A wonderful character who enjoyed life to the full, he will be sorely missed by everyone who was fortunate enough to have known him. Our thoughts are with his sorrowing family." Retired jockey Lester Piggott added: "It's a very sad day and the end of an era. I've known Robert since the 60s and we had great days and so many great horses. He was a great friend and a marvelous person to ride for. We'll miss him." Cont. p6

A deep and talented field gathers to contest the 16th running of the Maker's Mark, with only one entrant, Hear No Evil, without a graded stakes win to his credit. Perfect Drift had an outstanding 2003, winning of four of five on the main track, including a win over Horse of the Year Mineshaft in the GI Stephen Foster H. But the gelding's turf form is inconclusive; he won a grassy allowance at Keeneland a year ago, ran fourth in the GI Turf Classic on Derby day and was eighth, beaten 3 1/4 lengths, in the GI Arlington Million. He is unraced since finishing sixth in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Classic. One horse whose turf form is unimpeachable is Stroll. A winner of six of eight on the sod, the Bill Mott trainee reeled off three straight graded wins to cap off his 2003 run, taking the GII Hall of Fame H., the GII Jamaica H. and the GIII Calder Derby. Perfect Soul has shown a liking for Keeneland, winning a NW3X last April before a solid campaign that was highlighted by a victory in the GI Shadwell Keeneland Turf Mile in early October, a neck in front of GISW Honor in War, who ran a troubled fourth in a Gulfstream allowance in his 2004 bow Mar. 15. Millennium Dragon, winner of the GIII Appleton H. in early January, returns to his preferred surface after a second in the off-the-turf GIII Canadian Turf H. Defending champ Royal Spy will try to take it wire to wire, but will be joined on the front by the versatile dual turf stakes winner Burning Roma.

Tenth in stifling heat as a 4-1 chance in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies three weeks later, the Cowan homebred resurfaced to finish third by a neck in the GII Davona Dale S. at Gulfstream Feb. 7 and was most recently third in the GII Bonnie Miss S. in South Florida Mar. 6. The bay found herself on the lead that afternoon, but should revert to stalking tactics today. The chief protagonist figures to be Aaron and Marie Jones' Irish Coco, who is perfect in two trips to the post. The half-million dollar Keeneland July graduate overcame a sluggish start to win her maiden at first asking in Hallandale Jan. 25 then missed the break again in her Mar. 14 allowance debut, but rallied late for the victory. Three of the last four Kentucky Derby winners--Fusaichi Pegasus (2000), Monarchos (2001) and Funny Cide (2003)--competed in the nine-furlong event, but as the latter two demonstrated with a second-place finishes in the New York prep, a victory is not essential. One of those looking for a strong performance, but not necessarily a win, is trainer Rick Violette Jr., the trainer of Swingforthefences. In the shadow earlier this year of his more heralded stablemate GI Fountain of Youth S. winner Readthefootnotes, Swingforthefences has finished in the money in all five lifetime starts, including a third-place finish, beaten only 1 1/4 lengths, in the GIII Tampa Bay Derby Mar. 14. "This horse has won at a mile and an eighth [Feb. 14], and not many of them have," explained Violette. Optimistic concerning the Klaravich Stable-owned colt's chances, Violette added, "He overcame a lot and ran a winning race [in the Tampa Bay Derby]--he just didn't win. But he gained a lot of experience."

A consistent performer on the sprinting scene, Shake You Down won seven of 13 starts last year, including the GII True North H., GIII Bold Ruler H., GIII Smile Sprint H. and GIII Gravesend H. while finishing second in the GI Frank J. DeFrancis Memorial and third in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint. A three length winner in his 2004 debut in the Sunshine Millions Sprint at Gulfstream Jan. 24, the gelding came home a lackluster fifth in his latest in Oaklawn's Hot Springs H. Mar. 21. In front early this time as the 7-5 choice, the chestnut led at every call and held off the late bid of Where's The Ring to gain the narrow victory. "I let him settle into his own running style and he went into the lead easily," said winning jockey Ramon Dominquez. "Once clear, it helped him relax. At the eighth pole, I could tell he was getting tired, but he gave me all he had. When Where's The Ring got close, he gave me that little extra that the good ones have." According to winning trainer Scott Lake, the six-year-old gelding will make his next starts in the GIII Bold Ruler H. May 8 and the GII True North H. June 5.

Although in the money in six of seven lifetime starts, Victory U.S.A. came into this event without a win past seven furlongs nor at the graded stakes level. Third behind Halfbridled and Ashado in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita, the Thomas Van Meterowned filly returned three weeks later to score by seven lengths in the Mocassin S. at Hollywood Nov. 16. A distant fourth in her 2003 finale in the GI Hollywood Starlet Dec. 21, the Bob Baffert trainee returned in 2004 with a second last time in the GII Fair Grounds Oaks Mar. 6. With the daunting task of trying to defeat heavily favored Halfbridled, who beat her on two prior occasions, Victory U.S.A. went off the 5-2 second choice, but this time around, it was the bridesmaid who stole the show. Juvenile champ Halfbridled trailed the field early and closed well in the stretch, but it proved too little too late at the wire. "I don't know what happened," said Halfbridled's rider Alex Solis. "She just kind of took herself back. She went to lugging out on the turn. I think the turns were too sharp for her."

CONGAREE OUT OF COMMONWEALTH

Stonerside's **Congaree** (Arazi) will miss this weekend's stakes action at Keeneland. The six-year-old, who is trained by Bob Baffert, was scheduled to make a start in Saturday's GII Commonwealth Breeders' Cup H., but was forced to defect after he was treated for colic Wednesday night following a flight from California. "He's going to be alright," said Baffert. "When you treat this close to a race, you have to scratch." The colt was initially treated at the barn, but was later taken to Hagyard-Davidson-McGee Equine Hospital when he failed to respond to treatment. The multiple Grade I winner finished fourth in his only start in 2004, the GII San Antonio H. at Santa Anita Jan. 31.

BIRDSTONE WATCHES FROM THE SIDELINES

Marylou Whitney's GI Champagne S. winner Birdstone (Grindstone), who was scheduled to make a start in Saturday's GI Blue Grass S., was forced to the sidelines because of an elevated white cell count Thursday. "We're just trying to hang in there," said trainer Nick Zito, who just days earlier had to face another setback with stable star Eurosilver. "He worked so good Sunday. We took his blood and his white cell count was high. His hemoglobin was fine, but Dr. [Mark] Cheney was concerned." Birdstone finished fifth most recently in the GII Lane's End S. at Turfway Mar. 20.

A True Pioneer...

Heir to the Vernon football pools fortune, Sangster joined forces with John Magnier and trainer Vincent O'Brien in the 1970s and helped create the Coolmore powerhouse. The trio would purchase yearlings in the U.S.--many by Northern Dancer--and race them in Europe before selling them for stud duty. "Robert was a true visionary whose large-scale investment in the best American-bred yearlings in the 70s was one of the principal factors in establishing Ireland and Coolmore as major forces in the bloodstock world," said O'Brien. "His knowledge of bloodstock was extensive and professional and it was helpful to get his opinion on all aspects of horse management, training and breeding." Some of the early results achieved with this formula included The Minstrel and Alleged, as well as the \$30million syndication of Storm Bird. In the 1980s, Sangster's focus shifted to horses bred by his Swettenham Stud and various partnerships. Among those representatives were champions El Gran Senor and Sadler's Wells, who went on to become one of the world's leading sires. He was also part of the syndicate which purchased world-record yearling Seattle Dancer for \$13.1 million in 1985. After selling Vernons for a reported £90 million in 1988, Sangster had a quieter presence in the racing scene in the 1990s. He privately sold several Swettenham-breds which developed into Classic winners: Balanchine (G1 Irish Derby), Cape Verdi (Ire) (G1 1000 Guineas) and Dr Devious (Ire) (G1 Epsom Derby).

Worldwide Success...

Though based in Britain, Sangster was a major player on the international stage. He owned the filly Royal Heroine (Ire), who captured the inaugural running of the GI Breeders' Cup Mile in 1984. Sangster acquired Collingrove Stud in Australia's Hunter Valley, and set about expanding his empire in the Southern Hemisphere with shuttle stallions. He won the 1980 Melbourne Cup with Beldale Ball and trainer Colin Hayes and, together with that conditioiner, went on to establish a second Collingrove Stud in Victoria. Sangster's Australian operation, largely commercial in focus, has an exceptional consignment in next week's Inglis Easter Yearling Sale. But Sangster was never spoiled by success. "Trusting and uncomplaining, with an excellent sense of humour, he was a joy with whom to share good times; he was enthusiastic and always grateful even for small victories," said O'Brien. "Magnanimous in defeat, he was a superb loser and did not waste time dwelling on what might have been."

MAJOR WINNERS RACED BY ROBERT SANGSTER
